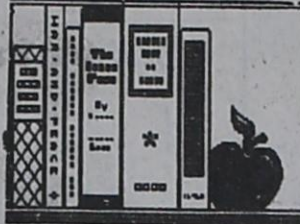

GRINDING IN THE NIGHT

An estimated one in 20 adults and three in 20 children unconsciously grind their teeth at night. It is the sound of bruxism. While the noise may disturb spouses or children, it has a far more distressing effect on the sleeper.

Nocturnal grinding can exert thousands of pounds of pressure per square inch on the surfaces of teeth. It can be rough not only on teeth but on the supporting bone, the gums and jaw joint.

For many years, bruxism was attributed to the release of tension from emotional stress. However, many dental authorities today believe that the causes exist in the patient's mouth.

Night grinding may be an unconscious effort to correct irregularities of the chewing surfaces of the teeth. Dentists term this a malocclusion. They grind away to eliminate a spot that is too high or to find a comfortable place to fit the upper and lower teeth together.

If you have this nightly grind problem, your first stop should be your dentist's office...before you do any serious damage to your teeth.

THE OLYMPICS

With all the excitement surrounding the Olympics in Atlanta, Georgia, it's hard to believe that the Games got their start as a simple footrace. The first Olympic Games began in Greece in 776 B.C., and were held every four years for over a thousand years, until 393 A.D.

The modern Olympics began in 1896, again in Greece. In attendance were 311 athletes from 13 countries. Contests were held in nine sports: cycling, fencing, gymnastics, swimming, tennis, track and field, wrestling, weight lifting and shooting.

