

# **Campbells Turn Landmark Into Beautiful Homeplace**

What would be expected to result from the combined efforts of two talented and energetic people beginning the transformation of an old home into a picture pretty and comfortable home? When the people are named Lee and Elwanda Campbell and the house is a fifty year old Friona landmark, the results will prove to be unbelievable.

Early in 1929, the late Mr. and Mrs. J.L. Landrum, parents of Ray Landrum, who lives about three miles southwest of town, built a new family home at the corner of Seventh Street and Euclid Avenue. At the time it was one of the small town's most elaborate homes. One of its most elegant features was a set of French doors between the living room and dining room. unbleached muslin, she began. She made three fifteen yard panels for three windows and trimmed them with lace. Within a few weeks, she had another request for drapes, which were also made of unbleached muslin.

She said, "You just can't buy the quality of unbleached muslin that was available twenty-five years ago. Recently I replaced the second set I made and the original material was still not worn out."

Since her humble beginning, she has developed a very successful drapery factory in her home and has one room especially equipped to accommodate whatever material she needs. She designs the cornice boards, which Lee constructs and creates her own designs. Lee also hangs the drapes. Many of her customers have built several different houses in other towns and always come back for her to drape the windows. Most of her customers live in Texas, New Mexico and Colorado, but some of them live as far away as Chicago and Florida.

The Campbells also enjoy collecting and refinishing antiques and have several priceless specimens in their home. Lee's barbed wire collection now contains nearly 100 different kinds of wire.

During the holiday season, Christmas decorations are artistically arranged throughout the house and guests are served spiced tea, coffee, candy, cookies and other goodies. For Christmas dinner this year the Campbells plan to have their daughter, Cindy, and her husband, Jerry Simmons, who live at 401 Cedar; their son, Randy, who lives here, and all four of the grandchildren.

Elwanda says, "A must at our house during the holiday season is Chinese Fruit Cake, a recipe of one of our neighbors, Mabelle Hartwell." She shared the recipe with us.

Chinese Fruit Cake 1 pound candied cherries 1 pound candied pineapple 1 pound dates 2 cups flour 2 tsp. baking powder 1 cup sugar 4 eggs, well beaten 2 pounds pecans Cut up fruit. Mix with flour and baking powder. Beat eggs and sugar together and pour over fruit mixture. Add nuts and mix thoroughly with hands.

Then, they literally "rolled up their sleeves" and went to work on redoing and modernizing their newly acquired home. The wall between the original living room and front bedroom was removed, a fireplace was built in the south end of the elongated room, which had a half or quarter wall in the center.

The principle ingredient in the entire project has been hard work, which has been combined with paper, paint, ceiling tile and floor coverings to make a very attractive home.

The original house featured a front porch all across the west. This has been enclosed in glass and is now the family's sun room. The basement, which has two rooms, has been completely finished and now has a large store room and a bedroom. 

# Neelleys Enjoy Japanese Student This Christmas

During the holiday season visitors at the home of Robert, Connie, Ben, Leigh and Dan Neelley and Masayo Okamoto, are being greeted by snow men in the front yard, luminaries outlining the lawn and a lot of snow and ice. Opening the front door is like opening a huge package as it is tied with a giant red ribbon bow with streamers.

Inside the Neelley home garlands of greenery entwine the stairway in the entrance hall, a brightly decorated tree stands in one corner of the living room and Christmas stockings with the names of the younger members of the family hang on the mantel. Masayo's stocking, which is her first, is a gift from Rhea Foster and is done in needlepoint.

Masayo is from Osaka, which is the largest of the four islands which are combined to form the country of Japan. The city with a population of 8,000,000 is the second largest city in the country, second only to Tokyo. She says "It's very different there.

I like it here very much."

"The schools are harder there," she continued. "We attend school six days every week and have a one month summer vacation. We also have a winter vacation, which lasts two or three weeks and a two week spring vacation every year."

She attends a private Christmas school for girls and everyone wears a

Her hobbies include playing the piano, sewing, playing tennis, swimming, attending football games and cooking. She often prepares Japanese food for the Neelley family and friends.

She reports that food preparation in her native country is much more detailed than American cooking and many different root vegetables and herbs are used with fish and rice, which are staples.

The Neelley family members have learned a lot about Japan since Masayo joined their family unit last fall while she has been learning about America.







The high temperature that day had been a frigid nine degrees.

At Amarillo, an all-time December record was set when the mercury fell to seven degrees below zero Thursday morning. The "high" temperature the day before, seven degrees, eclipsed the former December record of 23 by 16 degrees. the former records had been on the books since 1924 and 1916.

with Sunday morning, the area has not seen temperatures above the freezing mark.

Some power problems have been reported in the rural areas, but considering the continuous frigid blast, problems were probably a minimum.

For the past four and one-half years little girls, as well as some larger ones, have been made happy by becoming the owner of an Aline Turner Original doll.

Early in the spring of 1979 this doting grandmother, who had been making clothes and other things for little girls many years, was looking around for something different to make for her two nine year old granddaughters, Kristi Blake of Stratford, and Mindy Hardcastle of Wheeler, whose ninth birthdays were coming up.

