Star Lites

TO SAY THAT THE weather has been dry in this area would be a tremendous understatement.

It has been ages since Parmer County received a good, general rainfall. One area farmer told me this week that since June 1, 1983, he had measured only four inches of rainfall on his farm.

Since our area will be returning to a more normal farming year in 1984 due to the expiration of the "PIK" program, it is becoming more and more vital that the farmers receive a good rainfall.

Due to the high cost of irrigation, even the farmers who have good water on their places need the help from Mother Nature, or they will have to start out their crop year with more invested in their crop than they would like to have.

This year, the drought is not necessarily limited to our particular area. Indications are that the dry conditions are prevalent practically throughout the state of Texas.

Even on the coast, there are places which are drastically behind their normal rain receipts. For instance, we heard this week that Brownsville, in South Texas, had gone 55 days without rainfall, which was a record for the time period involved.

There is a large area out in Southwest Texas which has been hit by the drought for the past several years. Farmers and ranchers in that area have seen their pastures dry up, and in many cases have trimmed their cattle business to zero. They are still waiting for a good rain.

This past week, a number of counties were designated by state officials as being eligible for drought assistance. Parmer County was included in that list.

However, Secretary of Agriculture John Block, who was speaking in Dallas this week, said that the problem is almost beyond help from the government. Block advised farmers to "pray for rain." We would assume that many farmers and their families had been taking this course of action already.

But what the secretary of agriculture meant by his statement was that nothing can cure the situation better than a good rain. "What the farmer needs is income, not loans," said one farm specialist.

Although forecasters were predicting possible showers for the area this week, the main problem has been that the jet stream has moved too far to our north to bring the type of better prospects that we so vitally need.

But hopefully those conditions will change. An Amarillo weatherman noted this week that the month of May is traditionally the wettest month of the year in the Panhandle area, but as of the month's midpoint, nothing of value had been measured in the way of moisture.

Teen-Ager Hospitalized In Amarillo

Jamie Herring, 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glen Herring, has been in the Critical Care Unit of Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo since Sunday, when she was injured in a motorcycle accident.

A spokesman for the family said that Jamie's condition was "improved" on Friday, from earlier in the week. She has been awake and alert, and recognizes family members.

She is in Room 205 of the hospital. The Friona youngster was riding her bike in the Reeve Lake area last Sunday, when she lost control. Jamie was thrown into the side of the Sonic Drive-In building. She was taken to the Amarillo Emergency Center after being treated at Parmer County Community Hospital.

Pool Sets Splash Day

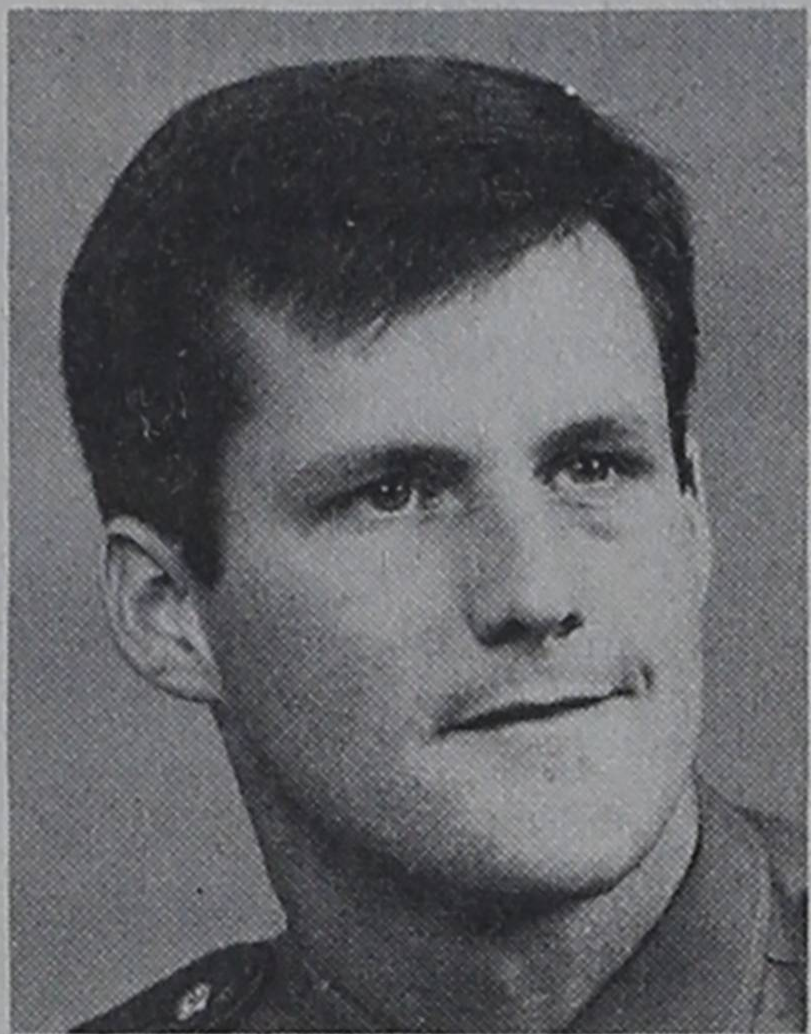
The Friona Municipal Swimming Pool will open on Saturday, May 26. That Saturday will be "Splash Day," with free admission to all swimmers that day.

