

Fires are started deliberately in the belief that they will improve the soil and destroy insects. It is an old, wasteful Indian custom. The Indian would burn, then plant. That does serve to remove brush and weeds, and kills some insects. But it also kills saplings, burns out the humus of the soil, and prevents the natural reforesting of the timber land. Saplings, especially of valuable trees, seldom survive a brush fire. Wild flowers and other desirable plants are destroyed. It would be a blessing if owners everywhere could learn this lesson.
