Trent Johnson of 723 Country Club Drive, Hereford, was involved in an accident at an oil well drilling

site some 20 miles North of Vega on site some 20 miles North of Vega on
August 14 . He suffered second and August 14. He suffered second and third degree burns over 31 per cent of
his body from the waist up in a flash his body from the waist up in a flash
fire which was caused from an accumulation of gas.
Johnson was employed by the
Baker and Taylor Drilling Company on a summer job. A spark from the nearby motor caused the gas to ignite.
A co-worker said the young man A co-worker said the young man
immediately covered his face and rolled on the ground to put out the fire.
The drilling site was 22 miles from the highway, where the workers were met by an ambulance which took him
to Amarillo. From there he was flown of Amarillo. From there he was flown
by Lear Jet to the Burn Center at Parkland Memorial Hospital in
Dallas, where he is currently Dallas, where he is currently
