## City Votes To Limit Landfill Dumping

at its regular meeting on Monday at its regular meeting on Monday
to close the City Landfill to all persons outside the city limits, in order to have more contro
what goes into the landfill. "Due to stringent requirem by the Department of Health, Protection Agency (EPA) going to have to know exactly what
comes into the landfill generated within the city limits will be accepted," said City Manager Beelee Goodwin.
It was explained that beginning in 1989, the EPA is really hitting
hard on cities' landfills. The EPA proposals are still in a "public comment time frame" at the present and are not officially mposed yet, but it is expected that the agency will begin monitoring
the landfills by mid-1989, when all of the new proposals are expected o be in effect.
In addition, Goodwin said that when the new laws take effect, here will be absolutely no open
burning at all, in town or out. At the present time, the city has a "burn permit" which allows it to the new rules take effect, they won't even ree able to do that. The city is looking into
purchasing a brush-clipper machine to help in disposing of limbs and brush.
Goodwin said
new rules were going to present
"unnecessary hardship" on some cities and counties, especially in been done, and where fewer people (population centers) are affected. "We're possibly in better shape than some cities, since we have of our trash. Some cities have been burning most of theirs," Goodwin
