Area Receives Good Rainfall

The Friona area was virtually "transported to the mountains" for most of the past week, as a daily shower was received and temperatures never reached above the low 70s until Thursday.

A Saturday evening shower left .32 inches of rain in the city, and rounded out the month of May's rainfall with 2.79 inches recorded locally.

The Department of Energy says it will spend \$850 million during the next six years studying the Deaf Smith County site.

It behooves all residents in this area to put pressure on the Department of Energy to prove beyond the shadow of a doubt that our underground water supply can be protected from nuclear waste stored beneath the aquifers.

It has been mind-boggling to many people from the very first mention of Deaf Smith County as a waste repository, that the DOE would consider a site which is right in the middle of one of the most productive agricultural areas in the world.

There have been some reservations about the possible salt contamination of the underground water which could be caused during the test drilling work that the DOE will do in the coming years.

But that his nothing compared the fears of nuclear to contamination of our water, plus the general hazards of having such a repository located in such a viable area--just 35 miles from a metropolitan city, Amarillo.

Do the possible economic benefits of a nuclear waste dump overshadow the disadvantages, particularly if you consider the potential loss of productive agricultural land and businesses?

Then on Monday, another .58 inches were recorded. For the week, a total of 1.51 inches were logged in Friona, but the rainfall has been much heavier in the outlying area.

Particularly in the Black area, where over an inch of rain fell both Monday and Tuesday evening, which showers were not received in town. The area south and southeast of town likewise had much heavier rains.

The area was on the edge of a tornado warning on Wednesday, and residents reported sighting funnels dipping from a cloud which centered on the Lazbuddie area. No funnel damage was reported, although it was stated that the Clay's Corner area received heavy hail that afternoon.

Things began to clear on Thursday, as the temperature climbed to 82 degrees. A hot, dry weekend was forecast for the area.

Personally, we already have our own conclusions as to the soundness of constructing such a waste repository in this area. It would take a lot of proof on the part of the DOE to change our thinking.

Unfortunately, you also get the idea that the DOE officials also have their minds made up on the subject, and that the time-table set up for testing, etc., is merely going through the motions prior to making the final site selection.

If the DOE's studies are not convincing enough, the residents of our area will have one last recourse. Should the Deaf Smith County site be selected, our state governor could still veto the selection.

The only way the veto could be overturned would be by a twothirds approval by both houses of congress, something our legislators have said in the past would be a hard vote to muster.