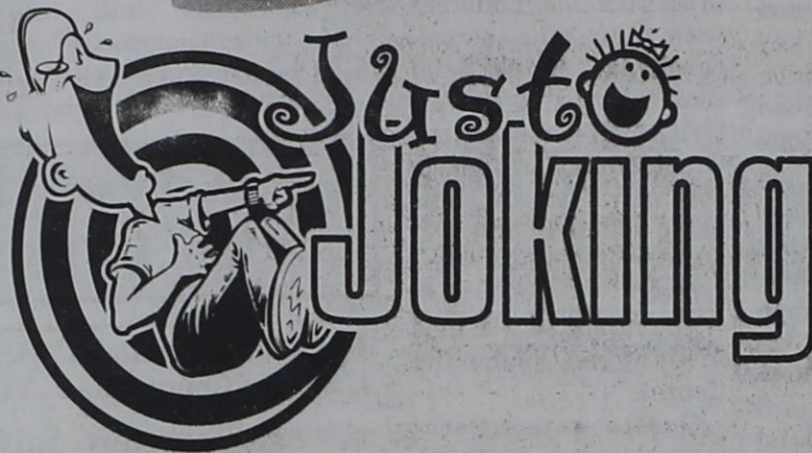

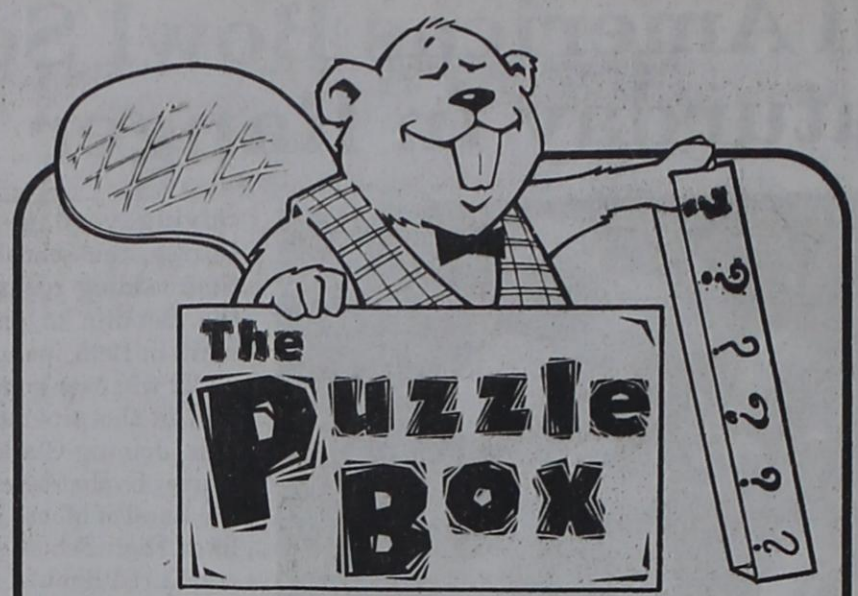

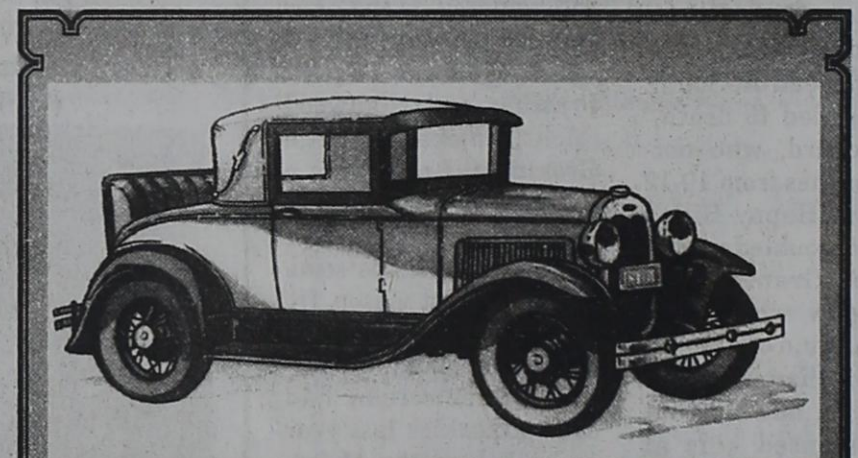

HENRY FORD

Henry Ford is one of the most important names in the history of both the automobile and American business. He was born in Dearborn, Michigan, in 1863. When Ford was young, he was interested in machines and fixing things. When he was 32 years old, he started building automobiles as a hobby. He started the Ford Motor Company in 1903 and introduced the Model T Ford in 1908. His company made millions of them.

Ford is sometimes called the "father of mass production." He knew that if his company could build a lot of cars at one time, instead of just one at a time, he could sell them for less money. As a result, more people could afford to own a car, and the company could make more money.

Henry Ford made this nation a "nation on wheels"—a country in which almost all families own automobiles.

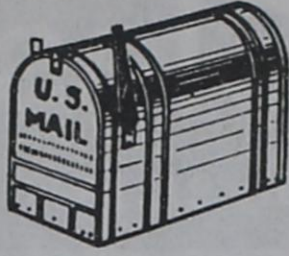
AMELIA EARHART

Amelia Earhart was the first woman to ever fly across the Atlantic Ocean alone. This happened in 1932, and it was a major event in the history of aviation. Three years later, she was the first person to fly from Hawaii to California alone. Her next goal was to fly around the world. She started that trip in Miami, Florida, leaving in June of 1937. About a month later she was flying toward a tiny island in the Pacific Ocean when her plane disappeared. No trace of the plane was ever found, and no one knows what happened to this brave woman.

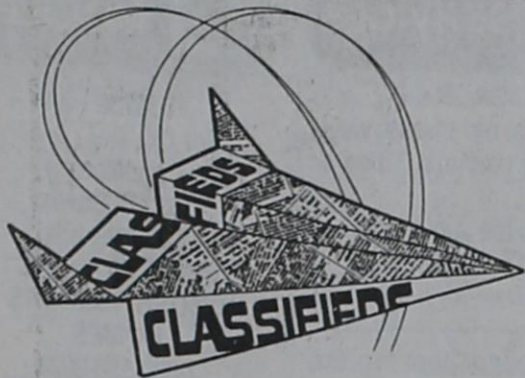
Amelia Earhart was born in 1898 in Kansas, where she was a teacher. She also wrote many books about her experiences with flying.





PUZZLING HEEL PAIN

Many people visit the podiatrist because of pain in a heel. Some relate the pain to a sudden injury, but others are clueless. By examining the foot and employing X-rays, the podiatrist diagnoses the problem. Sometimes it is an imperfect heel bone or a disorder such as arthritis. More often the problem lies in the fascia, a fibrous band of tissue which winds around the heel and extends to the forefoot. It helps to control the action of the arch.