Since that time she has averaged

making 25-30 dolls per year. The first ones she made were thirty-six inches tall and as she worked on them she began to work on an idea for making smaller ones and became interested in the almost forgotten art of making soft sculptured dolls.

With several different patterns and a number of original ideas she began what was to grow into a very successful part-time business and hobby.

The first Aline Turner originals were labeled "Dolls by Aline." Later the maker came up with the idea of combining her first name with her middle initial and her dolls are now distributed with a tag reading "Evaa's Dolls." When correctly pronounced, this sounds like the first syllable of the name Evelyn plus an a on the end and sounds like a French word.

Each doll is dressed in an original costume, has a hand painted face (Aline uses acryllic non-toxic paints for the faces) and yarn or craft fur hair.

The creator of Evaa's dolls says, "Nothing gives me more pleasure than watching small girls as they hug dolls which have been bought for or School. He was associated with his parents in the operation of a Western Auto Store here eighteen years and was one of Friona's first television repairmen.

When the couple was first married, Bill was employed by Western Union and they did a lot of travelling.







Harlan and Hertha Shur Frye, who live in the Easter Community of Castro County and are George's





The Steinhausel family is Catholic and Louie explained that church decorations always included candles hanging from the ceiling.


Some of the Christmas decorations in the Frye home this time, including one nativity scene, have been sent







# **Tress Tannahill Makes Extended European Tour**

Tress Tannahill, 1608 West Tenth, and her brother, Bill Allen, have done a lot of travelling together during recent years. Early this fall they spent about four weeks on the European continent.

Out of Oberammergau we visited one of Ludwig's castles that was very baroque in architecture. It was still furnished and the decor was very elaborate with its frescos, mirrors and gold. The grounds, gardens and grotto were so beautiful. From there, we want to the Pilgrimage Church of Wies, which was out in the middle of a pasture. This baroque church was

just beautiful with all the frescos, white beams and columns all trimmed with gold.


We went on to Innsbruck, and here we saw frescos on many buildings and homes, and also saw the house with the gold roof. Throughout the Alpine country all the houses have flower boxes on balconies and windows with beautiful flowers in full bloom.

Salsburgh was our next stop with a visit to Hellbrumbhouse, where we saw the 'water works' show--very interesting and unusual. Then we went by the Von Trapp house which was the site of the filming of the movie ''Sound of Music''--a beautiful place.

Our tour of Vienna was very interesting, especially the tour of castle of Heidelberg, this castle was built before the birth of Christ. Then on to Mainz for the last night with our tour group.

We were surprised shortly after our arrival, to have a phone call from Chris, who was in the lobby. Of course I got very excited, as it had been 26 months since I had seen him. He is a Major in the U.S. Army. His family has been with him for one year, and I was so happy to see them.

We left Mainz with Chris and his family and headed down the lower Rhine River for Holland, stopping for a short time in Cologne, where we visited their famous Cathedral. From Cologne we went to Amsterdam and then on to Zaanse Schans where we saw some famous windmills, one that

It was patterned after Versailles, built in 1692, and was completely furnished. It was full of Rosewood panels, Rococo framed Oriental art and gold, gold, gold. We did have an afternoon for shopping and took advantage of this opportunity.

Just before sunset we took a ride on the "Riesennad" or giant ferris wheel built in 1896/97 by the engineer who built the Eiffle Tower. The sight of Vienna at sunset was really breath-taking. It was such a treat to see the city as the lights came on.

During the next four days we were up and down through the Alps into northern Italy, through an area with lots of vineyards and apple orchards. We finally ended up in St. Moritz, which is the winter play ground for the jet set.

From Lucerne we made our way back into Germany with a stop to view the Rhine Falls and then on to Titisee, the center of the cuckoo clock industry. We drove through the Black Forest and had a short stop at the was a flour mill. Then we went along the North Sea to The Haag, where we visited the miniature city, Madurodam. Everything in the city is 1/25 actual size. Even the shrubs, the buildings and surroundings were in great detail--just incredible.

We drove through Belgium and stopped in Luxembourg for some sightseeing, then on to Landstuhl, Germany where Chris and his family live. The next morning Chris, Jimmy, Christie and I drove into France a little way, so I could say I had been in France.

On Monday morning, September 26, Chris and his family drove us to Frankfort to catch our flight on to London. The only place we went in London was to the Tower to see the Crown Jewels. I wasn't greatly impressed with them.

Then we climbed on a bus again for a quick look at England. We drove to York for an interesting city tour, then on to Durham for an overnight stop. The next day we made our way to Edinburgh, Scotland, where we could not see much because of the fog and drizzle. We did enjoy dinner and a stage show in the evening. We hit the road again and went through the lake district to Chester then on for a quick trip into Wales. 
# DPS Gives Safety Tips For Holiday

It is the season to be joyfull, but many Texans will find the holiday season to be less than jolly, according to Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Three things are almost certain to be a part of the season: homes and apartments will be filled with gifts; families taking trips to be with loved ones; and the crime rate goes up.

