AUSTIN, Aug. 31. - Plans for taking over the banking department Thursday were completed Wednesday by James Shaw, newly appointed state banking commissioner. Shaw was appointed by Governor Austin, whose term of office ex-

"In assuming the banking commissionership," said Shaw, "I do so with the full realization that the office is a very trying one and one that will require much thought and hard work. I am what is common ly called a 'country banker,' but 1 feel that my 25 years of actual bank ing will assist me very materially in solving the problems that will come up before me. I expect to look to leading bankers in the state for advice and assistance. It will be my earnest endeavor to surround my self mith a force that is efficient in every way, especially in so far as the bank examining force is con cerned. I have had experience with many bank chaminers, and I feel that I am competent to say some thing on that subject. A bank examiner must be competent in every way, or the banking repartment never knows the exact condition of the bank under examination. An examiner should be a man of good

Belief that the slayers of Sheriff Bob Smith and Deputy Sheriff Jake Owens of Fisher county passed through Cisco Tuesday night or early Wednesday morning was expressed Wednesday by Constable C. S. Looney, following recovery of an abandoned automobile of town. The car, a seven-passenger red Cadillac touring car, located about 10 c'clock. A card in one of the pockets of the bore the name of Ed C. Abbott of Lubbock. A felephone mes to the Lubbock man revealed the car was stolen Sunday night

Report from Strawn Wednesday was that a Chrysler coupe was stolen there. It belonged to Carlton Meredith of that place, and it was stolen during the night. It was also said that officers at Strawn gave chase to a car whose occupants attempted to steal gasoline from a filling station. The car escaped, however.

Constable Looney is working on the theory that the Fisher county slayers drove to Wichita Falls following the double murder of Saturday afternoon and when it was found impossible to cross Red River without detection from guards who watched over the river bridges, the slayers stole the red Cadillac, abandoning be Green Oldsmobile in which they escaped from the scene of the killby near Roby. The men are then believed to have abandoned the Calillar here and made their way to Strawn where the Chrysler was stole and then headed on toward Fort Worth. Since the car stolen at Strawn was only a coupe, it is believed possible that the wives of the two men, who escaped with them after the killings, may have been left in this vicinity while the men continued their flight.

#### FRANCO-GERMAN RECIPROCITY

A remarkable agreement was signed recently between Germany and France, and will go into effect September 6. It is a commercial treaty which modifies the tariffs of the two countries on a "most favored nation" basis, with a large amount of reciprocity. "By this treaty," it is explained in Paris dispatches, France will get better terms on agricultural pro-

acts, textiles, shoes, machinery, toilet articles and porcelain, while Germany benefits on chemicals, machinery, electrical goods, cement, faience and leath-Altogether several thousand articles are affected. One highly prized concession won by France is permission to export wines to Germany on favorable terms. And Germany gets a fair return for that in lowered tariffs on chemicals and other things. 




