



Callahan County Safety-Rest Areas To Have Free, Wireless Access

Abilene, TX - Free, wireless access to the Internet for travelers stopping at 102 safety rest areas in Texas has moved a step closer to reality with the signing of an agreement between the company that will provide the service and the Texas Department of Transportation.

"Road Connect, a brand of Austin-based Coach Connect, will be providing nocost Internet connectivity at all of our safety-rest areas and travel-information centers within the year," said Andy Keith, TxDOT program manager for safety-rest areas. "The seven safety-rest areas that currently provide wireless Internet access will be upgraded to provide additional services."

TxDOT selected the firm after evaluating proposals submitted last summer by five potential vendors.

The first two rest areas to receive Coach Connect services will be in Medina Count on U. S. 90 near Hondo and in Colorado County on Interstate 10 near Columbus.

Installations there are expected to be complete by December. Installations at all 102 safety-rest areas should be complete by October 2005.

"As of yet, we have not been notified of the date the two Callahan County safetyrest areas will receive the coach Connect services." Mary Beth Kilgore, Abilene officer, said.

There are seven safety-rest areas in the 13-county. Abilene District; two each in Callahan and Nolan Counties, and one each in Haskell. Howard, and Mitchell Coun-

Travelers with wireless laptops or handheld Internetcapable devices will be able to access free safety, weather, and travel information at the safety-rest areas and travel centers across the state. In addition, up to 120 minutes of free Internet time will be available.

Cost for 20 minutes will be \$1.99, followed by \$3.99 for 24 hours, \$7.99 for a week, or \$29.99 per month.

### **Protect Yourself From Identity Theft**

Identity theft is the fastest growing crime in America. The Federal Trade Commission reports that in 2003, more than 20,000 Texans fell prey to identify theft. The results can be devastating, as victims spend large amounts of time and money trying to clear their names.

Identity theft is the theft or misuse of personal or financial information in order to gain something of value or to facilitate other criminal activity. There are numerous types of identity crime, including identity theft, credit card fraud ("skimming"), bank fraud, check fraud and passport/ visa fraud. Identity crime can involve multiple victims and often involves a large dollar loss; it may be used by organized criminal groups, 'and in those instances may be associated with other crimes, such as drug trafficking, mail fraud, terrorism and financial fraud.

Identity theft can begin with what may seem like an unrelated crime, such as a simple theft of a wallet or purse. Victims may not realize their identity has been stolen until they are denied credit, sent a bill for purchases they did not make, or turned down for a job. We have even received reports of victims being arrested for crimes committed by thieves using their identities.

On September 1, 2003, a State law went into effect that sets the venue for reporting identity crime as the city or county where the victim resides. The new law states that regardless of where the fraudulent transaction originates, it is appropriate for the victim to make a police report whereever he or she resides.

she resides.

If you are a victim of identity theft, it is imperative that you obtain a police report as soon as possible. Many banks and credit agencies require such a report before they will acknowledge that a theft has occurred.

You should then contact the primary credit three agencies reporting (Experian, Equifax and TransUnion) to have a security alert or freeze placed on your report. Request a copy of your credit report review it for unauthorized account activity. Report unauthorized charges and accounts to the appropriate credit issuers.

If your wallet or purse is stolen, immediately cancel your credit and debit cards and get replacements. Put a "stop payment" on all lost or stolen checks.

stolen checks.

Victims should contact the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), which advocates on behalf of identity theft victims. You can also obtain more information on identity theft by contacting our office.

Check your bank and credit card statements carefully

each month. Early detection is extremely important. Discovering identity theft within one month drastically reduces the chances of monetary loss and damage to your credit. When identity theft goes undetected for six months or more, losses often amount to thousands of dollars.

We urge consumers to be very cautious about giving out their personal financial information. Our office has received numerous complaints of scam e-mails ranging from lottery hoaxes and advanced fee fraud to bogus e-mails from what appear to be legitimate businesses requesting personal information. No matter what a caller or e-mailer tells you, do not give out your Social Security number, driver's license number or other personal information over the phone or by e-mail.

