## Horrible Tragedy at Houston.

A wave of crime has recently spread over Houston; the latest of which is the most diabolical crime ever perpetrated. It occured in Houston Heights, a suberb of Houston, on Friday night March 11, when some fiend entered the home of Gus Schuitz and crushed out the life of Schultz, his wife and two babies, and Walter Eichman, a boarder.

The dead bodies of the victims were not discovered until the following Wednesday, as neighbors thought the people were out on a fishing expidition.

One man has been arrested and placed in jail, but the evidence against him is purely circumstantial, and not very strong. The only motive for the wholesale slaughter of the five victims is thought to be jealousy.

It is a horrible crime, and we hope the Houston officers will ferret out the mysteries of the murder and bring the guilty to justice.

In cold cash this means \$1012.80 turned loose among our farmers for eggs in less than a month. During Feb ruary 213 cases were shipped, and a better price was realized then than now. The Grapeland hens are doing their best to relieve the shortage in the egg market.
