## Commissioners implement burn ban

In Monday's regular meeting the Parmer County commissioners declared a county burn ban in effect for 90 days. The ban was effective at midnight Monday July 25.

Exceptions to the burn ban are agricultural or incinerator burning only when the wind is less than 10 mph and the humidity is 25% or more. In addition, the fire department and Sheriff's office must be notified in advance of burning.

Citations can be issued to those who do not comply with the burn ban rules. For any information contact County Judge Trey Ellis at 806-481-3383 or the Sheriff's office at 806-481-3303. In case of any rain the county judge has the discretion to lift the burn ban. For now the burn ban is in effect for 90 days.

In other business the commissioners approved the quarterly treasurer's report. The report is included in this issue of the Star. They approved the use of forfeiture funds by the district attorney to purchase and install new video and audio equipment in the district courtroom. A new big screen TV is installed near the jury box and Wi-Fi has been installed along with new speakers and cameras.

A request for assisting with funding for a four county regional crisis center was tabled until next meeting since the requestor was unable to attend this week. A discussion on an Ag Extension supplement and benefit package was also tabled. Continuing education hours for Precinct 3 Justice of the Peace Pam Haseloff was approved.

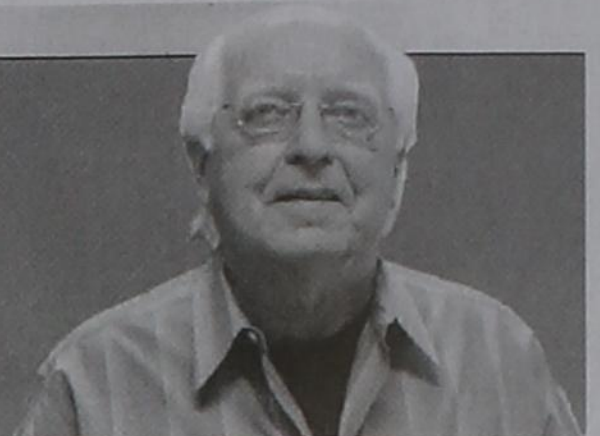

## the best thing on your worst day

We live in a small town. When the LifeStar helicopter comes in to land at the PMC helipad, as it often does, it can be heard all over town. The buzz begins about who is the helicopter here for. When it is parked at PMC a few people usually drive by for a look.

On a few occasions the LifeStar copter has been brought in for display. It is very popular with kids and adults too. The crew is happy to answer questions and let us have a peek inside.

The current rate for an emergency ride to an Amarillo hospital is \$38,000. In the event of a serious accident or illness we don't stop to think about the cost. Saving a life does not have a price tag. Until later when you get the bill.

If you have health insurance how much of the \$38,000 will it cover? Chances are you don't know. Have to go read the policy to find

out. None of us know, day-to-day, when accident or illness might occur. We have a fine hospital and staff here at Parmer Medical Center. Yet there are serious situations they cannot treat so they request our local EMS or LifeStar to transfer you to BSA or NWT in Amarillo. Or maybe to Covenant or UMC in Lubbock via AeroCare.

The AirMedCare Network can help. Their brochure says, "The BEST THING to happen on the worst day of your life." It is a membership program, not insurance. Yet it works like insurance.

James Edgar, the local membership sales manager, spoke to the city council at their last meeting. He came by to visit me here at the Star office. I already have the plan. Signed up several months ago for three years. Cost me \$185.

The plan's regular cost is \$65 per year and covers you



and your immediate household members. Not \$65 per person, \$65 for you and the spouse and kids if they still live at home. Grandma too if she lives with you.

Here is a bit of good news. Mr. Edgar has arranged with the city and the Chamber of Commerce to offer a \$55

rate for one year, \$165 for three years, and \$275 for five years.

