### City council agenda for Monday

The Friona city council meets each month on the second Monday, except October when the second Monday is a Columbus Day holiday. So the October council meeting is scheduled for Monday October 5 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

The city provides us with a copy of the tentative agenda the week before the meeting. The agenda for the October meeting looks to be fairly brief. The final agenda is posted in the front window at city hall 72 hours prior to each meeting.

On the agenda for Monday, the annual resolution designating the Friona Star as the city's official newspaper will be considered for action. Another item, consider and take action on re-appointment of members to the Friona Economic Development Corporation board of directors.

A departmental report from the Friona police department will be heard and municipal judge Deborah Campbell will give a report on her duties and responsibilities.

The last items on the agenda will include consideration and action on accounts payable, the September financial statement, and the quarterly financial statement ending September 30, 2015.

Council members are Mayor Rick White, Alan Monroe, Martha Barker, Bruce Fleming, Nancy Davis, and Greg Lewellen. City manager is Patricia Phipps and Rosa Mendez is deputy city secretary. City attorney is Slater Elza of the Underwood Law Firm in Amarillo.



Larry Johnston, Parmer County Auditor, spoke to the group of twenty Lions and guests.

"Many people think that the office of County Auditor is an elective office," Johnston explained. "I am appointed by the 287th District Judge Gordon Green to a two year terms. I was appointed to my second term of two years this September."

"By law, Texas Counties with a population of 10,250 or more must have a County Auditor. Parker County has a population over 10,250 and, for the first time in 100 years, a County Auditor was appointed," Johnston told the group.

"It is an interesting position. I am responsible for financial oversight, for setting budgets for all county offices, including setting salaries. Then the County Commissioners vote on the budget as presented," he said.