Unfortunately, identity crime is here to stay. However, we can fight this menace if consumers and law enforcement agencies work together.

Friday morning, we're on the road between Brownfield and Sundown, and the crops here range from looking absolutely beautiful to needing a heck of a lot more time. The cotton crop in some places is defoliated and looks excellent, but in other places I have a hard time seeing open bolls, but still I know they're out there, just need more time.

#### Latest News on

Ag Disaster Assistance President Bush signed into

law the Military Construction Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2005 on Wednesday, October 13th. This bill was the vehicle for the ag disaster assistance package for 2003 and 2004 losses.

So producers who suffered quantity or quality losses in their 2003 or 2004 crops are eligible to receive assistance on their losses above 35 percent.

Producers will be able to receive assistance on losses in either 2003 or 2004, but not both years.

I am pleased to have started the discussion on providing disaster assistance in the House of Representatives by introducing bipartisan legislation that 45 of my colleagues, including 18 Republicans, cosponsored with me.

When the House Rules Committee met to consider a supplemental spending bill to pay for costs related to the 2004 hurricanes, I testified before the Rules Committee about the need for disaster assistance for producers in other parts of the country.

I expect that we will hear something shortly from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) in regards to how quickly producers will be able to sign up for this assistance and will update you as soon as we hear something.

Ethanol/Energy News

I am pleased that we have finally been able to pass at least a portion of the ethanol provisions that are of importance to corn and sorghum producers in West Texas.

Producers have been working diligently to bring several ethanol plants into reality to add value to their crops, lessen dependence on foreign oil, and provide jobs.

While we had a partial victory, the fight continues as we need to see a Renewable Fuels Standard enacted to help ensure that the growth in ethanol demand continues. We want the proposed ethanol plants to count on growth in demand, something they will be able to guarantee to their bankers to help ensure continued financing.

I am hopeful that the biodiesel provisions that I supported and was able to vote for will help to make biodiesel more affordable and take some pressure off the skyrocketing price of diesel in the near future. As you may know, we're told that increased demand for diesel is one of the maj , reasons for the run-up in p ices.

As we're recording this on I was very disappointed to see comments reported in the press this week that Energy and Commerce Committee Chairman Joe Barton of Texas appears to be giving up on passing a comprehensive energy bill yet this year.

> The press reports also indicated that if Congress doesn't pass an energy bill when we return to legislative business in November, then chances for a comprehensive energy bill passing in the foreseeable future are slim since the Energy and Commerce Committee may move on to Clean Air Act issues during the next Congress.

> That will be a shame, and a major, major loss for America if we don't get comprehensive energy legislation passed and passed soon.

#### **Grassland Reserve** Program

Those of you who submitted applications to enroll acreage into the Grassland Reserve Program have been waiting for some time to find out whether your application will be accepted, and it looks like you'll be waiting a while longer.

Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) officials indicated that they are working on the easement language after hearing concerns from some livestock and farm groups, so they pulled the easement agreements back from the field.

The easement document is being worked on here in Washington, and it could be later this fall before the NRCS is ready to enter into agreements to enroll acreage.

The Grassland Reserve Program was a new program created in the 2002 Farm Bill and, as with many of our conservation programs, the demand for the program is far outweighing the acres available for enrollment.

#### **Conservation Program** Participation For New Fiscal Year

As has been the case for the last several years, the conservation efforts of West Texas farmers and ranchers are suffering because Congress cannot get its work done.

We are two weeks into the new 2005 fiscal year, and yet we still have no idea when your local NRCS and conservation district offices will be able to start working with producers who are interested in signing up for the EQIP or WHIP programs.