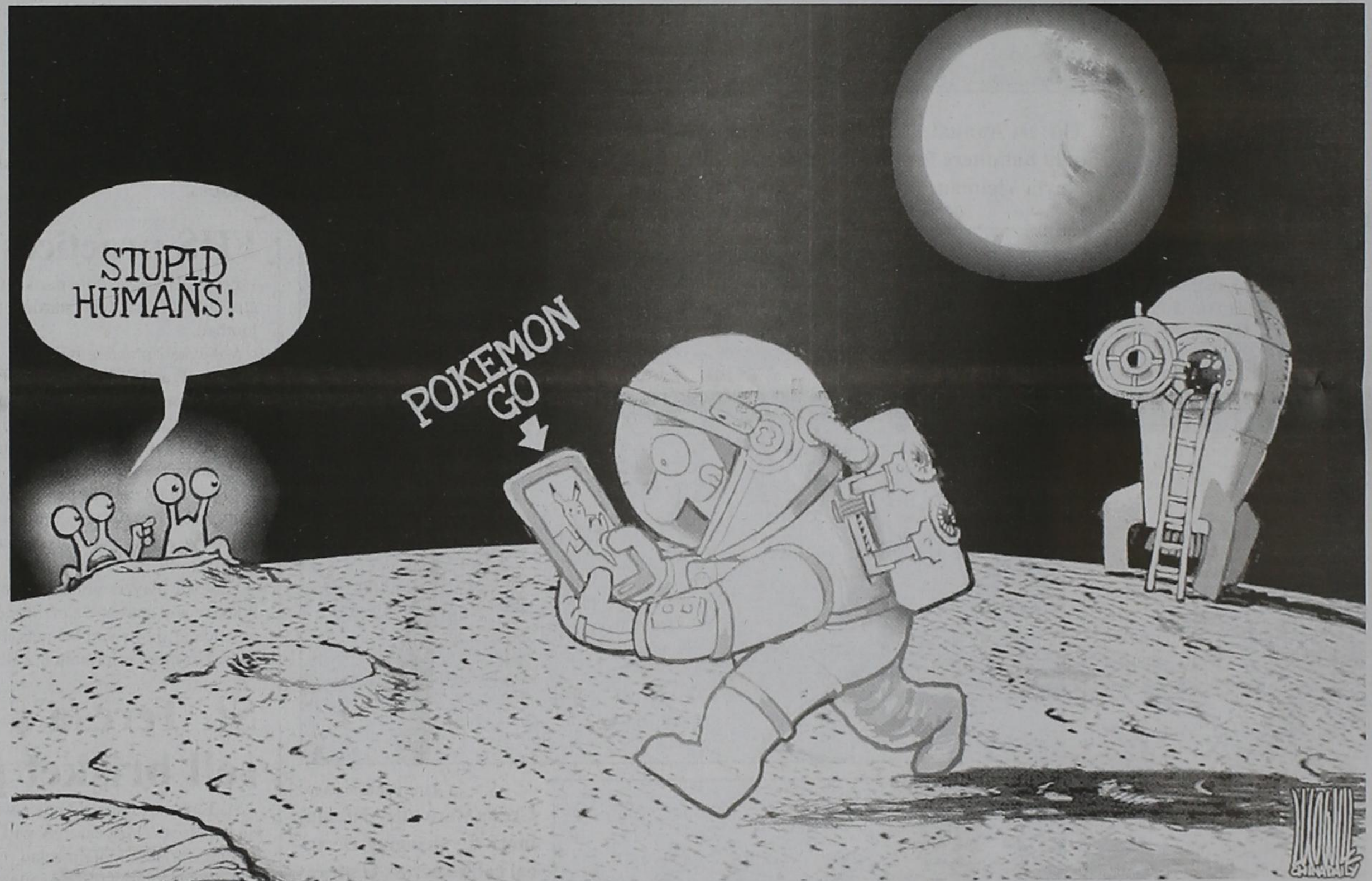
This rate applies to residents who live in Friona and are city utility customers. The plan pays for medical air transfer for those covered. There are a couple of restrictions such as they pay what

your insurance does not pay. If you don't live in town you can still sign-up at the regular rate of \$65, \$185, etc. It is a bargains either way.

You will receive membership cards and "member" window decals like the one shown here. Mr. Edgar said the window decal on your vehicle alerts first responders you are covered and they can order LifeStar from the scene in event of a vehicle accident.

Another plus, the plan network includes 32 states so you are covered when traveling in other areas. There is a special application for the \$55 rate. We have a few applications here at the Star office as well as at the city, Chamber of Commerce, PMC, and I believe Bi-Wize.

