unity when we offer to God our tribute of joy and gratitude for the blessings of the year?" finally worked in her favor, and that year President Abraham Lincoln declared the last Thursday--the fourth Thursday in
November-as a national day of Thanksgeriving. Tradition was then established with the last Thursday in November reserved for Thanksgiving,
Things went just like clockwork two out of every seven years, there would be five Thursdays in
November. That is when the confusion-and some politicking
began. professor called President Franklin Roosevelt's attention to the fact that there would be five Thursdays in November that year. Since most of the time the fourth Thursday
was the last Thursday of the month, people were used to the Thanksgiving Day. The President not only decided to have the 1939 in November, but in the following years, to move Thanksgiving
earlier--to the second Thursday in November.
