The Hitler of the Old Testament

In recent history we know the horrors of evil men like Hitler, Stalin or Kim Jong-il, but can you imagine if one such evil ruler was in power for 55 years? The Hitler of the Old Testament is an evil man named Manasseh, who not only holds the title for doing "evil in the sight of the Lord," but also that he did "more evil than that nations had done whom the Lord destroyed before the people of Israel," (2 Kings 21). As you look at his miserable, 55-year reign from 2 Kings 21 notice a few things.

First, notice the amazing opportunity that the Lord gave him. His dad was a godly king who led the nation in following God in a profound way, and Manasseh became king at twelve years old. He had an amazing opportunity to do great things for God with His life, as do you, but sadly he squandered what God had given him.

Next, notice his sinful impact. His sin led the nation in worshipping idols of all kinds, practicing false and demonic spirituality, and even using the temple complex as a place where idolatry was rampant. He promoted and propagated sin in all areas of the nation, but it wasn't enough just to promote sin, he also sought to silence those who spoke out against it. In fact, it is believed that Manasseh had the great prophet Isaiah sawn in two, as he persecuted the righteous relentlessly. Your impact on this earth isn't neutral, it is for good or evil.

Finally, though, notice God's verdict on evil Manasseh. God pronounced judgment on him and the nation because they broke covenant with God. It was not a slap on the wrist, but an impending doom upon those ignoring God, which is also true of those who sadly reject the Lord and walk down their own path.





If anyone did deny Christ last week, let us all pray for them. For whatever reason, they did something they didn't want to do, and something we should never want to do, deny Christ.