Trooper Added To DPS Here

Trooper Richard Alan Diegelman, 23, has recently graduated from the Department of Public Safety Training Academy and has been assigned to the Highway Patrol Service in Friona.

Trooper Diegelman was one of 62 cadets recently commissioned as state trooper in graduation ceremonies in Austin. Trooper Diegelman is a native of San Antonio and assumes his new duties immediately.

Colonel Jim Adams, DPS director, said he is especially pleased at the quality of people who are entering the law enforcement profession.

"These men and women were carefully selected from a large group of applicants to undergo an intensive 18-week course," Adams said. "They have been trained to uphold the laws of this state in routine as well as difficult law enforcement situations."

"Today's Texas trooper is required to handle many varied tasks in addition to traffic enforcement. The trooper may assist in narcotics arrests, recovery of stolen vehicles and investigation of theft cases. A broad range of law enforcement responsibilities will face the trooper who has chosen to serve his fellow Texans," Adams said.

The DPS training course included instruction in traffic law, criminal law, arrest procedures, accident investigation, and numerous other law enforcement related topics.

Farwell Hospital District Sets Area-Wide Meeting

Farwell Hospital District has scheduled an area-wide meeting to determine if there is enough interest in condominium living for elderly persons in the community.

The meeting is set for Tuesday, May 22, at 7 p.m. CDT in the Farwell Community Center.

Reese Graves, development consultant from the Good Samaritan Society, and the Farwell Hospital District will present information about condominium living for the elderly with "beautiful surroundings and personal services provided, to enhance independence and lifestyle."

Farwell Hospital District is a community supported, non-profit municipality. It offers health services which include a nursing care facility, and physician and dental clinic.

The Good Samaritan Society, Inc. currently operates 191 such facilities, with 7,400 apartments and 14,881 nursing beds.

The duplexes or apartments in a condominium setting are approximately 500-700 square feet, one bedroom, with a self-sufficient kitchen. The units are not connected to the nursing facility, but offer independence and security, with personal and supportive services. Meals would be available in the central dining room if desired.

Good Samaritan Society, Inc., a South Dakota non-profit corporation, was organized in January 1979 in Arthur, N.D., a town of only 300 population. Of the current 191 facilities throughout the United States, six new ones, including Farwell Convalescent Center, were added in 1983. The other units are in Amarillo, El Paso, Kansas, Arizona, and Arkansas.

Over 30 years ago, the Society pioneered the campus or village concept. The significant feature is that various types of care--from self care with supportive services in apartments to skilled nursing home care--are offered at one location.

Providing a wider range of services on one campus facilitates the rehabilitative process, enables couples to stay together longer, and for the resident, eases the transition as needed from one level of care to

another.

Residents have commented that the greatest benefit is the feeling of security which comes from knowing that no matter what happens to them, it is likely they can continue to receive care within the village which has become their home.

Studies have shown that with supportive services such as help with bathing, intravenous injections by nurses, and the availability of the central dining room, apartment residents can live independently for several more years than is otherwise the case.

ASCS To Aid Livestock Producers

The Texas State ASCS Office is asking all 234 county offices to seek out farmers that have hay available for sale.

