## New \$5 Million Facility Now Underway Locally

A groundbreaking was held Tuesday for the construction of a \$5 million shuttle train receiving facility adjacent to West Friona Grain southwest of Friona.

Grading work has already begun. The two elevators planned for the site will be 140 feet tall and 42 feet in diameter. Tracks will be built to accommodate 110-car shuttle trains. Officials said when the operation is complete, 150 trucks per day will haul grain from the plant.

The project is a feed grain partnership between Commodity Specialists Company (CSC) and the Harvest States

division of CHS Cooperatives, both headquartered in Minnesota.

CSC, which owns West Friona Grain, is an international agri-products trading and marketing business and has been a leader in domestic feed ingredients for more than 50 years. The company specializes in soybean, cottonseed, feedgrain, wheat and brewer's products.

Harvest States represents the grain and foods business of CHS Cooperatives, a producer-to-consumer cooperative system owned by farmers, ranchers and their local co-ops from the Great

Lakes to the Pacific Northwest and from the Canadian border to Texas. This fully integrated agricultural foods cooperative provides a wide variety of products and services ranging from grain marketing to food processing.

The Friona facility, situated on a 131-acre site, is designed to primarily handle yellow corn, but its six bins and two interstices will be hopped to accommodate other commodities if needed. The building project should be completed by year-end 2002.

With a storage capacity of 880,000 bushels—about two shuttle trains worth of grain—annual volume is estimated at 25 million bushels. The Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad will service the facility.

Rick Browne, Grain Suppliers Board Chairman and Harvest States Grain Group Senior Vice President said, "In today's increasingly competitive agricultural climate it is critical to move grain from the producer to the consumer in the most efficient way possible. Facilities like this one are just one way to integrate the farm-to-table system for maximum benefit to both buyers and sellers."

Todd & Sargent, headquartered in Ames, Iowa, will serve as design/build general contractor for the project. They have served as general contractor for Harvest States flour mills in Pennsylvania and Wisconsin and currently are constructing a soybean crushing facility in Minnesota.

Subcontractors and additional suppliers for the Friona project are now under review. A West Friona Grain official said the new operation will employ about six people.

## Fay Reeve Tapped As "Mother Of The Year"

Fay Reeve was born September 4, 1917 in Denton County, Texas, the sixth child of Jarrett and Cynthia Pinckley.

The family moved to Merkel, Texas, in 1920. Another child was born in 1925 and all seven children, one son and six daughters, graduated from Merkel High School. Fay graduated high school in 1934, and received her degree from North Texas State University in 1938.

Fay began her teaching career at Perryton, teaching from 1938 until 1942. On February 28 of that year, she married her principal, Hadley Reeve.

The couple lived in Belleville, Illinois from July, 1942 to December, 1943. Hadley was a civilian radio instructor at Scott Field. While there Fay taught in a one-teacher school. Their oldest son, Floyd Scott, was born September 9, 1943, in Belleville.

They moved to the Reeve farm a mile west of Friona on April 1, 1944, where Floyd farmed and also became a partner in the Reeve Chevrolet business.

Three more children were added: Sharon was born November 25, 1944 in Hereford; David was born July 13, 1950, and Carol Ann was born June 28, 1955, the last two born in Friona.

Hadley had rheumatic fever as a child, and his health problem worsened in the 1950s. He died on April 11, 1957, and Fay was faced with raising four children alone. Her youngest child, Carol, was only two.

Fay began teaching in the Friona ISD system in 1958, and taught in junior high school until her retirement in 1983.

## Floyd married Betty City, School Boards Elect Members

In a fair turnout of voters last Saturday, the City of Friona and the Friona ISD board of trustees each saw one incumbent re-elected, with one new member also elected.

In the city race, Martha Mars Barker was elected with 160 votes, and incumbent Ronnie Stevick re-elected with 123 votes. Nancy Aragon Davis received 84 votes, and Sam McIntosh 14.

For the school board, Alan Monroe was re-elected to a new term with 191 votes, but Danny Hand led the voting with 303 votes, to also win a seat on the board. Otherwise, Lori Davila received 59 votes, and Nellie Aronce had 35 votes.

He noted that fingerprints found on the Amarillo pipe bomb seemed to match those of others which had been placed in mail boxes around the country.

"We had received orders not to deliver the mail on Wednesday to any boxes around Friona except those which had been left hanging open" Rogers added. "But around 8:30 a.m. the order was rescinded because the young man who had been apprehended on the bombing charge, admitted doing it. So

COLUMBUS' MOTHER: "I don't care what you've discovered, you still could have written or called or something."

