#### Ham & Tater Chowder Makes 6 servings

- 18 frozen potato puffs (such as Tater Tots).
- 2 cans (14 fluid ozs each) reduced sodium chicken
- 2 cans (12 fluid ozs each)
- 2 cups (8 ozs) cooked ham, cut into ½ inch pieces
- 1 34 cups instant mashed potato flakes
- 1 can (15 1/4 ozs) no-salt
- whole kernel corn, drained 2 tsps onion powder
- 1/4 tsp ground black pepper Sliced green onions (optional)

Prepare potato puffs according to package directions. Meanwhile, combine broth and evaporated milk in large saucepan. Bring mixture just to a boil over medium-high heat; reduce heat to low. Add You've got to love a dish ham, potato flakes, corn, onion powder, and black pepper. Cook, stirring frequently, for 5 to 8 minutes until creamy and slightly thick. 





#### Gertie Murphree remembers....






Gertrude Short Murphree was employed at Friona State Bank in the 1940s. Frank Spring was the president.

"He was so good to us. We all did every job, waiting on the window, posting, etc. Our posting machine and adding machine were hand run by pulling a lever. One day I took all the totals to a big machine, pulled the lever, and the total rolled out the first one million dollars. We all began to clap and dance around."

"I remember the day we came to work to find America had dropped the atom bomb. Mr. Frank had to explain what an atom bomb was to a bunch of women. This meant the war would end and our guys could come home."

"Later when the new bank was on Main corner I went back to work and had to learn all the new-fangled machines. You didn't even have to pull a lever. I didn't last long there because I couldn't stand to leave my two little boys crying every day. Now I am going to try Internet. I love Friona State Bank and the great crew there. Wish I was young. I might try to get a job."

#### Comptroller urges Texans to claim federal tax breaks

As federal tax filing season gears up, Texas Comptroller Susan Combs reminds Texans that the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) puts billions of dollars in income tax refunds into families' pockets and the Texas economy.

"If you work and your family made less than \$39,783 in 2007, the federal government may owe you a refund on your income tax," Combs said. "Last year, more than 2 million Texans claimed the Earned Income Tax Credit and received almost \$4.7 billion in EITC refunds — an average of \$2,151 per qualifying household."

EITC refunds are based on family income and the number of children in the family. To receive the credit, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires families to meet specific eligibility requirements and have a valid Social Security number for each family member.

Taxpayers who expect to qualify for the EITC and have at least one qualifying child can sign up for the Advance Earned Income Tax Credit at work and receive part of the credit in each paycheck, instead of waiting for a tax refund..

More information about how to qualify for the EITC, along with helpful links to IRS tax forms and publications, can be found on the Comptroller's Web site, www.window.state.tx.us/taxinfo/eitc/, or by calling the IRS at (800) 829-1040.

"The Earned Income Tax Credit gives Texas families extra spending power and puts billions of dollars to work in the Texas economy, so I urge Texans to find out whether they qualify and to claim the EITC," Combs said.

Combs also reminds Texans that taxpayers who itemize deductions on their federal income tax can claim a deduction for state and local sales taxes they paid in 2007.

This may be the last time the sales tax deduction is The next meeting of the Noon Lions is February 7 at available, unless the U.S. Congress votes to continue the tax break. The provision is aimed at Texas and six other states without state income taxes that residents can deduct from their federal tax. Combs is working with the Texas congressional delegation to make the sales tax deduction permanent. The Comptroller says continuing the deduction for 2008 and beyond would save Texans a projected \$1.2 billion a year, or an average of \$520 per filer claiming the deduction.


He was preceded in death by his wife and a stepdaughter, Peggy Allen, on October 27, 2004.