A list of available hay in Texas will be compiled and distributed to all county ASCS offices on May 21.

The continuing drought is causing critical hardships upon the state's livestock producers. Having exhausted their local source of supply, many producers have called the county ASCS offices to help locate producers who have an excess of hay or other roughage to sell.

From information supplied by the county offices, the State ASCS Office will compile a master listing of hay and roughage suppliers that will describe the feed, amounts available, and price. Master listings will be printed and distributed to the county offices monthly, and supplemental listings will be furnished weekly.

Any producer who has an excess of hay or roughage they wish to sell may contact the Parmer County ASCS Office, at telephone number 247-2220 and relate the particulars to be included on the listing. This service begins May 21 and will continue through October.

Poppy Day Set Locally May 25

Mrs. Drake says that the Poppy Day is a time of remembering our War Veterans of all of the great wars and each one of them was in the hopes that it was "the war to end all wars" but our world continues to be in turmoil.

The red crepe Poppy is made by the veterans in the Veterans Administration Hospitals across the nation. Some of them make the little red flower to learn to use their hands, minds or whatever therapy is necessary. Others make the poppies for a small income to have that feeling of independence.

From the donations that are made for the Poppy Day the local unit sends one-third of the proceeds to the state headquarters to buy more supplies for the poppies to be made for the next year. The local unit helps veterans or needy families in the local

"We have paid doctor bills for some; bought food for others; clothing for some; meals and fuel while at the hospitals; and contribute to any worthwhile project concerning our veterans," Mrs. Drake said.

The Local Post and Unit decorate the graves of all deceased veterans in the local cemeteries by placing a marker and a flag at each grave. We try not to miss anyone but if we do, we would appreciate those we miss letting us know about it, says Mrs. Drake. "It is through the donations from Poppy Day that we decorate the cemeteries. The ladies of the American Legion Auxiliary will be on the street and in the stores asking for your donation and pinning the red crepe poppy on everyone they meet. We do not like to miss anyone whether you give a donation or not," says Mrs. Drake.

The Poppy program was started after World War I when our "boys came back" and they were concerned about "their buddies" who did not come back and the families of those fallen buddies. The red poppies grow wild in France and this is where the poem "In Flanders Field" comes from--poppies grow row in row and between the white cross that marks the graves of the fallen soldiers. And to keep the poppies from being a commercial project, the red crepe paper poppy was designed and the rehabilitation program started in the Veteran Hospitals.

Mrs. Drake urges each and every one to donate to this program and remember to honor our Veterans even down to the crises of the recent months. If we miss you and you would care to make a donation, mail it to Marlene Drake, Friona, and we will use it to the best advantage, she says.