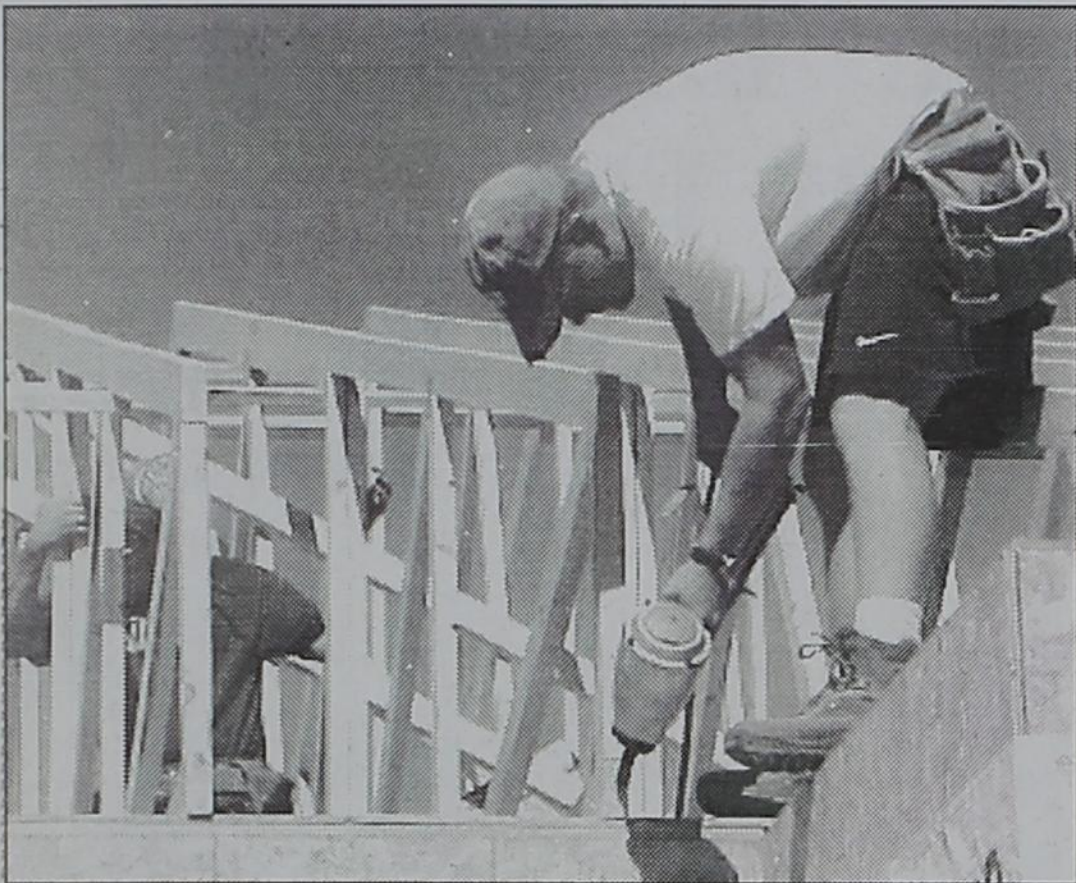
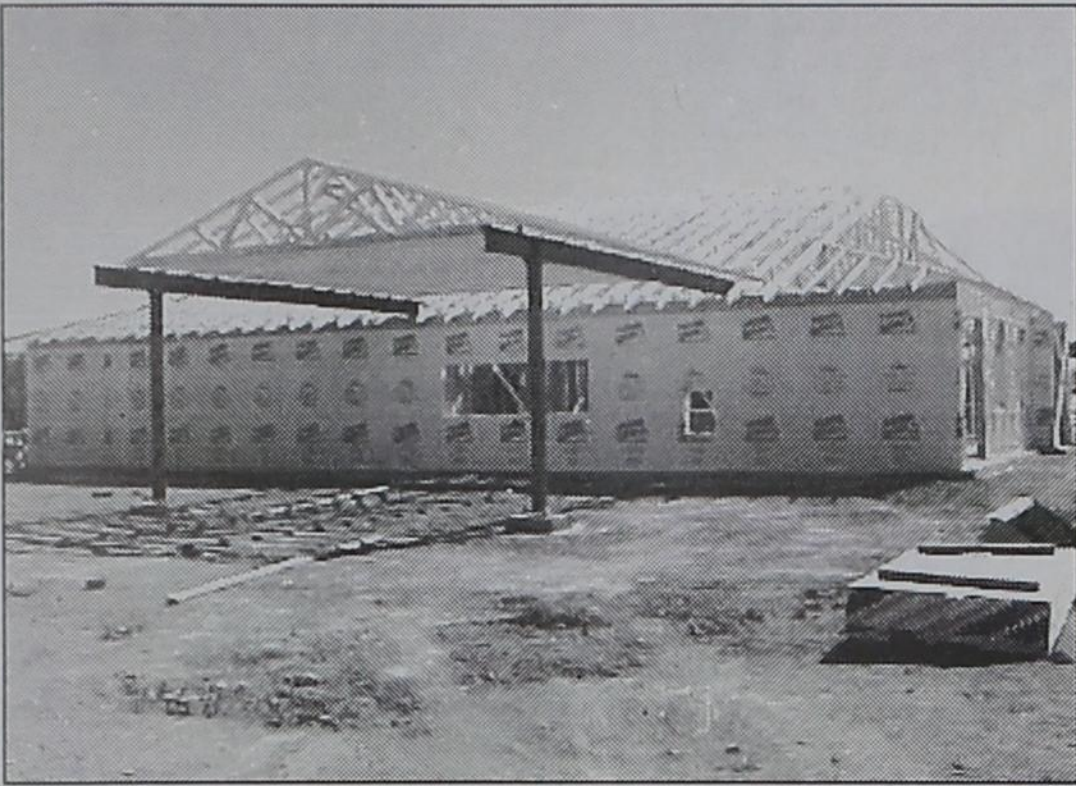

