Ask this fan of the nationa that the most amazing accomplish ment is the number of strikeout by Nolan Ryan during his illustrious career (which is still going on). Ryan's strikeout record of seven no-hitters also is not likely to ever be approached.
But when it comes to batting records, there are a couple of other records that fans talk about, and it both of these were accomplished in the same year--the summer of
One of these records was by Joe
DiMaggio, who got hits in 56 consecutive games. The other was by another of the baseball batted 406 Ted Williams, who in the major leagues lost player . 400 in a season, which means he every ten trips to the plate.
One of the neat stories about team, the Boston Red Sox, was playing a double-header on the final day of the season. Williams came to that day batting . 402, and out the games, as the stars sometimes, do, to preserve their batting mark.
