## Wiseman to retire as junior high principal

After 31 years in education including 11 years coaching and 16 as junior high principal, Kevin Wiseman has decided to retire at the end of the current school year.

Mr. Wiseman is a Friona high school graduate. His three grown children are all FHS graduates and his wife Carolyn will continue as a teacher in the FISD.

"I'll be staying in Friona," Wiseman said, "and considering my options for a second career. It is just time for a change after 31 years."

Wiseman is the second principal to announce their retirement this year. Elementary school principal Becky Riethmayer announced her retirement earlier. Also Superintendent Jim Parker retired as of December 31, 2007. Kenny Austin has been serving as interim superintendent.

#### Lemon-roasted asparagus

- ¼ cup olive oil
- juice of one lemon
- 2 lbs asparagus, trimmed
- 1/2 head napa cabbage, cored and cut into 4 strips
- 1/4 cup reduced sodium soy sauce
- 2 tbsp light brown sugar 2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- juice of one orange
- 2 tbsp dry sherry or vermouth
- 1 tbsp peeled, minced fresh ginger
- 2 oranges, peeled and sectioned
- 2 tbsp chopped green onions
- 1. Preheat oven to 400
- 2. Combine oil and lemon juice in a bowl. Add asparagus and cabbage; toss to coat. Spread evenly in a baking pan. Roast about 10 minutes, turning once, until crisp-tender.
- 3. Combine soy sauce, brown sugar, vinegar, orange juice,
- sherry and ginger in a bowl; stir well. Add orange sections. 4. Arrange asparagus and cabbage on a platter and top with orange mixture. Garnish with green onions. Serves 6.

#### Don't get hit with a penalty! "Render" your taxable

A "rendition" is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on January 1st of this year.

#### Who must file a rendition?

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income - such as the inventory and equipment used by a business. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, a 10% to 50% penalty may be imposed.

#### Are there any advantages to you?

The advantages of filing a rendition are:

· You give your opinion of your property's value. The appraisal district must notify you in writing of any value to the appraisal review board.

- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- •You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2007 The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2008.

#### What's the deadline?

The last day for filing 2008 renditions is April 15. You can get an automatic extension to May 15 if you ask for it in writing on or before the April 15 deadline. The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after May 15 for an owner who shows good cause in writing.

### **HPUWCD** to meet April 8

At its April 8 board meeting, the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 in Lubbock will approve an order canceling the May 10, 2008 election in District Directors' Precincts Three and Four.

Incumbents Carroll Cook of Friona and Robert Meyer of Canyon were the only candidates to file an application for place on the ballot for Precinct Three District Director and Precinct Four District Director, respectively.

Under the Texas Election Code, the water district may cancel an election if the candidates whose names are to appear on the ballot are unopposed; there are no declared write-in candidates; and there is no proposition to appear on the ballot.

The Election Code also provides that the unopposed candidates be declared duly elected to their respective offices. This is Cook's second four-year term and Meyer's fourth four-year term.

Precinct Three includes Bailey County, the portion of Castro County within the district, and Parmer County. Precinct Four includes the portions of Armstrong, Deaf Smith, Potter, and Randall Counties within the district.
