reform, House Bill 72, enacted by the Texas Legislature The Friona School District is in the process of putting its plan
ogether. A committee of 24 ha completed work on a recom-
mended plan for the district This committee consists. administrators, the Specia
Education supervisor, two schoo counselors, six teachers, four students, and six parents.
The committee looked at present poiicies and procedures in view of ejected, or made changes though o be necessary or desirable in the district's policies.
Included in the plan is the addition of rights and
responsibilities of students, rights and responsibilities of parents, rights and responsibilities of leachers, and rights and respon sibilities of administrators. In delineating these rights and
responsibilities the results will hopefully be an improve cooperative effort of all involved n attaining a smooth, uninter rupted, and productiv environment in the public schools.
Discipline management tech niques and procedures are included in the document. Offenses are identified in categories of majo techniques and discipline procedures that may be used ar identified.