Major Cawthon offered the following suggestions as precautions you can and should take to avoid turning the joyous time into an unpleasant memory.

Make sure you keep all doors and windows locked, even though you may be at home. Do not make your affluence known. If your Christmas tree is placed in front of a window, be sure the gifts are not easily visible from the outside. If your holiday plans include a trip, have home deliveries stopped and ask a friend or neighbor to look after your home. Allow plenty of time to get to your destination and take a break every two hours to avoid fatigue. Above all, do not mix alcohol and driving. Do not leave packages on the seats or in plain view. Put gifts and luggage in the trunk, safely out of sight. Robbery also increases during the holiday season and there are some things you can do to avoid becoming a victim. Do not show large amounts of cash when making purchases, park in well lighted areas, and if you shop at night take a friend. Major Cawthon said, "Taking simple precautions can make the difference between a happy holiday and an unpleasant memory."





Riding with Parr atop the colorful entry will be Carol Lawrence, wellknown actress, who is the "Parade Celebrity" for 1984.


The local parade enthusiast will have a second entry in the parade, and his entries will virtually serve as "bookends" for the Cotton Bowl parade entry.



TO: LOW-INCOME PERSONS AND HISPANICS IN CASTRO, PARMER, AND DEAF SMITH COUNTIES

This lawsuit might affect your rights to obtain free or reduced cost hospital care at the Plains Memorial Hospital in Dimmitt, Texas.

The United States District Court in Amarillo has decided that the plaintiffs in this case fairly and adequately represent a group of low-income and Mexican-American persons. Those persons share common concerns regarding the admission and free care policies of Plains Memorial Hospital in Dimmitt, Texas.

The plaintiffs and the defendants have reached a settlement of this case. Before the Court will approve the settlement,

The proposed settlement provides that the hospital will do the following:

**TRUCKING COMPANY** 

1. It sets up a Medical Assistance Program to give free or reduced cost hospital care to low-income residents of Castro County. The Plan sets out the income guidelines to be used to decide if a person will get free care, or reduced cost care, and sets the procedures for applying for free or reduced cost care. Under this Plan, if your income is low enough, you might not have to pay for your hospital bill, but you will have to pay for your doctor bill. A person must have an income even lower than the Poverty Guidelines to get free hospital care.

2. It requires the hospital to give at least a certain amount of free care every year for the next five (5) years. This averages to about \$50,000 a year for each of the next five(5) years.

It requires the hospital to give immediate care to any person in an emergency, regardless of their ability to pay.
 It requires the hospital to have staff members who speak both Spanish and English available at all times to assist persons who do not speak English fluently.

5. It requires the hospital to try to hire more Hispanic nursing and administrative personnel.

6. It requires the plaintiffs to withdraw all their complaints against the hospital that have been filed with the federal government.

The settlement does not provide for the payment of any money to individuals who might have been wrongfully denied free or reduced cost care in the past. The settlement also does not provide for the payment of any money to low-income or Mexican-American persons who might have paid deposits or hospital bills to Plains Memorial Hospital when the person should have been given free or lower cost care. These persons, if any, will be required to file their own cases, if they wish to claim any money. The Hospital has not admitted any liability or agreed to pay any money to individuals. A complete copy of the proposed settlement may be seen at the offices of Texas Rural Legal Aid in Hereford, Texas, 1406

West Highway 60, or at the U.S. District Court Clerk's office in Amarillo, Texas, 205 East 5th Street.

If you think the settlement is unfair, you may object to the settlement by giving written notice of the reason for your objection to the Clerk, United States District Court, P.O. Box F-13240, Amarillo, Texas 79189, and to the attorney for plaintiffs, Texas Rural Legal Aid, 1406 West Highway 60, Hereford, Texas 79045.

You must file your objection on or before January 6th, 1984.

A hearing on the settlement will be held in U.S. District Court in Amarillo, 205 East 5th Street, on January 13th, 1984 at 2 p.m. Only persons who have filed written objection with the Court will be allowed to participate.



In large bowl beat oleo, sugar and egg yolks until light and fluffy. Add molasses, beat until well blended. With wooden spoon add 4 cups flour and remaining ingredients, mix well. Add remaining flour, mixing well, using hands. Seperate into 4 sections, place on aluminum foil, flatten into squares. Wrap up and place in refrigerator for several hours. Make pattern for Manger Scene. Stable, animals, people and manger. Pull out 1 square of dough. Place on floured surface and roll out till 1/8 inch thick. Cut out dough for each part of scene. Place on very heavily greased cookie sheet. Bake in 350° oven for 15 to 20 minutes. Cool on racks. Snow Frosting 6 egg whites (at room temperature) 2 lbs. confectioner's sugar 1 tsp. cream of tarter

Mix all in large bowl at medium speed until very stiff, about 7 to 10 minutes. Cover to keep from drying out.

Use frosting to secure seams of house or stable. Then frost top and sides and add candy, marshmallows, coconut, etc. to decorate. Secure manger scene with frosting.