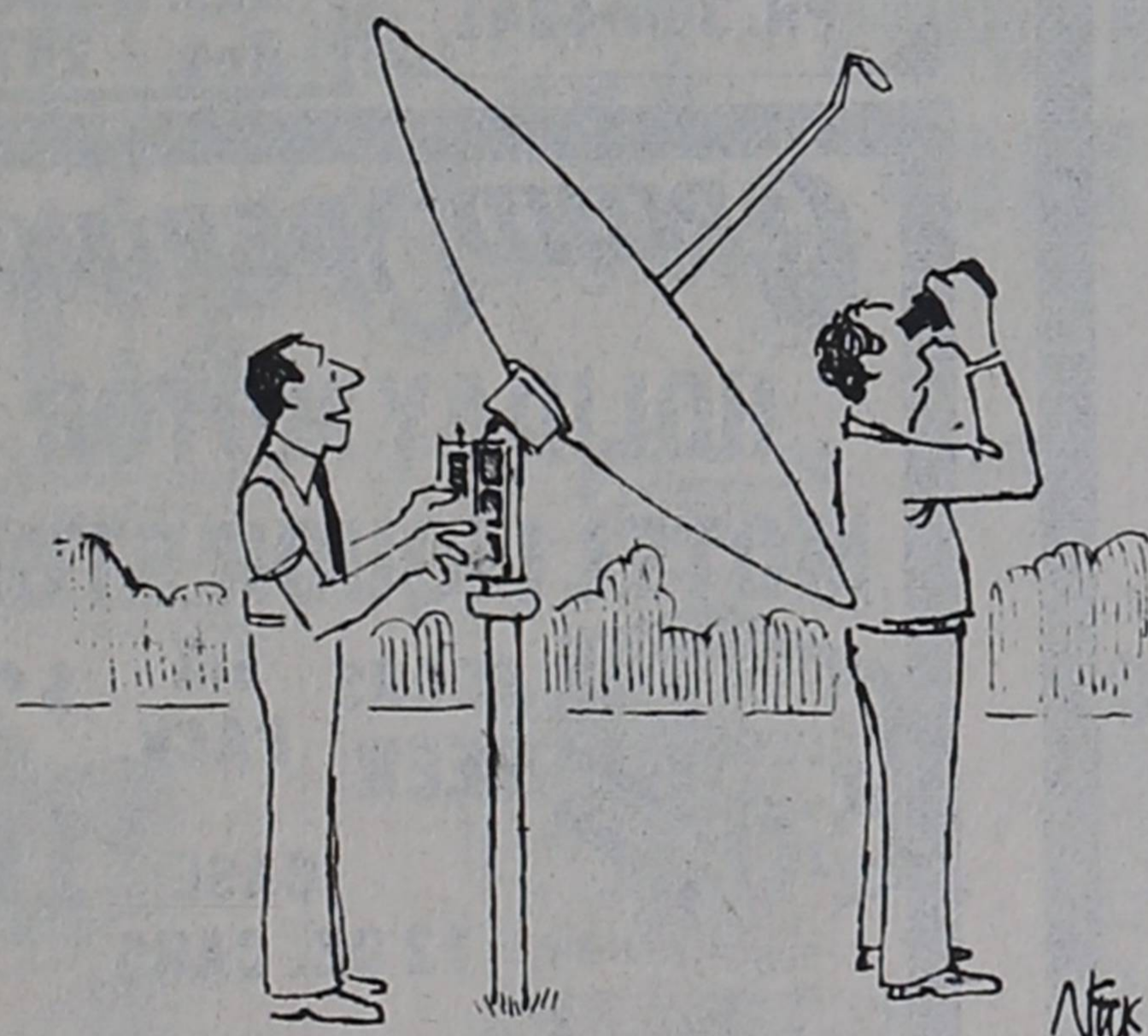

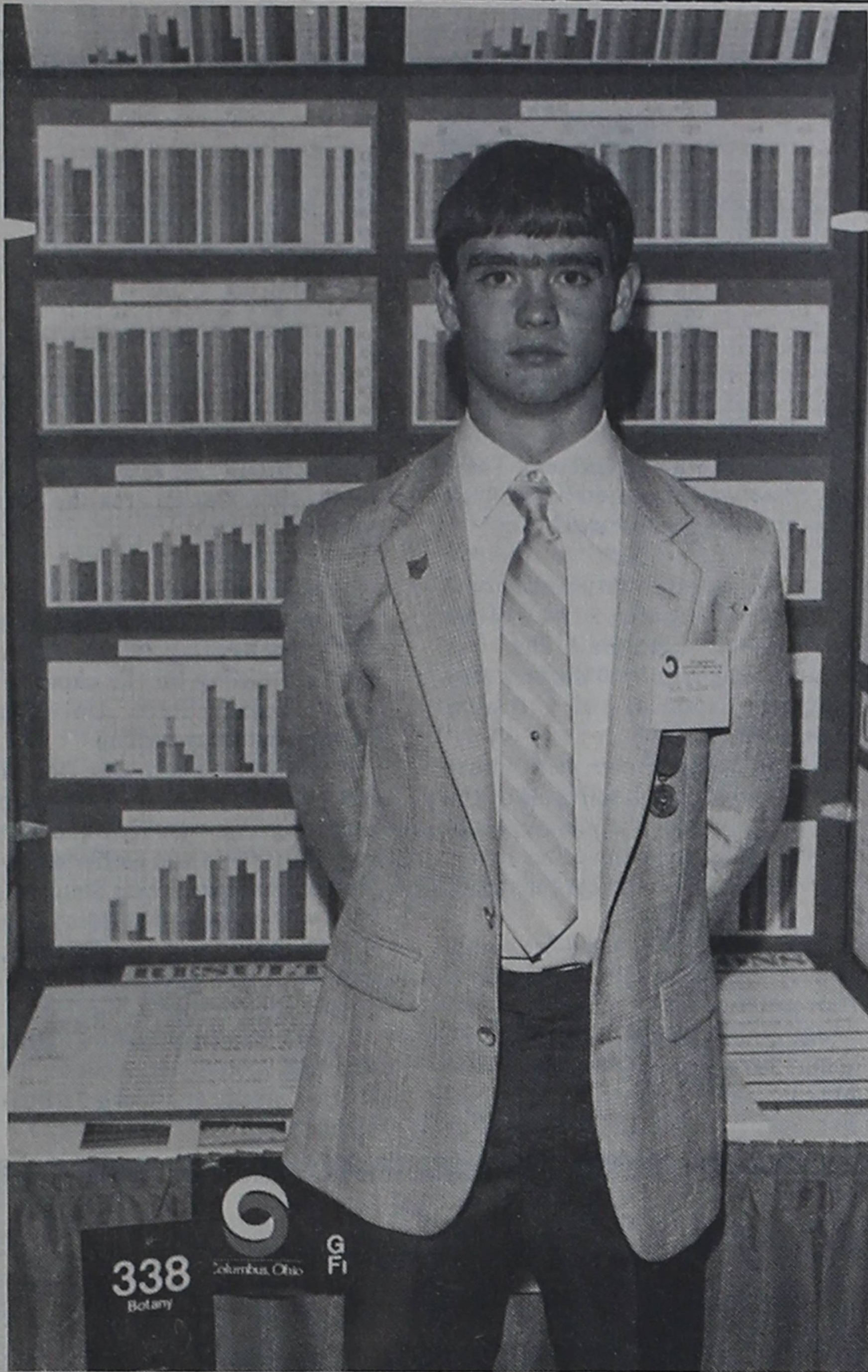

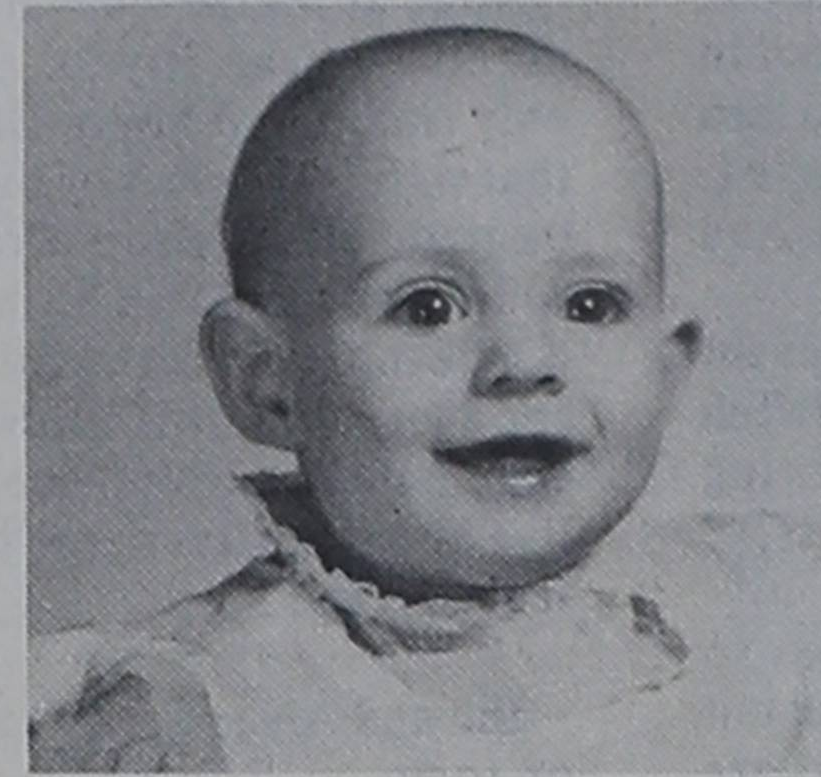

NO ONE ESCAPES PRESBYOPIA

QUESTION: I don't wear glasses now but sometimes I have to strain to read the fine print in a book or newspaper. A friend of mine who wears glasses told me I probably have presbyopia. How serious is that condition and what is it exactly?