**70 Yrs Ago-May 13, 1932**  
There was a good deal of surprise manifested in Friona last week when the report became current that Friona had changed postmasters over Sunday, and that John A. Guyer, retiring postmaster, had given place to his successor in office, Dayton H. Hanson. Mr. Guyer had served its locality for the past seven or eight years.

**60 Yrs Ago-May 8, 1942**  
C.E. McLean, cashier at Friona State Bank, will leave Monday for induction into the U.S. Coast Guard, it was announced this week. Frank Truitt has also enlisted in the Coast Guard and is waiting his call to active service. Wright Williams expects to be inducted into the Coast Guard June 1.  
W.L. Edelman this week purchased the Magnolia Petroleum company agency for the Friona territory from Wright Williams, who has enlisted in the Coast Guard. Mr. Edelman has been superintendent of schools in Friona for the past four terms, and resigned his position recently.

**50 Yrs Ago-May 8, 1952**  
High School graduation will be held on Thursday, May 22 in Friona. Valedictorian of the graduating class of 18 has been announced as Joyce Ann Miller, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roy V. Miller. Salutatorian is Johnny Parker.

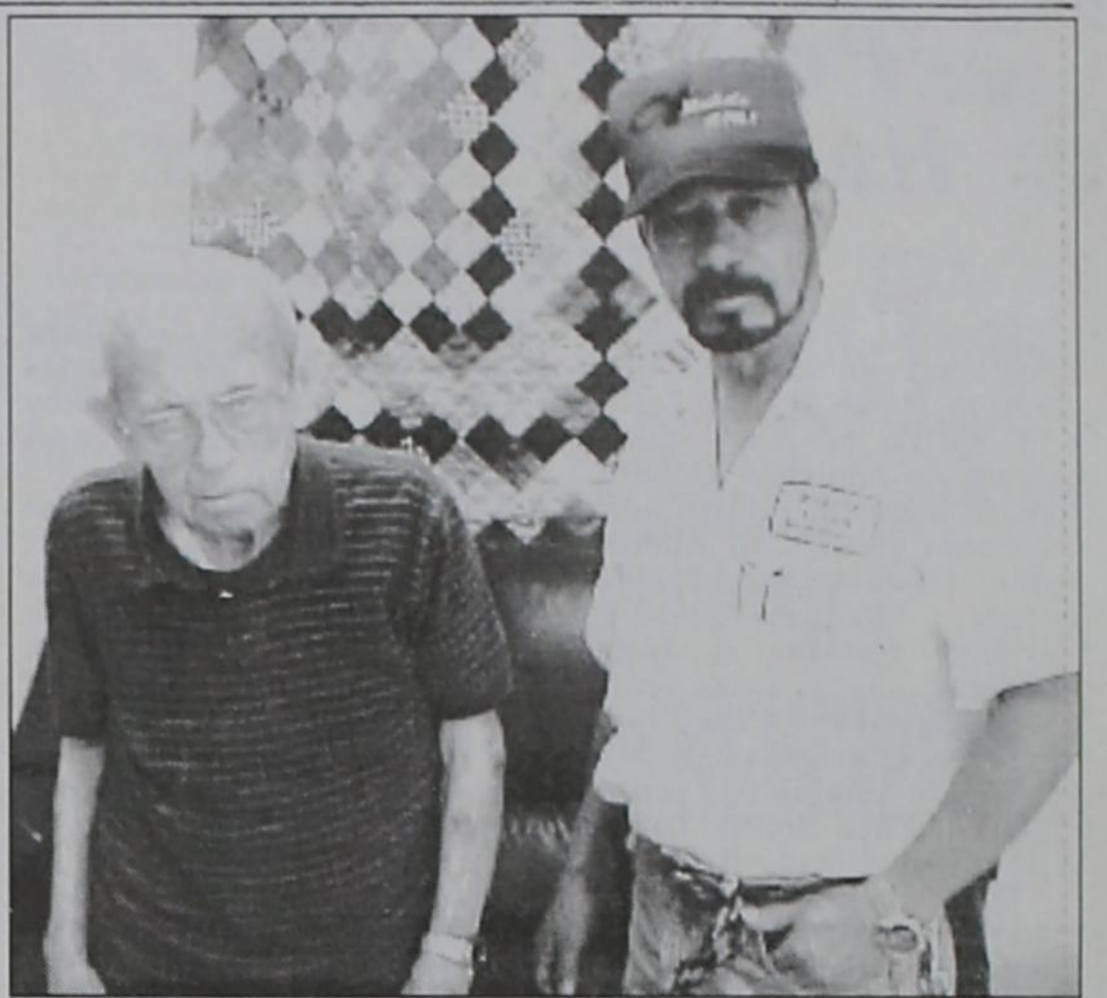

I was born Ruth Irene Durrenberger on August 31, 1916 at Serbin, Texas in Lee County. My parents were Edwin Durrenberger, Sr. and Clara Rothman.

I am the second oldest of eight children with four sisters and three brothers. At a young age, I moved from Serbin to Warda, Texas. I helped my father farm. We raised peanuts, cotton and sugar cane for making molasses. Sometimes, I would go with my dad when he sold Watkins products. I went to Holy Cross Lutheran Church and Parochial School at Warda, Texas.

At age sixteen, I went to work as a maid. I worked with my older sister, Josephine, at Port Arthur, Beaumont and Houston, Texas. About 1940, I moved with a family I was working for, to Hollywood, California.

I got to tour Warner Brothers Studios. I got to see how they made movies. One of the stars I got to see was James Arness. I also got to visit my Uncle Sam who lived there, and my brother, Edwin, Jr., who was in the Navy at the time.

In the mid 1940s I moved to Austin, Texas where I worked as a telephone switchboard operator at the University of Texas.

I met Christian Drager while he was visiting in Austin for a wedding. We were married on June 8, 1947 at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Warda, Texas. We