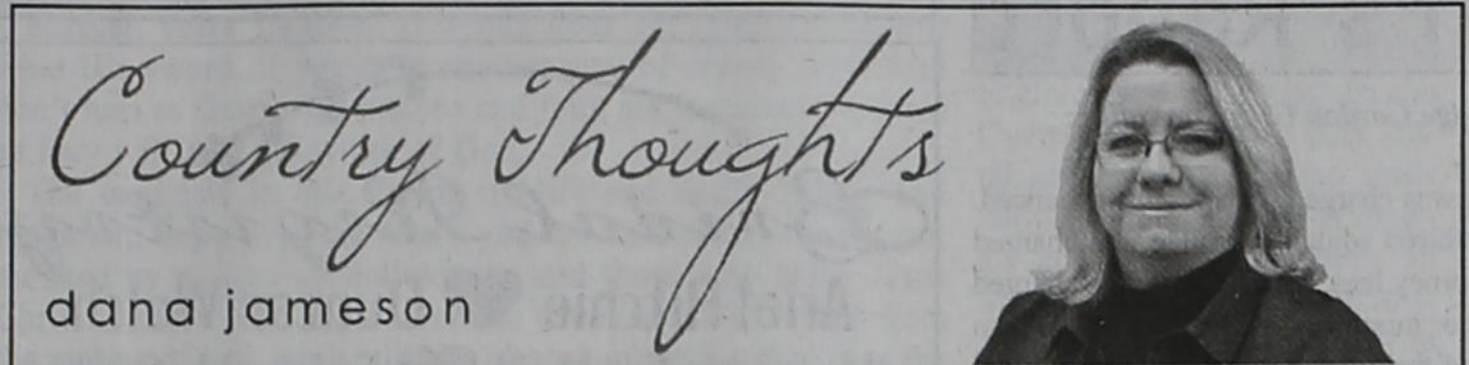

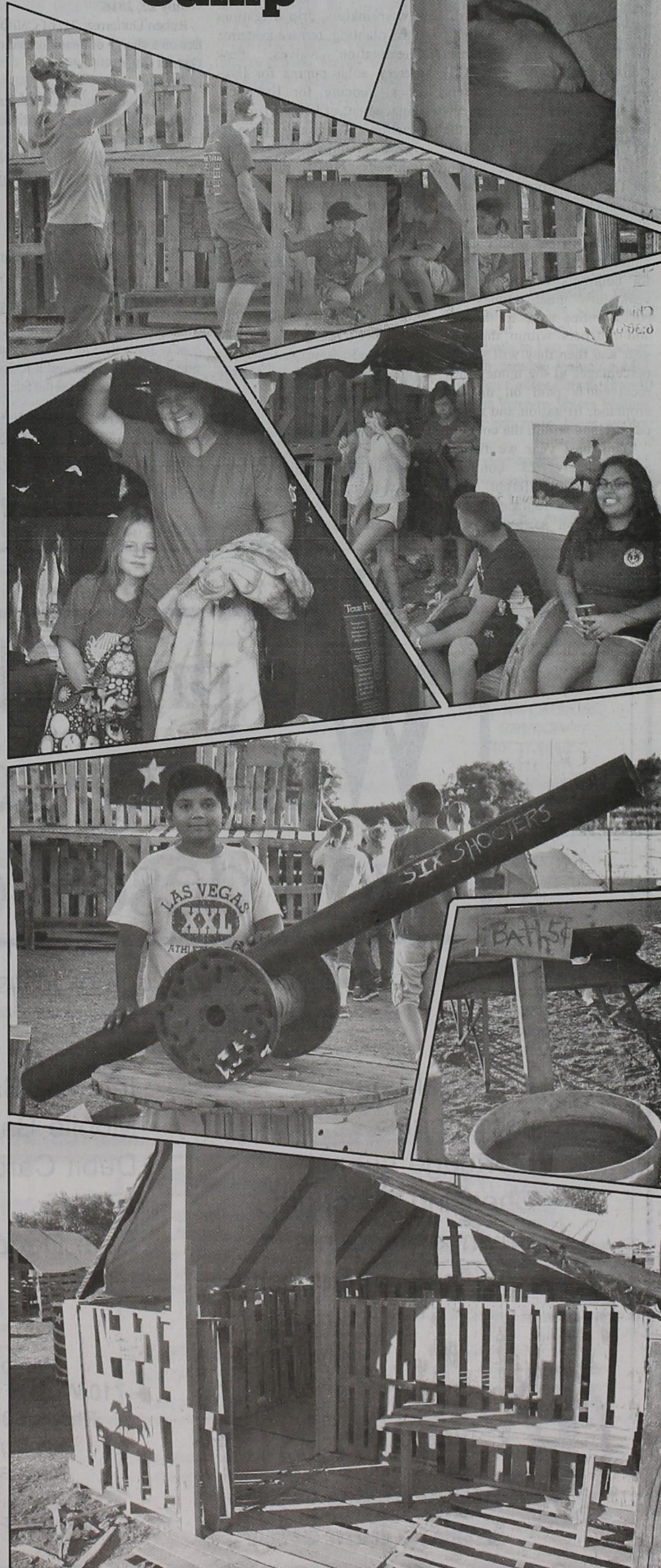
Those schedules also made it extremely clear that the next few months are going to be really busy and filled with many highs and hopefully only a few lows.

