records during his playing days at W.T. In the more than 40 years since he completed his college
career, three of the records have career, three of the records have
been broken, but amazingly he still holds a couple of school records: most points in a single game, and most field goals. When you realize that in
Brookie's day, Brookie's day, a high-scoring
game was 50 points in college play, the longevity of his records make hem even more awesome. Brookfield will finally have a chance to be honored by his old anuary 18.
