## County Politics Getting Early Start for 1978

The filing deadline for county offices is February 6, 1978, with the filing fee paid on that date, no later than 6:00 p.m. No one can file for any of the offices until after January 1, 1978, but some have announced their intentions of filing and competing for offices.

Thusfar, the County Clerk's office has had two women announce their intentions. The present office holder, Beatrice Deal, has announced retirement at the close of her term after serving 24 years as County Clerk. Allene Whitt, presently employed by the County Clerk's Office has announced intentions of running for the office and Velma Young also announced her intentions for running for the same office.

The County Treasurer's Office is held by Hazel Reynolds, who has announced retirement at the end of her term after serving 28 years as County Treasurer. Glenda Ivy, a Lone Star Gas Employee, has announced her intentions to file and run for the available office of County Treasurer.

The District Clerk's Office held by Cora Mae Payne will be open for candidates for the May 6th election and the present office holder has announced her intention of running for another term, Cora Mae has served as District Clerk for many years.

The office of County Judge will expire at the end of 1978. A.E. Dyer, Jr., is

presently the County Judge. The Office of County Democratic Chairman will expire this next year, too and is presently being held by Hugh Ross. County Commissioners precinct 2 and 4 will expire. These offices are held by Odom and Johnson.

Four Justice of the Peace terms will expire they are precinct 1,5,6 and 8. Bobby Curtis of Precinct 1, Lee Savall of Precinct 5, Pender Mitchell of Precinct 6 and Walter Francisco of Precinct 8 will all have to file and run for office this next year.

Constable's Office Precinct 5 will run this next year. Ottie McCann was appointed to the office for the latest term.

Criminal District Attorney, Lynn Ingalsbee's Office will expire.

Precinct Chairman's Office No. 1-8 will expire this term.

The offices not expiring are: Constable Precinct 1,6 and 8, the County Attorney's Office, the Tax-Assessor Collectors' Office, the Sheriff's Office and Commissioner's Precinct 1 and 3.

The County School Superintendent's Office will expire in 78 but the office will be done away with.

The Baird City mayor's Office will expire in 1978 as well as three city Councilmen, Bill Allen, Blackie Hart, and Lee Roy Brooker. The mayor's office is held by Charles Walker.

## Construction Underway on Baird Apartment Complex

The ground has been broken on the housing developments, Walnut Hill, in Baird.

Mr. Bob Rogers, president of the development company stated that the development should be ready for occupancy in early spring.

The development will consist of 24 rental units; eight one bedroom and sixteen two bedroom accommodations all rental units will be total electric and have individually controlled heating and cooling units, all units will be equipped with electric range, vent-hood, refrigerator, drapes and carpet. The units were redesigned to incorporate the latest energy saving material and equipment. This

energy awareness program will include 6 inch wall insulation with calked sil plates and polyethylene vapor barriers on walls, also, aluminum double glazed windows will be installed and exterior doors will have urethane insulation plus magnetic weather stripping.

The ceilings will have 10 inches of loose filled insulation and the attic will have thermostatically powered ventilators. All the units will have private entrances with covered porches and surface walks.

It is expected that applications will be available in Baird after January 1978.

If the units go over well, the development is expected to grow.

## Baird and Eula Schools Victim of Recent Burglar

On Thursday night the Baird school and the Eula School was broken into and Sheriff Bill Skinner reported that the Sheriff's Department has made no arrests but have some possible suspects. He also stated that the break-ins in the Eula and Baird Schools could tie in with the break-ins in Jones and Taylor County Schools.

The burglars are apparently no amateurs and now what they are looking for according to the Sheriff's Department.

The safe at the Eula School was re-

ported torn apart and several hundred dollars in cash was taken. The safe was estimated at \$700-\$900 to replace.

The Baird School burglars apparently chipped through the walls of the safe to open the vault from the inside.

The Baird Schools were reported missing about \$12 in cash and although the superintendent's office was ransacked the payroll checks left on the desk, that were endorsed, were not taken.

The office machines were not taken.

The Callahan County Sheriff's Office is still investigating both incidents.

## Carroll Chambless Services Held Saturday

Carroll Jack Chambless of Clyde died Friday morning at the West Texas Medical Center in Abilene at the age of 69. Services were at 2:00 p.m. Saturday

at the First Baptist Church in Clyde. The Rev. Riley Fugitt, officiated the services and graveside services were at 4:30 Saturday in Asper-

mont Cemetery directed by the Bailey Funeral Home.

Born on MAY 12, 1908, in Merkel, Texas, he married Eunice Frazier July 16, 1946, in Aspermont. He was a rancher and businessman in Stonewall County and had lived in Red River, NM for 28 years. He was president of the Red River Chamber of Commerce, a justice of the peace, a first lieutenant in the New Mexico Patrol and served on the National Ski Patrol while in New Mexico.

He was also in business there. He was also active in the New Mexico Baptist General Convention, serving on the state mission board and other committees.

He had lived in Clyde for the past four years.

Mr. Chambless was a Baptist. He was a member of the Rotary Club, and a Masonic Lodge No. 1382 of Aspermont, Chapter 257 of Stamford and Council 192 of Stamford. He was also a member if the Shriners in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Carol SoRelle of Amarillo; a foster daughter, Martha Klein of Denver, Colorado; a sister, Ina Hunter of Abilene; five grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.
