Star Lites

AS WE HAVE NOTED in recent issues, the state of Texas traces its independence to March 2, 1836 when the Declaration was drafted and signed at Washington-on-the-Brazos. The first signer of the document was Richard Ellis.

After the fall of the Alamo, Houston, General commander of the Texas army, dealt the Mexican army a crushing defeat at San Jacinto on April 21, and the short battle for Texas independence was over.

However, all was not necessarily a bed of roses, and the wonder of it all was that the new Republic of Texas lasted the ten years that it did.

Mexico had by no means given up hope of reclaiming Texas, despite the surrender of Santa Anna to Sam Houston at San Jacinto. There were threats of continued hostilities from Mexico.

And, there were troubles with the various Indian tribes who had wandered the Texas area for generations, following the buffalo herds.

The public debt continued to grow, and the new nation had trouble paying off the men who had fought so gallantly to make Texas an independent nation. The March 21. value of Texas' paper dollar fell as point.

As a Republic, Texas was able to get some financial assistance from the United States, and even received "foreign aid" from England and France.

In fact, it may have been the fact Mrs. Joe Bass. that these European nations were paying so much attention to Texas that caused the leaders in Washington, D.C. to get on with the movement to admit Texas into the union.

England was somewhat like Mexico, in that it had only recently surrendered a large chunk of territory in the New World, when Colonies won their independence. And France had had a longtime interest in North America, claiming a generous portion of land, most of which became a part of the United States through the Louisiana Purchase.

One of the problems faced by the United States in dealing with the question of annexing Texas was the slavery issue. Texas was in slave territory, and this did not sell well with the congressmen from the North. Besides, what did the U.S. want with a vast "wasteland," inhabited to a large extent by wild Indians, which many officials thought never would amount to anything.

In March of 1845, Congress finally passed a joint resolution offering statehood to Texas. The

would inhabit this goodly land.") The annexation of Texas led to war with Mexico in 1848, after which the boundaries of the new state were set out. Texas had always claimed the Rio Grande River all the way to its source as its western boundary. This includes part of what is now five other states: New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, Oklahoma and Kansas.

With the Compromise of 1850, all of the above described territory was ceded to the United States for a fee of \$10,000,000. The money was used by the state to pay its public debt.

Texas also set some conditions with which it would give up its independence and join the United States. One was that it would keep its public lands, not turning them over to the U.S. Another is that it was given the provision to divide into as many as five states, should it ever choose to do so.

Bill Donham from the Soil Conservation Service will discuss water harvesting methods with level terrace systems. Mr. Editor,




Leaf rust could be even more severe this year than in 1985 because spore populations in central parts of Texas are heavier than they were last year, points out Gary Patterson, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

Several races of the leaf rust fungus are occurring, and most wheat varieties have some damage, Patterson explains. Certain varieties have heavy infections and could suffer severe yield reductions.

Producers must base their decision to control leaf rust on their crops yield potential, says Patterson. The greatest benefit is likely when the yield potential is 40 bushels or more per acre. With a yield potential of 60 bushels or more per acre, two applications may be justified.

Studies have shown that leaf rust control is most effective when a fungicide is applied just as the flag leaf is starting to emerge. The flag leaf is the last leaf formed before the grain head is exerted, explains Patterson. If a second application is warranted, it should be applied 10 to 14 days after the first. Use 3-5 gallons of water per acre for air applications to insure good coverage.

Because of the high cost of a fungicide treatment, growers should be sure that such things as the stand of the crop, fertility level and moisture availability are not major limiting factors. Unless the yield potential is good, control will likely not be cost-effective, emphasizes Patterson.

In order to get my project started, I need the help of the people who read these papers. I intend to place two more markers, one which would recognize Parmer County citizens who lost their lives during the Korean Conflict and one to recognize citizens who lost their lives during the Viet Nam conflict. I would like to have not only the names of these people, but also their rate or rank, and maybe some background on them that I might could use in a memorial service at the dedication of this memorial.




