
### Conservation workshop November 6 in Bovina

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District invite the public and any agencies with an interest in conservation issues to participate in a Local Work Group meeting to be held at the EMS building in Bovina. This meeting will be on November 6, 2008 at 9 a.m.

The purpose of this meeting is to receive input from a broad range of local agencies, organizations, businesses, and individuals that have an interest in natural resource conditions and needs in Parmer County. Input received will allow the Local Work Group to make recommendations on resource concerns to be addressed, eligible practices, and ranking for county based funding. These recommendations will be used in implementing the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) and other conservation programs offered by NRCS.

"Poor in spirit" literally means to "pour out self". We have to be emptied before we can be filled.