moved to Rhea, Texas where Chris farmed. Besides raising wheat, grain sorghum and cane, we also had many beef cattle, milk cows, hogs and chickens.

We have two children, Raymond, who lives north of Dallas, and Curtis, who farms the homestead at Rhea.

I was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church of Rhea where I taught Sunday School. I also was a member of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, The Rhea Home Demonstration Club, Friona Senior Citizens and Rhea Braille workers, where we made books of the Bible for the blind. Some of my hobbies were fishing, camping, traveling, quilting, gardening, canning and visiting with others.

I lost most of my vision because of diabetes and cataracts. I was able to stay at my house with help from my family until I fell and broke my hip. I came to live at Prairie Acres in May of 2000.

# Retired Teachers Assn. Leaders Attend District, State Meetings

Friona resident Nancy Edelman represented the Parmer County Retired Teachers and School Personnel at the Texas Retired Teachers Association convention in Waco April 14-17 where she also attended leadership and special interests sessions.

A record group of 648 delegates was in attendance with the 935 registered retirees. Business included the revision of some of the by-laws and the election of new officers for the 2002-2003 year.

The Executive Director Mike Lehr reviewed the legislation concerning retired teachers and school personnel and active teachers and school personnel that had been enacted in the last three Texas Legislative sessions. The result has been an increase in disbursement of retirement funds that has equalized the annuities for all retired teachers and school

employees regardless of how long ago the retirement had occurred.

Charles Dunlap, the Executive Director of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, gave a report on the status of the retirement funds. Currently the fund is about the 8th in size of its kind in the nation. It was learned that the system has become a model that other states are wanting to imitate for their retirement systems.

Teacher retirees have always been encouraged to volunteer in their communities in various ways, and this past year its 55,000 members have reported over 60 million volunteer hours.

The District XVI Texas Retired Teachers met for their annual Spring Conference in Amarillo at the Service Center on May 1. Representative David Swinford and TRTA Treasurer Bob Enos spoke

concerning items of interest to the group. Business of the district was conducted by the President John Krodel.

