## Friona ISD Announces Policy For Lunch Program

Friona Independent School District Food Service announced its policy for free and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay full prices for meals served under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program

Applications forms and a letter to parents/guardians will be sent home with every child. To apply for free or reduced price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to the school attended by the youngest child or for complete confidentiality, mail the application to Roxanne Hurst, Verifying Official, 909 E. $11^{\text {th }}$, Friona, TX. 79035. Application forms are available at each campus office.

The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program officials. An adult household member must sign the application.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal policy, only the Verifying Official will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the dissatisfied with the ruling official on an informal basis.

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. The school district strongly encourages everyone to fill one out and send it in. If a family qualifies for only reduced prices, it will significantly reduce the cost of meals. In the operation of the child-feeding program, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, DC, 20250.

Again, this year, we will be serving breakfast at no charge to all students in the Primary, Elementary and Jr. High buildings. We thank you for your support. Please do not hesitate to contact the Jr. High Cafeteria at 250-3353 if you need help completing your application.