Heel pain results when excessive stretching of the fascia leaves it irritated and inflamed at the heel bone. Factors inviting this condition include spending a lot of time on the feet, shoes with little cushioning and overweight. In typical cases the podiatrist subdues the inflammation and relieves pain with cortisone injections, oral medications and taping and padding the foot. Sometimes an orthotic shoe insert or physical therapy are employed to speed recovery.

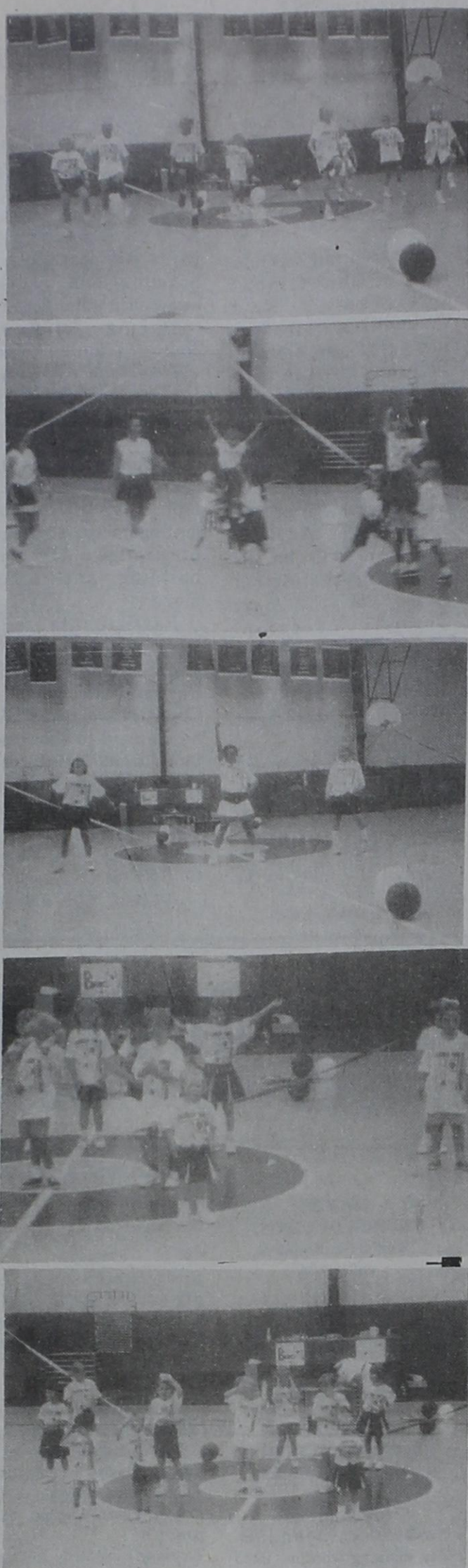

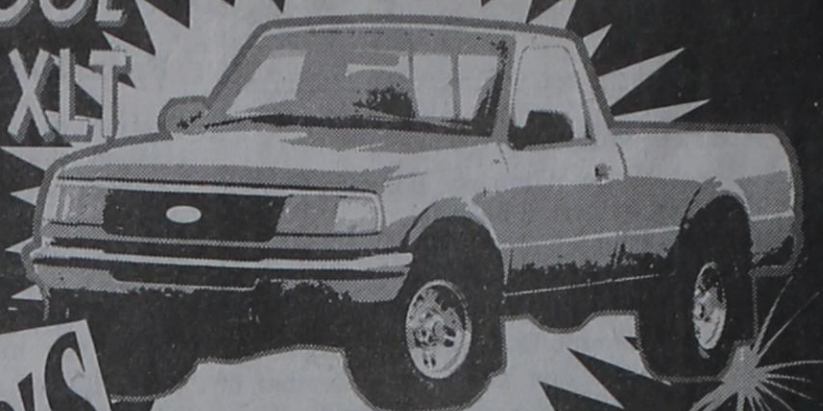
