IT IS HARD to realize that one of the big news stories of this summer, virtually rivaling the hostage crisis and President Reagan's cancer operation, has been the taste change, and then the flip-flop, by the Coca-Cola

Company. The irony in the situation is that more people may have been anxious about the changing of the Coke formula than there were those anxious about the president's recovery, or the hostages' return.

Many of us in the news business, who deal with promotions on a regular basis, have figured from the very first that the "flip-flop" by the Coca-Cola Company, in which they first changed their 100year-old formula, and then announced that due to public demand they would bring it back, was planned from the very beginning.

Stop and think about the many times you have seen the Coke episode discussed on television-first with angry customers, then grocers describing how the sales pattern of soft drinks had. changed, and then this past week, to interviews with company executives, describing their plans to bring back the original formula.

There is no way that the Coca-Cola people could have gotten so much free time on both national and regional television, to say nothing of newspapers and magazines, except to have run their campaign on a planned basis-take away the distinctive taste of their product, and after a short time "decide" that due to popular demand they would bring it back.

The company got two big news splashes out of the deal, one on the front-end of the announcement, and the other this past week, with a lot of hoop-la throughout, and in between the two announcements.

Those in business have found it rather hard to believe that a national company, whose sales were in the top spot for its industry, would purposely do anything to change its product, particularly its taste, in the case of Coke. If Coke sales were number two or three and it was trying to improve the company's ratings, it would be one matter--but this was not the case.

Other companies, such as Pepsi Cola and Dr. Pepper, made some inroads on Coke's business on the grocer's shelves during the "experiment." It remains to be seen what will happen after Coke Classic is back on the shelves.

Another factor in this "soft drink war" is the fact that a number of restaurant chains and other companies have contracts with the Coke company to supply their soft drinks. They don't even carry Pepsi, or other choices.

Customers of establishments are not given much of a choice in their type of Coke, when it comes out of a syrup bottle \$57,082.56 in sales taxes. and is mixed with carbonated water. It would be interesting to know if Coca-Cola lost any of this chain business during the furor by June 20. over their formula change.

We happened to be in one of these chain restaurants in the Dallas area over the weekend, where "Coke" is the only choice for a soft drink. Just to get a rise out of the waitress, our son Stanley asked for "Coke Classic." The young waitress laughed and said she didn't think they had ever had even the "new" Coke.