\*Two indictments of four counts each against Emmett Tabor, former mayor of Bovina, were returned by Parmer County Jury following a Monday session.

A shortage of \$13,055.21 was found in City of Bovina

funds following his resignation as Mayor in February. He was charged with felony theft following his resignation.

Each of the indictments charged Tabor with theft, embezzlement, forgery and passing, according to Hugh Moseley, county clerk.

\*Four Friona firemen attended a special school for firemen at College Station this week. The quartet included Fire Chief Ralph Shirley, Clyde Fields, Glenn Reeve, Jr., and J.C. Blankenship.

## Psalms 7-Conditional Refuge

God is a refuge for all who would run to Him. God is a rock you can lean on, a fortress and shield to protect from trouble, yet, these promises of protection and care are conditional, not automatic for everyone, everywhere.

In fact, Psalm 7 is a psalm of contrasts that makes this clear. On one side, humble David is seeking refuge in the Lord as his enemies close in on him. During such trials and danger David runs to the Lord and takes refuge in the reality that God is a refuge for all who are oppressed because He is also the righteous judge.

In fact, God is a refuge for those who run to Him, but God is a wrathful judge for those who do not repent.

In fact, verse 11 tells us the Lord "feels indignation every day."

Further, verse 12 says "If a man does not repent, God will whet His sword..." which is another way of saying those who don't turn to God in repentance and faith are in massive trouble as they will face the wrath of God.

The contrasts in this Psalm are life and death, refuge and judgment, depending on where you are with God. God is not mocked by nations or individuals, and those who know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior can experience His refuge from the storms of life, while all who choose otherwise will face the full force of God's indignation against sin.

## God Shapes Everyone

Last week, I wrote about praising God for people who have hurt you, and how He is using them to shape your life. While writing last week's column, God simply said to forgive them because they didn't know what they were doing.

Upon further reflection, I have come to realize that sometimes people really didn't know what they are doing. I believe people sometimes intentionally do/say things to hurt others; other times, I don't think they know better. Maybe they haven't been reared knowing how to treat others; maybe they are so consumed with their worlds they don't care or take the time to consider others.

Sometimes all we can do is what Jesus did on the cross and ask His Father to forgive them, because they really and truly didn't know what they were doing. In so doing, God is shaping us more into the likeness of His Son. And, just as God is using those who hurt us to shape us, He is using us to shape to shape them.

