## Cisco Delegation Gets Valuable Dairy Facts

### Bankers in Many Cities Tell How Cows Have Made Poor Customers Good Ones; Problems Discussed

EN ROUTE WITH CISCO DAIRYING CARAVAN, Aug. 27.—The Cisco party touring the dairy centers of Texas, continues to obtain much valuable information regarding proper dairy production and marketing which it is hoped to use when the farmers and farm experts return to their homes. Every member of the party is well, although some of the trips, especially that over to Austin to inspect the state capital, and eleemosynary institutions are very tiring. At Austin the party visited the state agricultural department, game, fish and oyster commission, State School Superintendent Marrs, and other officials.

At Temple, F. L. Downs, president of the First National bank told the delegation he always stresses the importance of each farmer having one or more cows and a number of chickens. The Dr. A. C. Scott dairy where \$75,000 to \$100,000 is invested, was visited. The dairy cattle were Jerseys and Holsteins. Of these, 118 are registered and 12 or 15 are grade stock. Only 75 of the cows are now milking, and the production averages 180 to 200 gallons a day. The best cow gave 13,500 pounds of milk at the age of 11 years, with 831 pounds of butter. Twenty-eight or 30 of the cows are registered of merit cows. The average price of the stock was \$150 to \$200 a head, with the best cow costing \$750. The dairy furnishes the Scott and White and Santa Fe hospitals and about one-third of the population of Temple on milk routes, with the milk bringing 18 cents a quart.

Some of the cows are milked three times a day, especially in the first year of lactation. At Taylor, the party were guests at lunch at the Blazimar hotel, complimentary from the Taylor chamber of commerce, of which S. M. Patterson is secretary. In addition to dairying information, it was learned that about 90 per cent of the cotton fields south of Waco are infested with root rot, 35 per cent of which is very serious. It was said that Taylor farmers used to produce and sell butter, but that they quit to go into the whole milk business which was less troublesome.

### Pictures of "Old Ironsides" On Sale Here Recall History Of Famous Old American Ship

Many thousands of visitors come annually to the Boston Navy Yard to see the famous old frigate Constitution. Her ancient bulwarks, muzzle loading 24 pounders with which she battered into submission the Tripolitan forts in 1804 and four British warships in the war of 1812, and her lofty spars and rigging are of perpetual interest contrasted as they are by the lines and batteries of the modern steel warships which keep her company from time to time at the Navy Yard. These visitors carry away with them a new appreciation of what Americans of an earlier and less secure day did upon the sea. The sight of this beautiful old ship instills a deeper reverence for the dignity and beauty of American ideals and for the Constitution of the United States, for which she was named.

A move is on foot to restore her to her original staunch condition, not for active service but as a memorial to the Freedom of the sea which she gained for the American people forever in 1812. It is planned to sail her into every important sea and inland port of the country after her restoration.

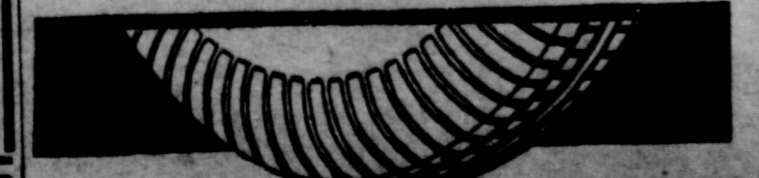

### CHESLEY GETS OIL WELL ON MORAN RANCH

MORAN, Aug. 27. — The Moody Corporation, et al, extended the Dyer oil field five miles to the east this week when their J. E. Chesley well began spraying oil Monday from a depth of 3870 feet. This is 21 feet deeper than the oil sand in the Dyer well was found, and the depth of the Dyer was 3849. Geologists estimated that the sand would be found on the Chesley at 3888 feet, and only missed it 15 feet.

About six million feet of gas is estimated to be flowing from the Chesley well. The drillers are drilling into the sand and it is believed that this well will make a splendid producer.

The Moody corporation has drilled about seven wells in that field, all of which made gas or oil wells except one. Three of the six made commercial gas wells. All of the gas in the field is very wet and is valuable for making gasoline and commercial gas. The Moody people began operation of their gasoline plant about two weeks ago and are now making gasoline and shipping from Pueblo. The gasoline plant is located on the Dyer lease, a short distance from the Dyer No. 1 well. A gas sand is found there at about 3000 feet, which is saved and is being used. The oil bearing sand is found about 200 feet deeper, and also has a strong gas pressure. The Chesley well is 11 miles east of Moran and 13 miles north of Cisco.

### MORAN SEEKS ESTIMATE FOR SEWER PLANT

MORAN, Aug. 27. — The city council of Moran has the Elrod Engineering Co. of Dallas checking up the estimate for the sewerage project in Moran this week. Surveyors are at work and will be able in a few days to give their estimate for sewerage system and disposal plant in Moran.

Last spring the Municipal Engineering Co., also of Dallas, surveyed the city for the proposed plant and were to finance the proposition and build the system. The city council and the Municipal Co. could not come to agreement and the city is having the estimate checked up and have an offer for financing and building the plant from Joe Wislett, of Dallas.

The proposition offered by Mr.

Wislett is similar to that offered by the Municipal Engineering Co. in that the company will build the plant, finance same and take the revenue from said plant for payment of the project. In this way the system can be built and bonds will not have to be voted. The com-

pany asks that some 200 residents of the city agree to connect with the system before they put down the sewage. Already about 150 have agreed to connect with the sewage system, and it is believed that the remainder of the required number will sign.

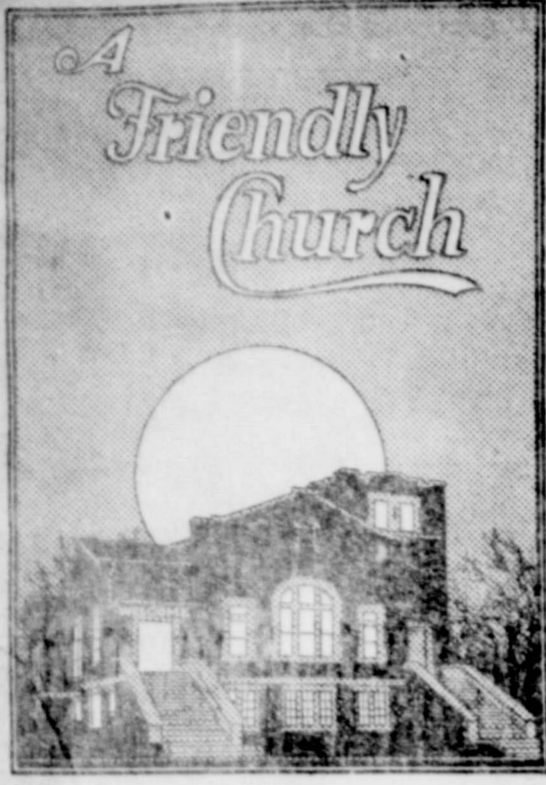
