



THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE is something I have dealt with all of my life. I always considered myself a fair student of English, which was my college major, as well as journalism.

A contempory writer once noted that it was surprising how much of our vocabulary has drawn upon the names of animals, fowl and insects, to enrich the imagery of our conversations.

For instance, when we want to explain our complete exhaustion, we say we are "dog tired." If we choose to describe a well-used book, we say it is "dog-eared." Golfers usually hate a "dogleg" hole. Hot weather is described as "the dog days of summer," and a man past his prime may be described as an "old dog," who would be long past the state of "puppy love."

If we have a "black sheep" in the family, we often may add that this person has "gone to the dogs." But if he doesn't cause us too much trouble, we might tend to ignore him with the explanation of "let sleeping dogs lie."

We have "hawks" and "doves," both of which can be "mulish" in their attitudes. We can tolerate them as long as they don't make "asses" of themselves. The stock market has its "bulls" and "bears," and you'd better learn the difference.

Animals also have become verbs in the English language: some people "rat on a friend," or "hog the spotlight."

They can also be used as adjectives, as in "slippery as an eel," "proud as a peacock," "sly as a fox," "wise as an owl," "meek as a lamb," "stubborn as a mule," and strong as an ox." If we play our game "doggedly," we might avoid being "skunked." And experienced gamblers avoid "card sharks," unless they are carrying a "rabbit's foot."

A second-term president is often referred to as a "lame duck;" a lone sentry is a "sitting duck," and an unattractive child might be called an "ugly duckling.

A scoreless baseball team is said to have drawn a "goose egg," in which case, runs would be as "scarce as hens' teeth." If we "smell a rat," we have to be careful not to "let the cat out of the bag." If we are extremely hungry, we may become "pigs" as we "wolf" down our meal.


Evans' father, Milton, was manager of Parmer County Farm Bureau when the family lived here. His mother, Pat, also enjoys bowling.

Preventing Dry Eye Syndrome

Dry eye syndrome is eye discomfort and/or damage to the cornea and conjunctiva due to reduced quantity or quality of tears to moisten the eye. Approximately one in five Americans has dry eye syndrome. Advancing age is the

primary risk factor for dry eyes. Our tear glands produce significantly less tears as we get older. Approximately 75 per cent of people over age 65 suffer from dry eye syndrome. Women are more at risk due to hormonal changes. Other risk factors include exposure to smoke, wind, air pollution, air conditioning, and dry climates; contact lens wear, especially soft contact lenses; and computer use.

You can prevent getting dry eye syndrome by drinking plenty of liquids, taking a daily supplement of antioxidant vitamins, installing a humidifier, blinking frequently when using a computer or when reading for long periods and moistening your contact lenses as needed. 
