Barker & Stevick Win Re-Election

In the only city race held in Saturday's election, two city council incumbents were returned to office for another two year term.

There were a total of 426 votes cast (each voter had two votes) in the Friona city council election. The final totals were Martha Barker 184, Ronnie Stevick 109, Wesley Barnett 84, and Jayson Grimsley 49. Mayor John Taylor, also re-elected, was unopposed.

Bovina School, City Vote Results

Bovina voters went to the polls Saturday to elect city aldermen and school board members.

Jessie Stone and Larry Hodnett were elected to the Bovina city council. Stone is the incumbent and Hodnett is a newcomer. Vote totals were Hodnett 81, Stone 70, Deolondo Alonzo 27, and Jesse Ramon 21.

Three seats were available on the Bovina school board. The vote totals were Richard Carson 146, Don Teague 110, George Villarreal 107, and Josie Alonzo-Coffey 63.

Carson, Teague and Villarreal will fill the three school board seats. Villarreal is an incumbent.

YOUR EYES
Comfort and Style Both Important With Eyeglasses

You may want to buy a pair of glasses because they are the latest fashion, or you like the way the look adds to your appearance. They should also be comfortable, especially if worn on a regular basis. For example, you want to ensure that the frames are wide enough for your face, so the temples, or sides of the glasses, do not dig into the sides of your head as they extend backward toward your ears. Your eye-care specialist can provide many styles of frames that have varying temple lengths. Also, at the final eyeglass fitting, he/she can adjust the curves at the end of the temples so they fit comfortably.

The nosepiece of the glasses should also fit correctly. Many frames have soft, silicon nose pads that are adjustable for fit. If the pads cannot be adjusted, make sure they are secure without pinching the bridge of your nose.

When you try on your new frames, shift your head up and down and sideways. Also bend over to see how well your glasses stay in place. With the properly adjusted nose pads and temples, your eyeglass frames should remain comfortably on your face without moving.

High Plains Crop Making Rapid Progress With Favorable Weather

Warm, sunny days and scattered showers have provided High Plains cotton producers the right ingredients to make significant planting progress over the past week.

Surveys of county Extension agents and other Texas Cooperative Extension service personnel, crop consultants, seed and chemical representatives indicate as much as 50 percent of the area's expected 3.5-3.6 million cotton acres are already in the ground and getting off to a fast start.

As usual, planting of irrigated acreage is farthest along with 60-70 percent in the ground to date. Dryland planting tallies only 20-30 percent complete as producers either finish up planting of irrigated crops or wait for a planting rain to top off the soil profile and improve odds for a fast start to the dryland crop.

Overall conditions continue to be near optimum with good subsoil moisture, warm soil temperatures and clear days being the norm.

"Outside of the odd cool day, which is really not uncommon this early in May, we have had a good run during the early part of the planting season," says TCE Cotton Specialist Randy Boman of Lubbock. "Soil moisture continues to be good in almost all parts of the region, but high temperatures and wind over the past week has also caused some drying to occur in the upper soil profile."

Irrigated producers with center pivot systems are taking the time to run the system behind the planter to provide a quick shot of moisture and help assure proper seed germination. Dryland producers who are accustomed to waiting for Mother

Nature to provide a timely rain before planting are content to wait for now.

"With a good subsoil moisture supply, dryland growers should be able to react quickly and take advantage of just about any rain event that brings an inch or so of moisture to their fields," notes Boman.

This is a much better situation for the dryland producer than what they have experienced the past several years when several times that much rain was necessary to establish the crop and there was little to no subsoil moisture there to carry the crop along.

With continued good weather, and a timely rain event on dryland acreage, the balance of the region's acres should be planted in the next 10-14 days.

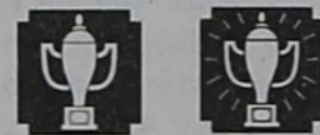

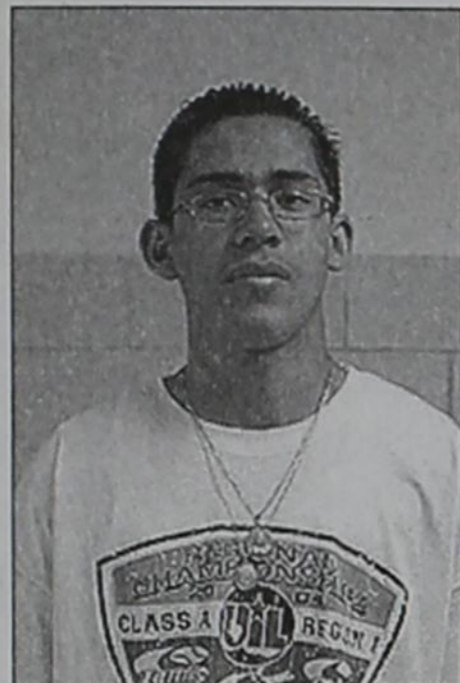

Bovina's Ortiz 2nd In State 1A 3200m Run

Bovina high school junior Edgar Ortiz ran a personal best time of 10:03.70 in the 3200m run at the state track meet. Knocking 14 seconds off his previous best, Ortiz placed second in the 1A finals, about 3 seconds behind the winner, Steven Barraza (10:00.5) of Sands.

Because Bovina does not have a track, coaches have marked off a two-mile course through Bovina's streets. For speed work he runs on the football field.

Coach Tony Epps told a reporter at the meet in Austin, "It's a pretty simple strategy. Since we don't have a track it is hard to run quarters so we just find out who the top competitor is and try to stay with him." Ortiz had run on Barraza's heels most of the race and distanced himself from the rest of the field at the finish.

"He goes in spurts," Epps told the newspaper. "He cut a minute off as a sophomore, another minute as a junior, and in the last two weeks has gone from the 10:30s to the teens and now to single digits."

"I had no strategy," Ortiz said. "I just ran and hoped I did good." The strategy did not pay off in the 1600m run though. Edgar finished 8th in that event with a 1600m time of 4:52.48. The winner of the 1A-1600m run was Nick De Leon of Barksdale Nueces Canyon with a winning time of 4:33.15.