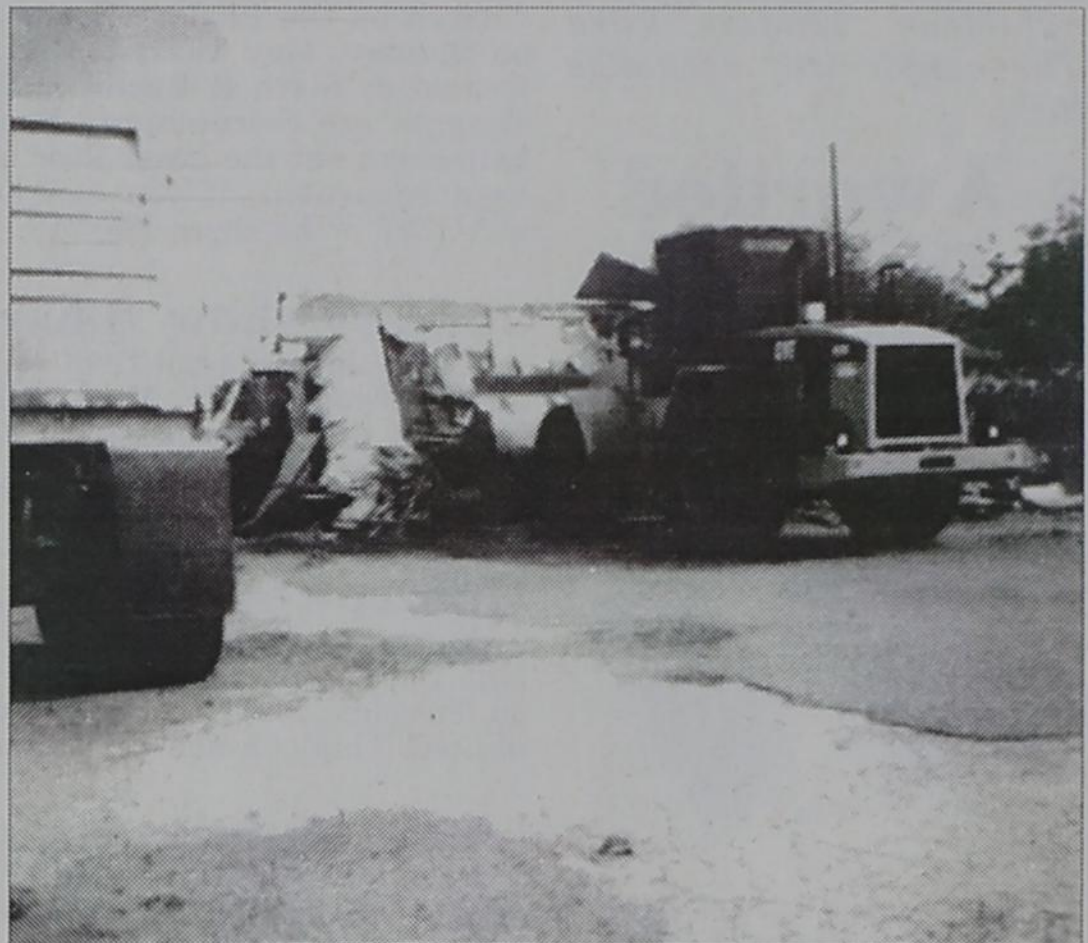
Parmer County residents may remember French and Nellie Crook built the store and filling station in the late 1940's and lived next door in the home that is still there today.

# Combest Applauds Farm Bill's Passage

Representative Larry Combest saluted the U.S. Senate for passing the Farm Bill on Wednesday. At our press time this week the bill was awaiting the president's signature to become law.

"I applaud the Senate for following the House's lead by giving its strong, bi-partisan support to the Farm Bill today," Combest said. The Senate voted 64-35 on Wednesday to pass the bill. The House had passed the bill on May 2, 280-141.

"This bill will bring much-needed assistance to our farmers who are enduring one of the most severe agricultural depressions in our nation's history. I know that those in West Texas are

anxious for it to become law. I urge the President to sign the Farm Bill soon to allow for its expedient implementation."

The bill was drafted by a House and Senate conference committee, of which Combest was chairman, that reconciled the two bodies of Congress' versions.

The bill sets farm policy for the next six years, and allocates over the next decade the amount President Bush endorses, which is \$73.5 billion more than current levels.

The new farm bill provides a safety net when commodity prices are low, which the old bill did not contain.

