



This is a natural development because our greatly improved systems of communication, where the word of severe storms is flashed across the country in an instant, and picked up and embellished by an ambitious press, radio, and television industry for the eager eyes and ears of the public, have contributed greatly to the impression that there is more to fear than ver before.

Nonsense. There is no substantiating data to this effect. There aren't any more tornadoes than there used to be. They aren't any more severe than they ever

It's just that there are more people to spot the ones that appear, and there is a greatly expanded system of communication to tell everyone within minutes of their appearance.

Actually, we understand tornadoes better than we ever have. We know approximately what conditions must exist before they can be spawned. We have elaborate spotting and tracking devices. We know of precautions that can be taken by the average citizen which will greatly

Now, we reemphasize: Tornadoes ARE worthy of concern. And it is true that Friona has an inadequate warning system, and that we should be concerned with its improvement
