You have informed me that it will be impossible for you to accept the enclosed $\$ 1.40$ as a voluntary
additional postage payment to mail The Friona Star, for the reason that no proper accounting of this

does not provide for any additional payment on postage of newspapers or other mailed matter.
I will consider it a great favor if, then, you will
accept the enclosed $\$ 1.40$, together with this letter, and forward it to Mr. Arthur Summerfield, post-
master general of the U. S. Postal Department, remaster general of the U. S. Postal Department, re-
questing that he find ways and means of incorporatquesting that he find ways and means of incorporat-
ing this amount, plus an additional \$1.40 each week
hereafter, into the operating budget of the Post hereafter, into the operating budget of the Post
Office.

My reason for this action is that I feel that the
second class mailing rates for The Friona Star, and many other publications of a similar nature, are too
