Have you noticed this? Every time a player does something positive, like score a TD, make a tackle, or kick a field goal, his teammates crowd around and smack him on the helmet. No wonder concussions have become an issue in the NFL.

In counseling players about showboating in the end zone, Coach Bear Bryant (or Coach Vince Lombardi) was quoted as saying: "When you get into the end zone act like you have been there before."

Still good advice.

Two Kinds of Builders **BRETT HOYLE, Pastor, First Baptist Church**

What are you building your life upon? Although we would suggest that there are thousands of categories with which we could answer this question, Jesus said there were only two kinds of builders, the wise and foolish. He lays out the difference in His parable of the wise and foolish builder in Matthew 7:24-27. At the outset of this passage, Jesus says, "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

Notice that the key to building your life wisely is hearing Christ's words, and doing them. We are to be hearers and doers of the word (James 1:22). If you are to be a hearer of the Word, then you are reading the scripture, joining in regular Bible study, and sitting under biblical preaching. As you move from hearing to doing, it is a matter of loving the Lord with all you are and obeying Him each day as He leads you by His Word and Spirit. When you build wisely on the Lord, you are building for eternity and impacting generations of those around you and in your family.

Unfortunately, though, the foolish builder simply does the opposite. He may hear Christ's words, but simply does not do them. He may outright reject Christ, or he may ignore Him, but in the end he is a foolish builder because he chooses his way and not the Lord's.



NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF **ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS**

Parmer County Appraisal District-Under a new law, chief appraisers of county appraisal districts, appraisal districts, and appraisal review boards may communicate electronically through email or other methods with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically in place of mailing.

How does it work? Certain guidelines must be followed for this local option communication:

-- Written agreements with the county appraisal district must be entered first, ensuring what electronic means of delivery are acceptable. If you are interested in receiving communications in electronic format, you should contact your local appraisal district.

-- Public notice regarding the availability of agreement forms authorizing electronic communications may be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the district on or before February 1 each year, or agreement forms may be delivered on or before February 1 each year to property owners shown on the certified appraisal roll for the preceding tax year.


-- The chief appraiser may determine the medium, format, content and method to be used for electronic communications other than notices required by Section 25.19 of the Tax Code, which are prescribed by Comptroller rule.

-- A decision by the chief appraiser not to enter into agreements may not be the subject of an appraisal review board protest, a lawsuit or a complaint to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
