

"When I came to Friona three years ago, I was impressed by how bright and how polite the students were," stated Langford. "My office is open to all students and I have learned that one of the most important parts of my job is to listen."


Langford sees students at the alternative school in single and group therapy. She sees young people who need anger management methods.

This year she is working with 86 seniors and their parents to prepare them for future plans.

"I ask, 'What do you want to do? What do you want to be?"", Langford explained. "Then go and research and get information and find where to go and get what they need. And they do! Then we can find scholarships and get help if they want it or need it."

After many years of counseling she has learned that kids like it straight and honest. Students want it to the point. "I do that" stated Langford.

Langford has been a basketball, track and volleyball coach as well as an English teacher. She was previously an educational diagnostician but her 'love' is counseling.





Last Wednesday, one of my teenagers at Community Bible Study told me that she and her youth group are studying "Christian Atheist." After pondering that title for several seconds, I asked her what the study is about. She told me it is about people who say they are a Christian, but the life they lead does not reflect the life of a Christian.

We all know people who profess to be a Christian, and they act one way inside the walls of the church, and then lead a completely different life outside the church. Feller knew a girl in high school in Arizona who was like this. She was in church every time the doors were open; but, as soon as she got outside, she lived a life that was definitely on the wild side. So, why does it matter how we act in or out of the church?

Whether we like it or not, people are constantly watching us, and God is watching us all the time, even when we are alone. What we do or say can turn someone to Jesus, or away from Him. People are looking for excuses to not go to church or have anything to do with God. We don't need to live our lives in such a way that gives them more excuses for turning away from God.

Living as a Christian is not always easy, but it is as simple as A-B-C:

A--Ask the Holy Spirit to control your mind, your mouth, and your motives.

B--Bible--Immerse yourself in the greatest guidebook for how to live life.

C--Choose to conduct your life in a way that is pleasing to God, and then do it!

God doesn't have a list of Christian atheists in Heaven. If He did, and my name was on that list, it would mean that I wasn't living my life as the person He created me to be. It would mean that I am living a lie, claiming to be one person, and living the life of another.

The world needs people who are willing to be honest and real; people who are comfortable with who God has created them to be; and people who live out their faith in God and His Word. The world needs strong, bold, God-fearing Christians, not Christian atheists. It isn't easy to be a Christian 100% of the time, but it is as simple as A-B-C! Take care and have a great week!

## **Fearless Fear**

In 2 Kings 17:24-41 the Bible mentions a people having a fearless fear of God. They were the people brought in by Assyria to resettle the northern nation of Israel after Israel's defeat and deportation. When the foreigners first arrived to their new home God sent lions to attack them because "they tropical fruit, milk did not fear the Lord," which soon translated into them learning to fear the Lord enough to keep the lions from coming. After describing their rampant idolatry and religious pluralism verse 33 says, "they feared the Lord but also served their own gods...", then the very next verse says the people "do not fear the Lord." Is that a Bible contradiction? Can the people fear the Lord, milk and not fear the Lord at the same time? Actually they can, since they had a fearless fear. They feared the Lord to the point that He wouldn't punish them, but they did not fear the Lord in a way that led to walking in His statutes and ways, which is exactly how verses 33-34 use the terms in context. This is very similar to James in the NT falking about someone who believes in God, but is lost because they do not having saving faith. This is tragic that the people had a fearless fear of God, yet no personal relationship with Him, but in reality this is a massive problem today as people claim to believe in Jesus, yet their life is unchanged by Him because they refuse to repent of their sin and follow Him.


