to control vesciular extenthema; DEFEATED HB 3 which would have

source of needed revenue; In 1949 and subsequent years, by direct appeal to Washington, secured O.K. for USDA loans on grains temporarily
stored on the ground, saving Texas farmers millions of dollars by enabling them to "hold" through a harvest depressed market period;
Secured passage of Texas Wareehouse Act, which provides for issuance of NEGOTIABLE warehouse receipts by all dealers issuing CCC re-
ceipts.
