There were 2,977 households, with 8,082 persons, including 633 one-person households. In addition 123 persons were living in group quarters.

The 1970 census counted 3,-453 housing units in Callahan County, 2,415 of them occupied by owners, 562 occupied by tenants, and 476 vacant. These included vacant units for seasonal use. The proportion occupied by owners in 1970 was 69.9 percent, compared with 67.1 percent in 1960.

Among year-round dwelling

Among year-round dwelling units there were 3.298 single family houses, 85 housing units in multi-unit buildings, and 63 mobile homes or trailers. The percentage of occupied units with more than one person per room was 7.2, compared with 8.2 in 1960. Of all the occupied housing units, 2,814 had piped water, toilet, and bath, while 163 lacked some of all plumbing.

The median value of owner-occupied houses in Callahan County was \$7,000, compared with \$5,000 in 1960. The median rent paid by tenants in 1970 was less than \$30 per month. compared with \$46 in 1960. Half were over and half below the median figures.


