coinage of silver coinage of silver, and the
Treasury's declining gold reserves frell below the critical hundred-million-dollar mark. To avoid bankruptcy, the government had banker J.P. Morgan. As you can see, economic recessions have always been a part
of U.S. history. They are not generally long-lived and have never proved devastating.
