Gramm Deserves
Voters' Support
In order to maintain the state's conservative voice in the U.S. Senate, area voters are urged to cast their ballot for Phil Gramm in the senatorial race.
For the past 24 years, Texans have been represented in the Senate by John Tower, who retires after this year after a distinguished career in the upper house of congress.