ANSWER: Presbyopia comes to all of us if we live long enough. It's part of the process of aging. It happens when we lose the use of our near-focusing muscles. They begin to lose their strength when we approach middle age. That's one reason why many people need glasses for reading at that time of life. 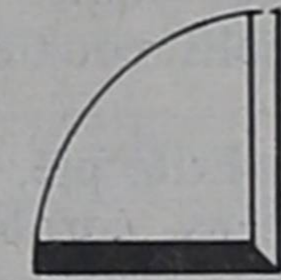

THE FASCINATING HISTORY OF EYECARE-PART VI

A shortage of elephants in 1863 resulted in the invention of plastics, later used in eyeglass frames and eventually in lenses, by John and Isaiah Hyatt. The Hyatts were the winners of a \$10,000.00 award offered by the Philadelphia billiard ball manufacturer seeking a material to substitute for Ivory.

Advances in bifocals paralleled a growing need for them that came about as people lived longer and turned from farming to industrial and business occupations. People were better educated, read more, and did much more close work than previously. Two major optical firms were launched in the United States in the early 1900's and they managed to bring down the cost of eyeglasses in this country so that everyone could afford them. Theodore Roosevelt took 12 pairs with him to the Spanish-American war.

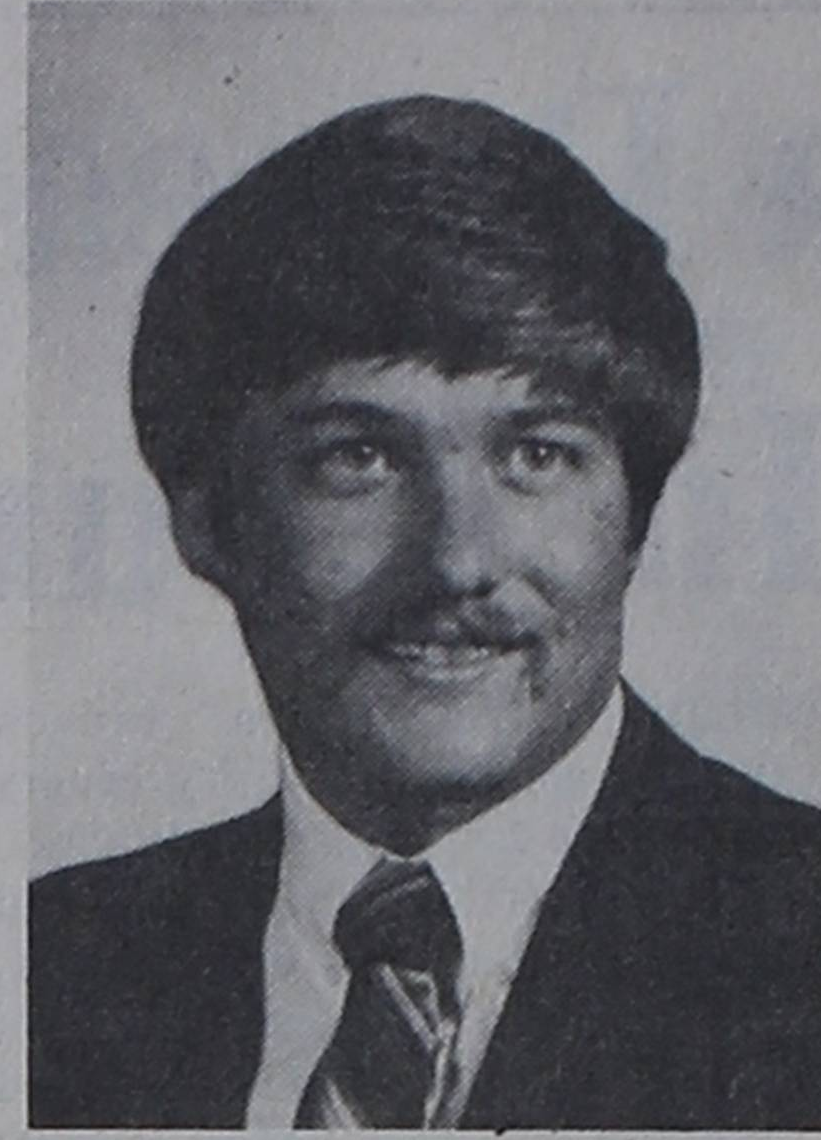

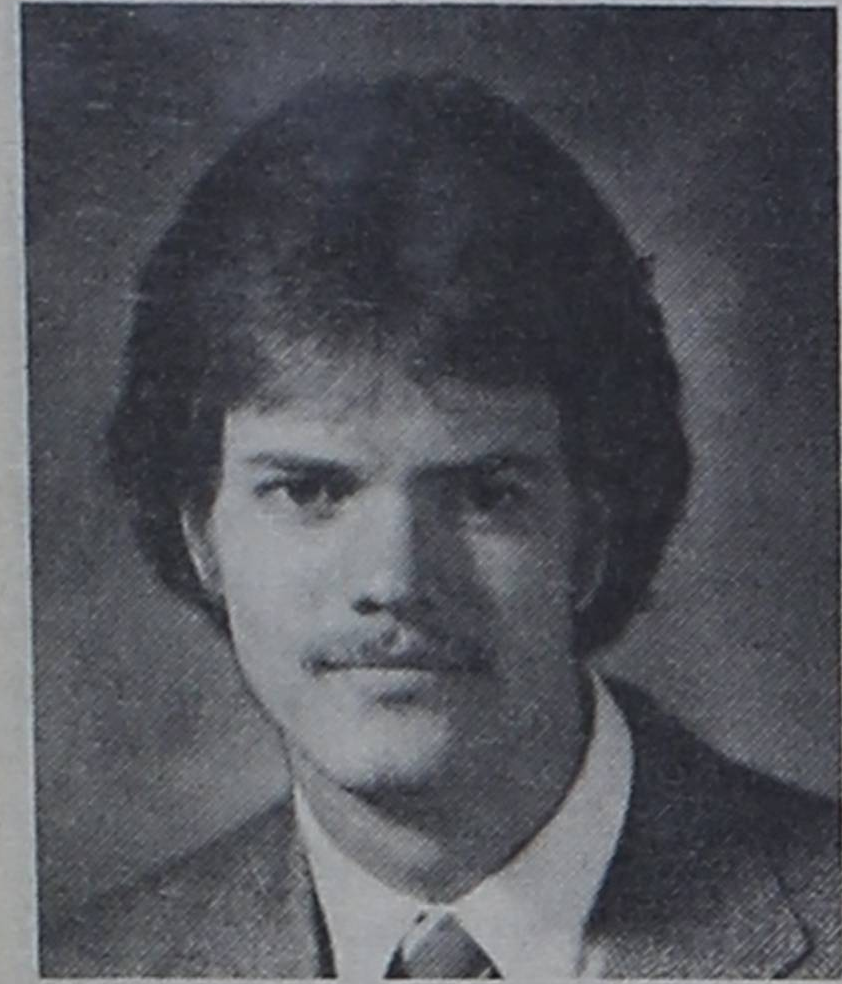

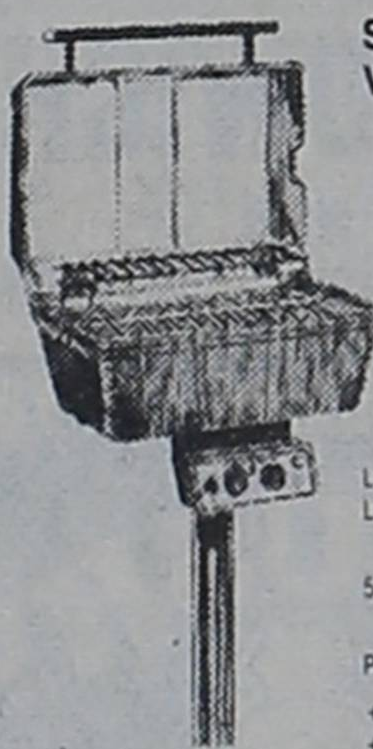

Mamie Lou Welch was the first president and later Margie Herring, Avis White, Betty Jarboe, Lunell Horton, Ruthie Fite, Juanda Jarrell, Geneva Riethmayer, Margaret Duggins, Ann Osborn, Anne Spring, Mary Bavousett, Nancy Edelman, Betty Mabry, Maxine Loafman, Lois Norwood, Gaye Tannahill and Sue Beene filled subsequent two-year terms.

Along with studying current subjects, members enjoyed fun, fellowship, parties and working in various fund-raising projects to benefit not only their hometown but also Texas and National Federation needs.