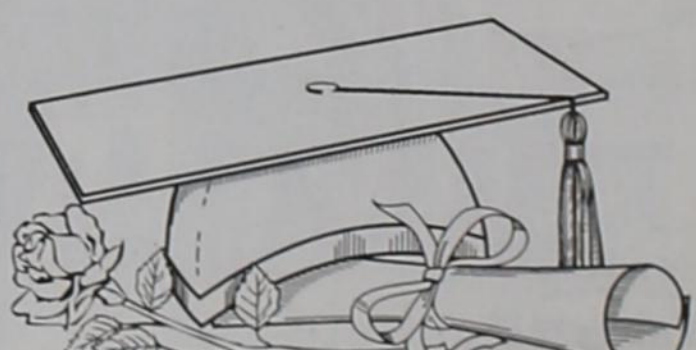

Education. From Pre-K to Master's Degree, it is big business, full of fraud, intrigue, sex, violence and even a few kids who actually learn something.

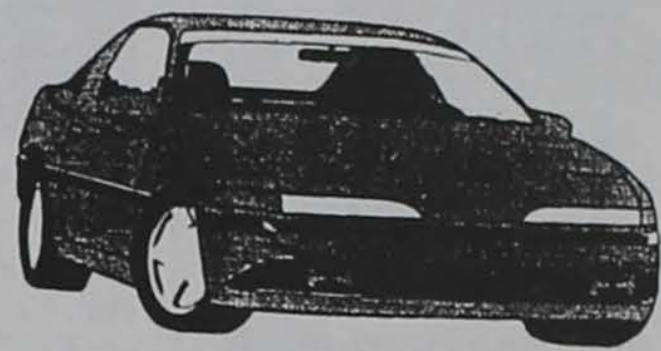

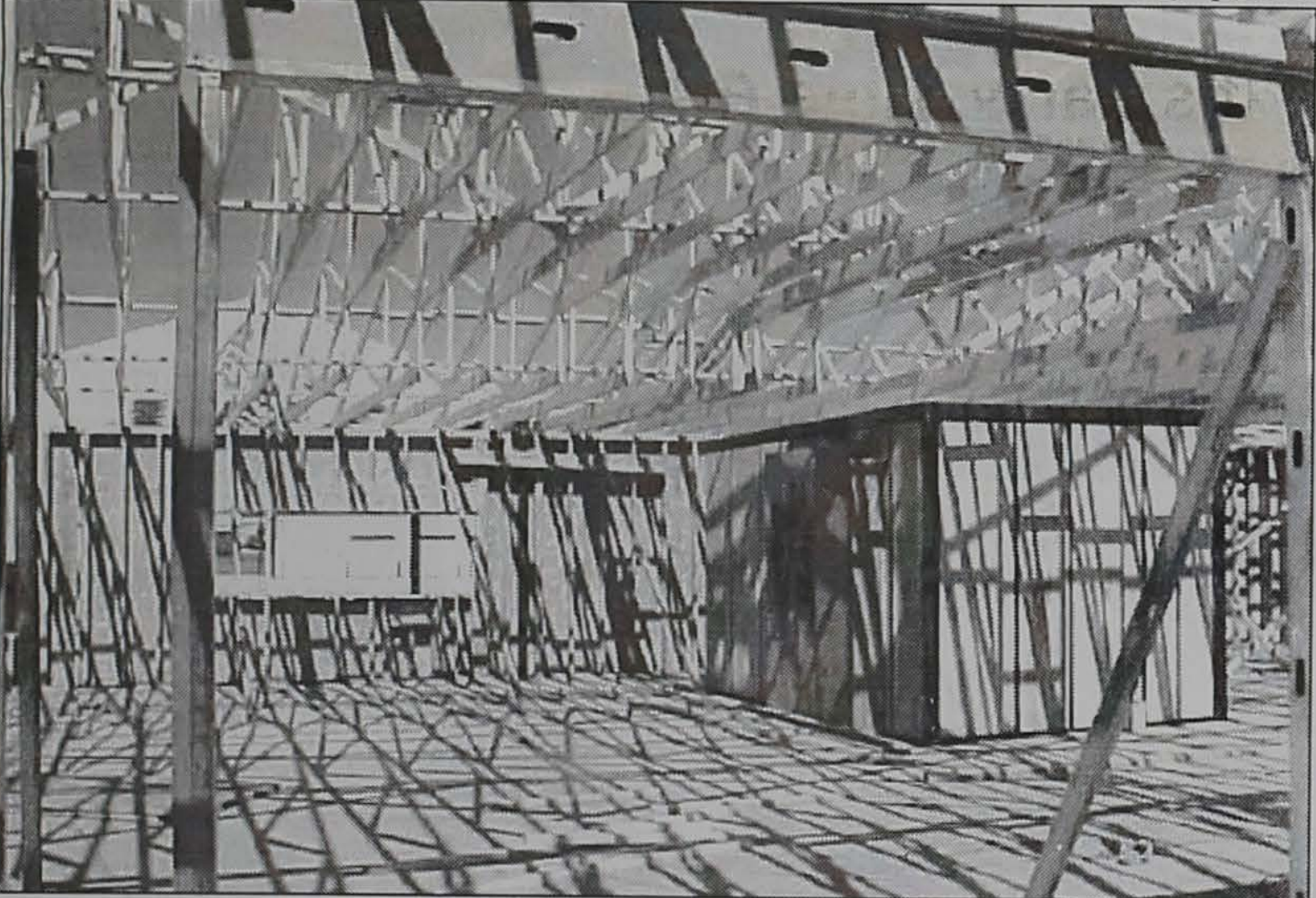

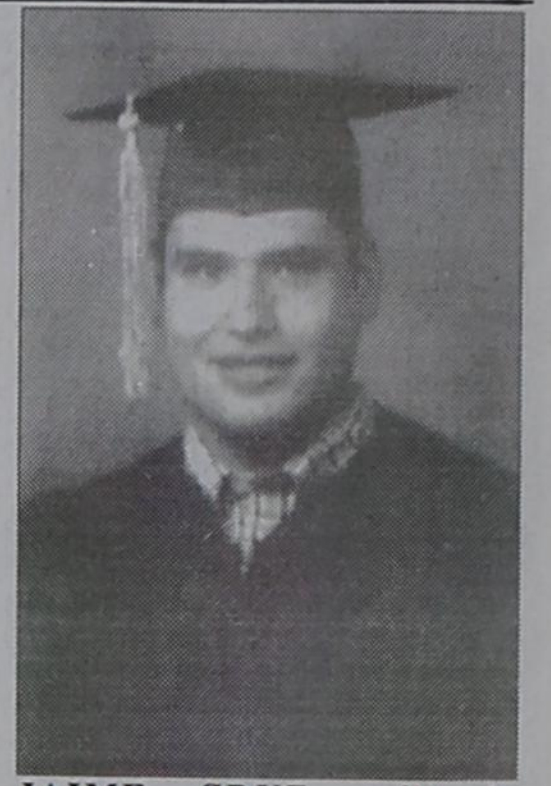

Betty said the Weavers saw the tornado coming and got in their car and drove out of town to miss it. After it had passed through, they returned to see that only two homes on their block had been spared-theirs and their neighbor's, Michael's father.

The Weavers' home suffered only roof, window and fence damage. They helped in the cleanup effort for their neighbors and friends this week and Betty said they were very grateful for their good fortune.

After the Thompsons saw the tornado on their T.V.,

they drove to Happy to check on their family because all the phone lines were down. She said she and Darell were very relieved to see them all safe.

Some Friona folks helped in the Happy tornado cleanup effort. Randy Campbell, owner of American Canvas, and his son and daughter-in-law, Bryan and Dana, drove to Happy Sunday night after the deadly tornado hit the town. They took portable generators with lights so rescue workers could see and truck tarps to cover the wreckage of people's homes.

I asked Randy if they knew someone who lived there and he said no. He said that after his experience with Friona's tornado back in 1995, he knew they would need help.

Although they all worked in the same area, the Thompsons, Weavers and Campbells never knew they shared a Friona connection.

Ruby Hassenpflug's son, Mel (Bud), of Prescott Valley, Arizona suffered a heart attack a couple of weeks ago. Ruby and her daughters, Anita Lyons of Hereford and Paula Wilson and Tamela Bandy of Friona flew to Phoenix to see Bud and his wife Cathy this weekend.

This was the first time for Ruby to fly anywhere and she said she was sure scared but once they were up in the air, she said it wasn't as frightening as she had anticipated.

While in Arizona they visited with Bud and Cathy's son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Doug and Andy Hassenpflug and their children Austin, Brandon and Caleb at their home in Phoenix. They also were able to see Ruby's niece Barbara Benson, who lives in the Phoenix area and Barbara's son and his family, Shawn and Ann Benson and their four children of Tempe.

Pfizer Animal Health sent a group of area Hi Pro employees to the Kentucky Derby last weekend. Attending from Friona were Bill and Marilyn Stovell and Eldon Reeb.

