points of the midpoint of the 1,050 funds, 475 to 575 , qualified a good performers scored 425 to god per formers scored 425 to
475 , and those families that scored less than 425 were labeled extraordinary performers. The results of the study showed families rated extraordinary. Six rated good. Sixteen rated mediocre; six rated poor, and 17 were unacceptable.
As McIntyre concluded, "The As McIntyre concluded, "The mutual-fund companies aren't necessarily the best." The study offered one disadvantage for the average of all the funds within the family.