The school system has always been high on the list of projects as members battled authorities for crossing guards, closed streets where their children could play secure from traffic and to have streets and pathways paved so children who walked to school would not arrive covered with mud. Countless items have been donated for school use such as band instruments, books, overhead projectors, to name a few. Essay contests were sponsored and prizes given. An Art Tea was held each year to show off work of young artists.

The club's next regular meeting will be in August.

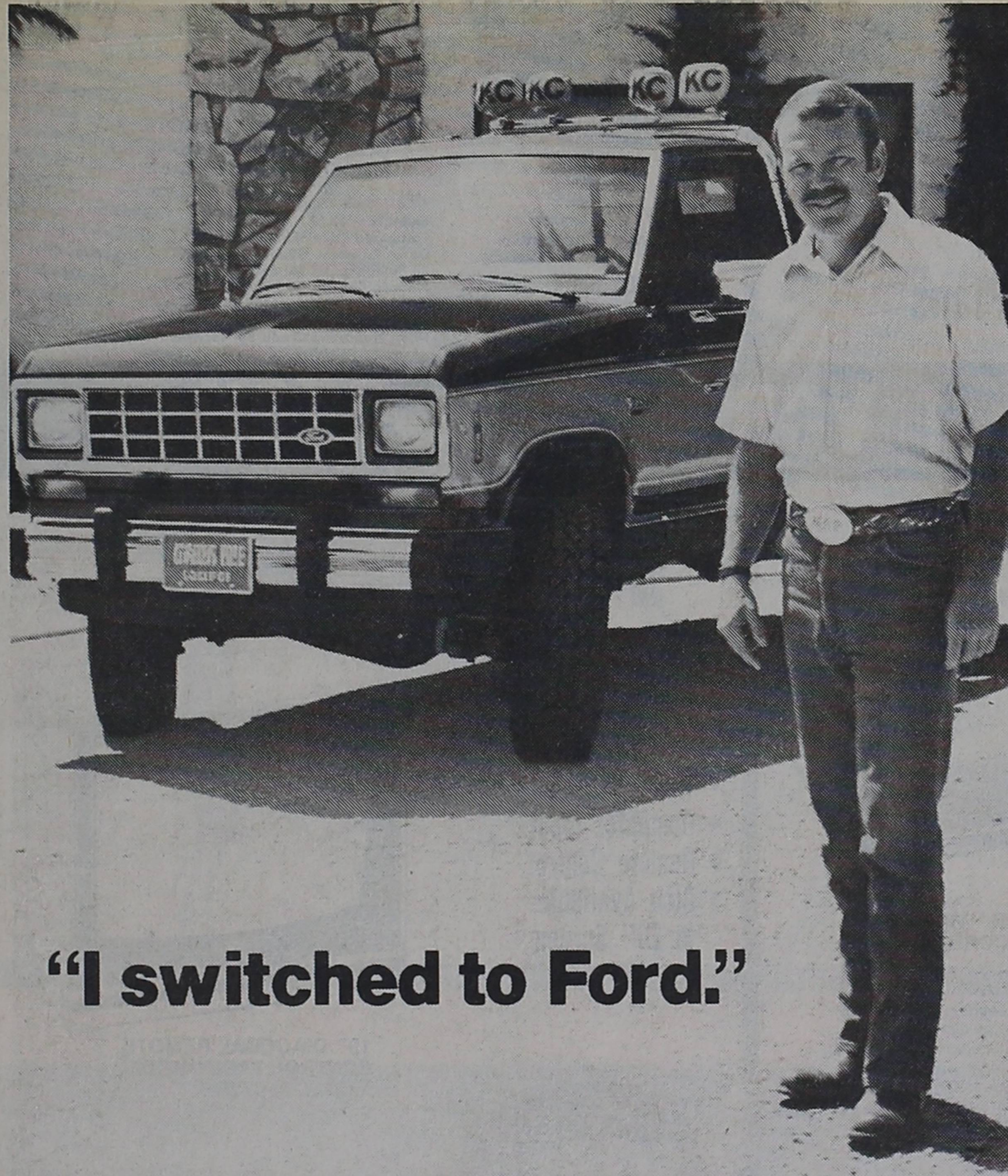
