According to McCasland, it takes seven minutes to load a dry fertilizer truck and fifteen minutes to load a liquid fertilizer truck. All weighing, billing and loading is controlled by computers.

"Efficiency and safety are our paramount concern at CHS," McCasland said. "'Shut everything down' is the order if there is ever any danger."

The Friona CHS grain plant is fifteen years old and employs seven to ten people. The Friona plant is the most efficient of all the CHS plants.

CHS is a worldwide company and is a Fortune 100 Company. The headquarters are in Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota.

Bell said there were also significant differences in quality between varieties.

"We evaluated crude protein, acid detergent fiber, neutral detergent fiber, lignin, starch, neutral detergent fiber digestibility and relative feed quality," she said. "In general, the brown midrib varieties had the greatest digestibility and crude protein values, while the photoperiod-sensitive varieties tended to be lower quality and the others in between."

Bell said because the photoperiod-sensitive varieties remain in the vegetative stage of development longer, average yields were greatest; however, lignin was greater and digestibility was lower, which is reflected in lower relative feed quality scores.

McCollum said in the 2014 trials, as in previous years, there was a great deal of overlap in quality among these different genetic types, "so comparing actual trial data for




