Scam alert about tax rebate checks

Texas Attorney General stimulus tax rebate.

In the next few months calls from purported IRS agents claiming taxpayers are eligible for "Bush refunds" and asking for Social Security and bank account numbers. They say the IRS will use the information to directly deposit the rebate checks into your bank account.

"The IRS does not call or email taxpayers unexpectedly to demand personal information," Abbott said. "This' is outright identity theft fraud."

Taxpayers solicited in this manner are advised to just hang up or delete the email. To report an incident you can contact Abbott's office at 1-800-621-0508.

Spc. Lacye Presley, a combat medic assigned to the 89th Military Police Brigade, earned recognition for saving the life of CBS correspondent Kimberly Dozier on Memorial Day 2006 in Iraq.

"As a medic, it's your job to try and fix them," Presley said about helping Dozier and every Soldier she's aided since joining the Army. "It's a lot of weight on your shoulders, and it can be very scary - especially with that being my first combat incident."

Presley's best friend said anyone under her care is in great hands regardless of the situation.

"She takes her job very seriously," Sgt. Holly Tomson, who also is with the 89th MP Bde., said. "She is always trying to learn so she can take care of her fellow Soldiers. She has so much honor and pride. She is a good person with or



Beef lettuce wraps and wowee sauce

This recipe from Family Features would do for lunch or supper, but probably not breakfast. It sounds like a burrito wrapped in lettuce instead of a tortilla except for the carrots.

What got my attention was the "wowee" sauce. I figured it would be hot and spicy but then I looked at the sauce ingredients. Maybe the soy sauce makes it "wowee".

I don't think the lettuce is going to be firm enough to eat aside. with your hands like a burrito. You might want to have a fork handy. Good luck and "wowee".

Wowee sauce

- 18 oz cañ crushed pineapple, drained
- 1/3 cup orange marmalade
- 2 tbsp soy sauce
- 1. Combine wowee sauce ingredients in small bowl, set
- 2. Brown ground beef in large nonstick skillet over medium heat 8-10 minutes or until beef is not pink, breaking up into small crumbles. Pour off drippings. Add green onions and soy sauce; season with pepper, as desired. Cook and stir for 1 minute.
- 3. Evenly spoon beef mixture onto each lettuce leaf. Top with equal amounts of water chesnuts and carrots. Spoon some wowee sauce over top. Wrap lettuce around filling. Serve with remaining wowee sauce.

Makes 4 servings.

Cook's tip: Three-fourths cup crushed baked tortilla chips may be substituted for sliced water chestnuts.



Norma Jean (Schults) Terry started her working career while she was a senior at Friona High School. She worked part time at Ralph Roden's drugstore at 6th & Main and O.J. Beene's drugstore a few doors south.

Her mother Vivian Hughes asked Frank Spring if Jean could work for him at the bank. During her senior year Jean would walk to the "red bank" where she worked for 50 cents a day, then try to get back to the school to catch the bus. Sometimes she had to walk home.

She calls it the "red bank" because that was the color of the brick when the bank was at 5th & Main. She remembers an apartment on the second floor of the bank and the tenants shared the bathroom with bank employ-

Jean filed checks and learned to operate the posting machine. She became so proficient she trained others to use the posting machine.


She did not like being a teller. Once she gave out too much money by mistake. She remembered who she gave it to and was told to visit the person and see if he had discovered the error. He denied it and she was afraid Mr. Spring would fire her. He didn't.

The bank sponsored Jean Terry in the first Miss Friona contest and she won. Afterwards Mr. C. W. Dixon would come into the bank and ask her when she was leaving for Hollywood.

When John Terry came home from the war they started dating. They were married in 1948. By this time she was working at the "white bank" at 7th & Main for \$1 a day. In 1950 she quit because there was a rule you could not "be in the family way" and work at the bank.

Some of the employees she remembers are Mr. Spring, Charles Allen, tellers Jane Williams and Eva Lou Rector, and Lola Goodwine who worked in bookkeeping.



Extension Service to offer food manager certification course

Statistics indicate that foodborne illness continues to be a health issue in the United States. Each year, 1 in 4 Americans will become sick, 1 in 1,000 will become hospitalized, and 5,000 will die due to a foodborne illness.

During the past legislative session, a statute was amended that allowed the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to require each food establishment to have one certified food manager.

Recently, the Texas Board of Health adopted rules to implement this statute. Many of you have already received a letter from the Texas Department of State Health Services regarding this. Under these new rules, each food establishment permitted by the Texas Department of State Health Services must have one certified food manager. New food manager certificates will be valid for six years.

Texas AgriLife Extension Service, Bailey, Cochran, and Hockley County, is offering a food manager certification training course. This program will be offered for \$89 on

March 6 & 7, 2008, at the Hockley County Extension Office, 1212 Houston, Ste. 2., Levelland, Texas, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Cost includes training, materials, and the State food manager certification examination.

This program is designed to not only prepare foodservice managers to pass the certification examination; it will provide valuable education regarding the safe handling of food. Almost 50 cents of every dollar Americans spend on food is spent on meals prepared away from home. Therefore, careful attention to food safety will help keep customers safe and satisfied.

Foodborne illnesses are estimated to cost thousands of dollars in lost wages, insurance, and medical bills. With these statistics, knowledge of how to prevent foodborne illness is essential. The benefits of improved food safety include:

·Increased customer satisfaction

·Improved relationships with health officials

·Prevention of bad publicity and law suits due to foodborne illness

By attending the course, foodservice managers will learn about: ·Identifying potentially hazardous foods and common errors in food handling

Preventing contamination and cross-contamination of food ·Teaching and encouraging personal hygiene for employees

·Complying with government regulations ·Maintaining clean utensils, equipment, and surrounding


·Controlling pests

Foodborne illnesses can be prevented by following simple food safety practices. For more information about the Food Manager Certification Training course of Texas AgriLife Extension Service, called "Food Safety: It's Our Business", call Mandi Seaton, Bailey County Extension Agent – Family and Consumer Sciences at (806) 272-4583. The TCEQ executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING You may submit public comments, a request for a public meeting, or request a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

If a hearing request is timely filed, the executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application.