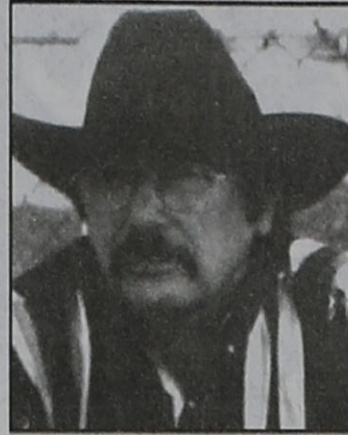
### Jose Angel "Bebe" Guerra

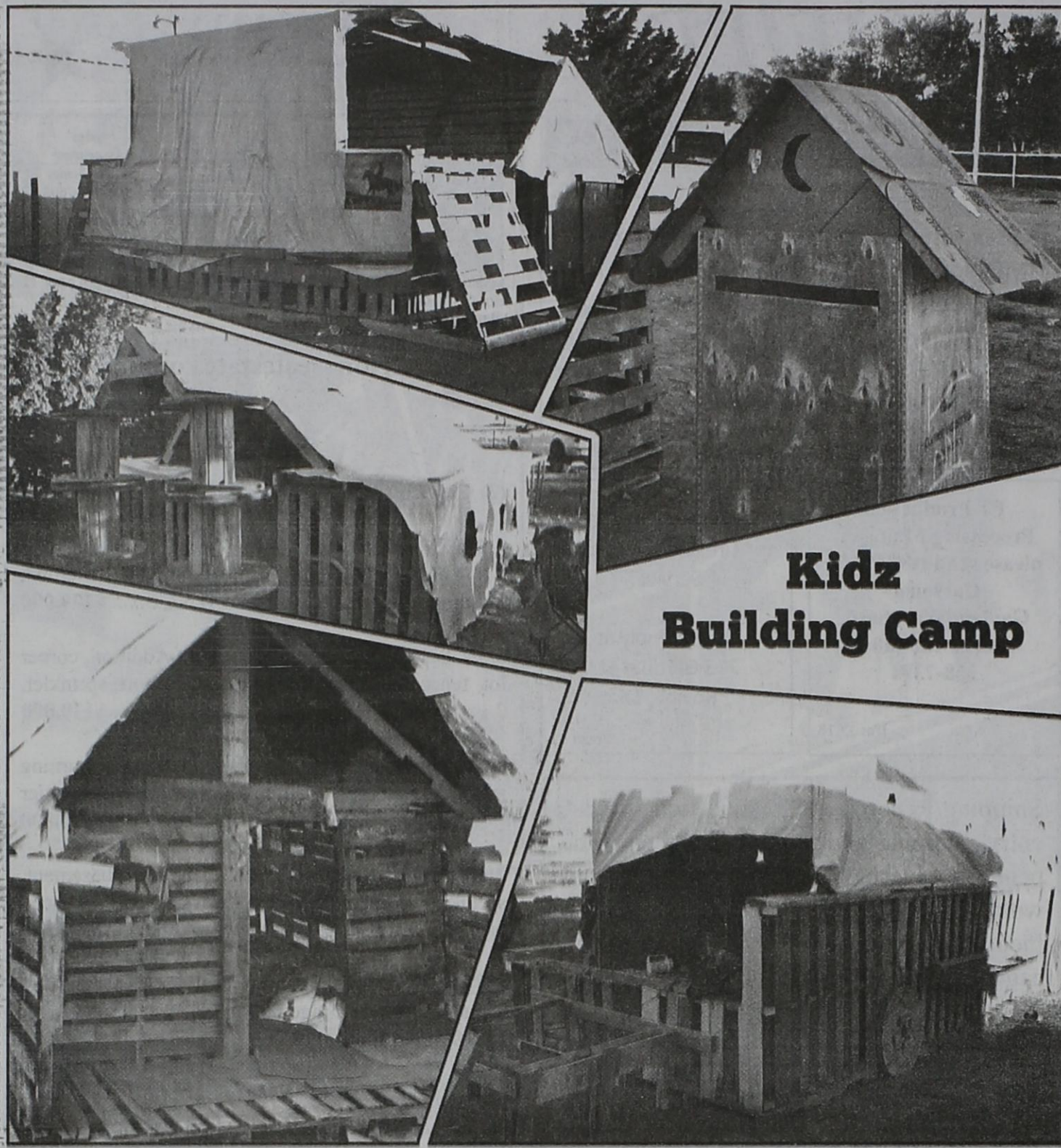

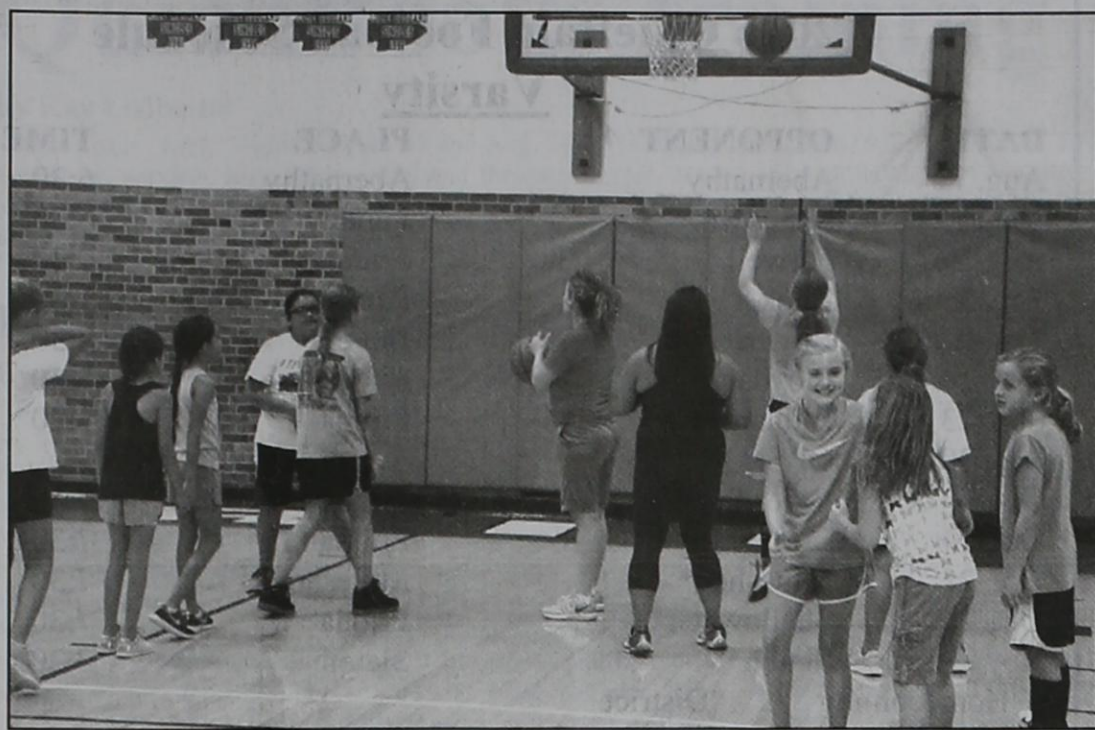

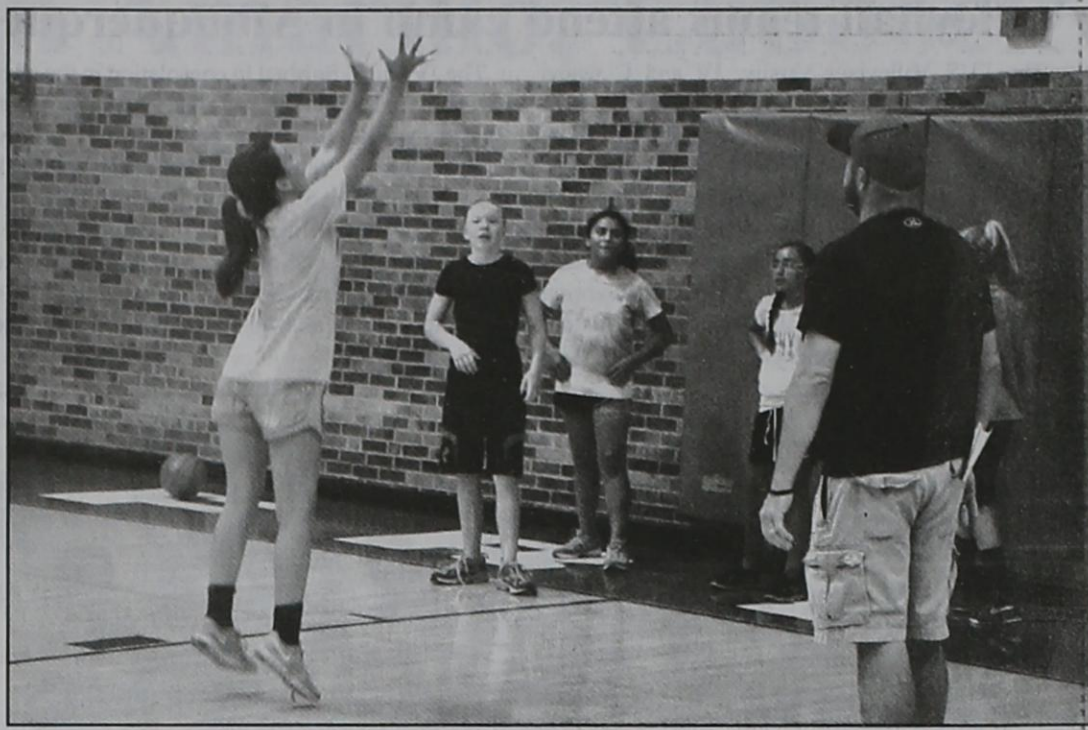

# QuickBooks training in Amarillo, Lubbock

The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will offer the Panhandle District QuickBooks Pro Short Course Aug.