Because the ag appropriations bill has not been passed into law (in fact the Senate hasn't even brought it to the floor yet), the Office of Management and Budget, or OMB, is highly unlikely to tee on Agriculture.

let USDA start putting out money for this new fiscal

This is just one more way. that we're frustrating the efforts of farmers and ranchers out there who want to do the right thing with the help of the federal government.


We know the interest is there because we're facing a total of nearly \$4 billion in backlogged applications that can't be completed because we don't have the money.

I just hope these producers don't get frustrated by the wait and give up on the projects they hoped to undertake.





Will Rogers on Politics

As our political races begin to heat up, and controversy sizzles, we need Will Rogers here to put it all in perspective. He could poke fun at the process, with his common sense philosophy and folksy humor. Politics was an in exhaustible source of subject matter to him. He would take full advantage of the present hostilities.

His satire did not come from ignorance of the political situation. He kept informed by showing up at every presidential convention, visiting with the known, and unknown politicians, and attending functions with Washington society leaders. He spoke, and wrote what was on his mind, regardless of consequences. He pointed out the fallacies of partisan politics. He was much loved by the people, and much feared by the professional politician.

He explained: "I generally give the party in power, whether Republican or Democrat, the more digs because they are generally doing the country the most damage, and, besides I don't think it's fair to jump too much on the fellow that is down."

It was reported that Will, who probably influenced more ballots than any other living individual, had never voted. He responded to that with, "Nope, if this here country goes to the bowwows, there ain't no one who can blame me for it."

About politicians he said, "Now I read politics, talk politics, know personally almost every prominent politician; like 'em and they are my friends, but I can't help it if I have seen enough of it to know there is some baloney in it." He called politics, "the best show in America," and he seldom made a speech without bringing in something of the political situation.

Some of his observations on the subject include:

"Political elections...are a good deal like marriages, there's no accounting for anyone's tastes."

"A flock of Democrats will replace a mess of Republicans. It won't mean a thing. They will go in like all the rest of 'em. Go in on a promise, and come out on an alibis."

"Sometimes it makes you think we don't need a different man as bad as we need different advisers for the same man."

"We will never get anywhere with our finances till we pass a law saying that every time we appropriate something we got to pass another bill along with it, stating where the money is coming from."

"Always remember this,





Oct. 17-13 Is Schoo! **Bus Safety Week** 

DPS is asking motorists to practice safe driving habits around school buses as part of School Bus Safety Week, Oct. 17-23.

This year's theme-"Shh...Railroad Crossing"-is designed to emphasize the need for quiet on a school bus when approaching a railroad crossing. State law requires buses to come to a complete stop before crossing railroad tracks, even if a train isn't present.

"Motorists approaching a stopped school bus with alternating red flashing lights are required by state law to stop," said Charley Kennington, DPS program administrator for school bus transportation. "Violators face fines of up to \$1,000 if convicted."

Drivers should not proceed until the school bus resumes motion; the driver is signaled by the bus driver to proceed; or the visual signal is no longer activated. If a road is divided only by a leftturning lane, drivers on both sides of the roadway must stop for school buses with alternating red flashing lights activated. However, if the lanes are separated by an intervening space or physical barrier, only motorists going in the same direction as the bus are required to stop.

"There are an average of 22 accidents a year involving a student that was getting on or exiting a bus," Kennington said. "About half of those involved motorists illegally passing a school bus."



#### **Supreme Court Rules Again On Texas** Redistricting

On Monday, Oct. 18 the U.S. Supreme Court announced a ruling that ordered reconsideration of Texas redistricting.

The case was sent back to a three-judge federal panel in Texas for further study on whether it was properly

Apparently this will not affect the redrawn Congressional boundaries at this time, and the General Election voting will go ahead as planned.

There are hints, however, that if the federal panel finally rules against the redistricting it could throw the election into question.

Or, the case could also make its ponderous way back to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Those opposed to the redistricting hail this latest Supreme Court action as a sort of victory.

In the meanwhile, the voter at least has a chance to support or repudiate the candidates in the new districts.