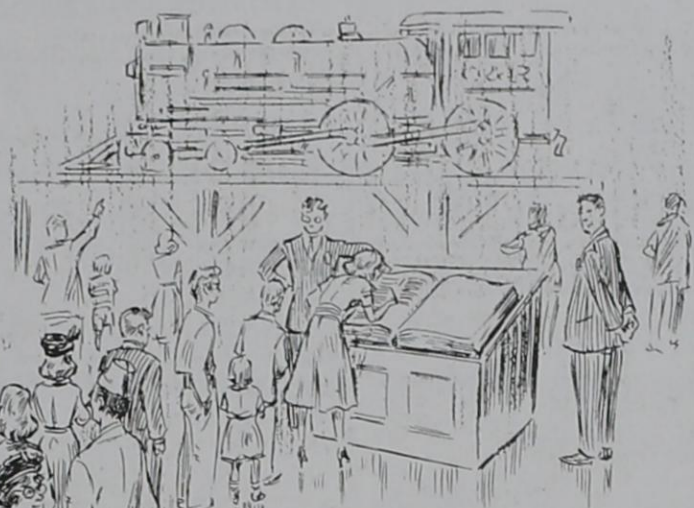

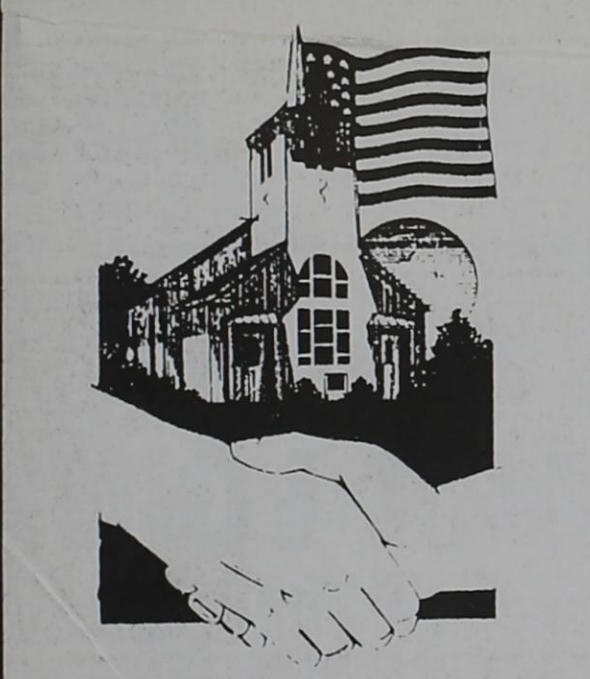

## Taking Care Of Your New Contact Lenses



Your eye care specialist will review the best way to wear your initial pair of contact lenses. First, your eyes must adapt to the changes. You will put your lenses in for about two hours for the first couple of days to get used to them. The wearing time will then increase by about two hours a day, until reaching eight hours of use.

Your eye care specialist will also discuss the proper handling of the lenses. All contacts can collect bacteria, dirt and dried eye secretions. The basic steps in contact lens care involve: • a cleaning solution to eliminate dirt, pollen and chemicals, • a rinsing solution to remove the cleaning solution, • a disinfecting solution to kill microorganisms on the lenses, • a rinsing solution to dispose of the disinfecting agents, • a neutralizing solution to stop the disinfectant, • weekly application of an enzyme solution to remove protein and lipids.

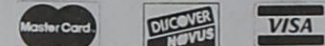
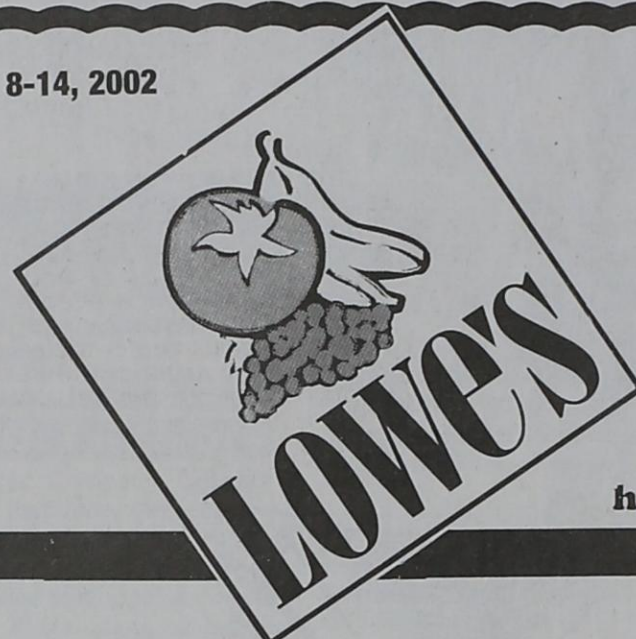