24-25 and Aug. 29-30 in Amarillo, and then again Sept. 8-9 in Lubbock.

The two-day trainings will

run from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day at the respective Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Centers, located

at 6500 W. Amarillo Blvd. in Amarillo and 1102 E. Farm-to-Market Road 1294 north of Lubbock.

Sparse pastures can force hungry livestock to eat toxic plants. To help producers manage their land properly, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct a pasture and poison plant management workshop Aug. 15 in Lubbock.

The free educational program, which starts at 6:30 p.m., will be in The Bank Lobby located at 916 Main St., said Robert Scott,

AgriLife Extension agriculture and natural resources agent in Lubbock County.

"We've had a few cases of weed toxicity and I've noticed some toxic weeds in the county," Scott said. "With the pastures burning up in this summer heat, toxic weeds will be more evident as more desirable forage is eaten, so livestock will be more likely to feed on them.

"Our speaker will be Dr. Tim Steffens, AgriLife Extension rangeland resource management specialist at West Texas A&M University. And as the workshop's name implies, he'll speak on poison plant management and pasture management."

## Wildfire threat increases amid hot, arid conditions

New growth from spring and early summer rains are causing wildfire concern as summer heat and dry conditions have turned much of Texas into a tinderbox.

Dr. Andy Vestal, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service director for emergency management programs at Texas A&M University in College Station, said spring and early summer rains did wonders for producers around much of the state to promote significant growth of range grasses and other plants. However, the normal mid-summer dry down has accelerated statewide since July 1, especially with 100-degree temperatures in most regions.

The drying effect has left forages, grasses and woody material on the ground as potential fuel for wildfires, he said.

"The potential for these to be ignited by dry lightning or a spark from outdoor work, such as welding, or by someone who didn't take the proper precautions with a burn pile or while grilling, is something people need to be aware of," Vestal said. "It can be especially dangerous when this dry situation is combined with elevated wind velocity."

Landowners should be aware of and adhere to local regulations on outdoor burning and prescribed fire planning, Vestal said. County commissioners implement burn bans as appropriate based on information they gather from the Texas A&M Forest Service, local fire officials and weather conditions.

The Texas A&M Forest Service Outdoor Burn Ban map showed 87 counties had implemented bans. The Forest

Service's July 25 Fire Danger Forecast showed most of the state with a moderate level of danger. The El Paso area in West Texas and a few counties in the Rio Grande Valley were under a "high" fire potential forecast, with a very small area in that region under a "very high" level.

Vestal said conditions are expected to worsen throughout the summer and may last for some time as forecasts for the state are calling for a change in weather patterns that will bring less precipitation than the previous 12 months.


Vestal's rule of thumb, when a burn ban is not in effect, is to ignite debris for a controlled burn of brush or debris during the pre-dawn and early morning hours to avoid winds and utilize remaining dew moisture as

another level of control. Fires should never be left unattended, and landowners should always have available water or fire-fighting tools to maintain and control the spread of flames.

"When conditions are dry and winds are elevated there is no doubt a single spark could ignite a wildfire situation," he said.

Vestal said the Texas A&M Forest Service's Wildfire Risk Assessment Portal, <https://www.texaswildfirerisk.com>, is a good resource when planning outdoor burns or to check on potential wildfire conditions in various regions. The site also gives tips and recommendations on everything from proactively landscaping to protect structures from wildfires to proper ways to a controlled fire and how to be ready in case flames spread.

The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. **The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.** After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

After the technical review is complete the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If only comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on the mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING** You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may act on the application. **If no hearing request is received within this 15 day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided.** According to the Texas Clean Air Act § 382.056(o) a contested case hearing may only be granted if the applicant's compliance history is in the lowest classification under applicable compliance history requirements and if the hearing request is based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission may only grant a hearing on those issues submitted during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "I/we request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 15 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. Unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing, the executive director will mail the response to comments along with notification of Commission meeting to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material air quality concerns submitted during the comment period.** Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.
