centages of the grain, determin Per cent of moisture in the shelled grain at harvest determines whether the grain can be
marketed immediately, or must be dried. No entry had grain with less than $13 \%$ moisture, safe for storage, or below 14\%,
maximum for No. 1 grade corn. Aad grain with moisture less that $15.5 \%$, maximum for No. 2
grade corn, while grain of several entries had more than $23 \%$
moisture, maximumall No. 5 grade corn The rains, $2.55^{\prime \prime}$ from September 23 , to 28 , undoubtedly contributed to the high
