


## win **Chieftains Drop District Opener**



70 Yrs Ago-Dec. 25, 1926 The front page of the Star carried an article tracing the growth of the Friona school system during the preceding five years, from a three-year to a four-year high school; from five teachers to eleven; from three buses to eight; from 98 students to 300; and from ten grades to eleven. \*\*\*\*\*

65 Yrs Ago-Dec. 25, 1931 Owing to the 12 inches of snow which covered the ground Thursday morning of last week, the school buses were unable to get to school from the various parts of the district. Only three of the ten buses were able to make the trip Friday, and for this reason, there was a very small attendance which the departments of the school had prepared.

60 Yrs Ago-Dec. 25, 1936 Canyon's high-flying Eagles made off with the first place trophy in the Friona Invitational Tournament, which closed here Saturday night. The Chieftains gave them a mighty battle in the final game, before losing by the heart-breaking margin of 28-27. the he 28-27.

\*\*\*\*\* 55 Yrs Ago-Dec. 26, 1941 Entirely satisfactory was Friona's response to the Red Cross relief call, according to a report made this week by J.R. Roden, roll call chairman in Friona. Roden reports that Friona raised \$11.72 more than its \$300 quota-a much better showing than in some of the larger cities throughout the state, he said. \*\*\*\*\*

45 Yrs Ago-Dec. 27, 1951 The Friona Skill Team of the local FFA took top honors in the Huntsville demon-stration in March. The group demonstrated prevention and vaccinations and general care involved in hog cholera. Those who went were Keith Brock, Ralph Reid, J. Vonne Fulks, J.T. Gee, supervisor, Jack Redbearn and M.C. Redbearn and M.C. Jack I Osborn.

# Santa's Local Toymaker Walter Schueler's Workshop--The Stuff of Kids' Dreams

By JIM STEIERT Elfin magic is going on at Walter Schueler's place at Rhea, northwest of Friona, these days. Like most employers, Santa is ever-eager to find good help. He's found one excellent helper in a semi-retired farmer. Since toy-making skills fome at a premium during the holiday season, you could say Santa has designated Walter's Woodcraft, Schueler's howe-based toy making and wood crafting enterprise, as an official North Pole work. The workshop just off of his home, this Parmer kyoden toys that are a throwback to times past. stains to the cleverly-made pieces. Most folks might look at a chunk of wood and never imagine there was a toy hiding inside it...Walter has a knack for freeing the toy from the surrounding wood. From blocks of pine and cedar, oak, walnut and alder, he extracts clever pull-toys in the form of egg-laying chickens, wing-flapping ducks, high-kicking grasshoppers, and yawning hippos. There are tractors with round-headed drivers, smoothare tractors with round-headed drivers, smooth-grained Model-A-type cars

with a spare on the rear, trucks, airplanes, and yes, even red fire engines with ladders, like kids from Christmases beyond memory have dreamed of. Walter's hands and the tools that they wield transform pieces of cedar into nativity scenes that reflect the real message of the season. Flip over the mounting board for these scenes, place the pegs on the pieces in new holes, and peg-in a few other pieces, and the nativity scenes become fitting reminders of Good Friday and Easter. Easter

reminders of Good Friday and Easter. Walter has fashioned toys, in a manner of speaking, since his childhood. As a young boy, Walter made small cars and trucks from 2x4 blocks that he nailed wheels on. Though the seeds of toy making were sown in his youth, they didn't sprout and blossom until Walter had health problems that forced him to lease out the irrigatd end of his farming operation. He still farms his dryland arerage part-time, but found himself with more time on his bands once the intensity level of his farming dropped off. Walter made quite a few food and craft shows in the area with Martha, who has operated Martha's Candy, and marketed chocolates, caramels, and other ingredients for treats and gifts, and has conducted home demonstrations on how to use these ingredients to make these treats for 17 years. While passing the time manning sales booths at these craft shows, Walter noted that there just weren't any toys for kids to enjoy at the events. Advised by Martha that heid heat find something to

events. Advised by Martha that he'd best find something to

keep him busy, Walter looked around for options. He had a shop right off the house, with saws, a lathe and drill press, router, sander-all kinds of woodworking equipment--and he remembered the joy of making toys.


remembered the joy of making toys. What began as a time-passing hobby has now become a full-time trade for Walter the toy-maker. He started marketing his toys through a booth at the Crafter's Mall in Clovis earlier this year.

toys through a booth at the Crafter's Mall in Clovis earlier this year. "I like seeing the pleasure that people take from the toys that I've built," says Walter. "I guess I'm a kid at heart, still. I can't get real interested in making furniture. I don't like to start off on stuff that I have to work a week on. It's fun making toys. I have to come up with my own pattern for some of these creations, and that's challenging. Our kids and grandkids have had some great ideas for things to build."

Toy crafting is not a high-speed, high volume (Continued on Page 2)







After creation of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 in September 1951, McFarland was appointed to serve on the District's original board of directors. The other board members persuaded him to accept the position of manager, in which he served until his resignation in August 1969. The othese include: "Protecting ground water quality by leading the fight to persuade the Texas Railroad Commission to pass a state-wide order halting disposal of oilfield brine in unined surface pits. "Filling a lawsuit against the Internal Revenue Service to obtain a cost-in-water income tax depletion allow-ance for landowners who uses ground water in the business. "Development of a public information/education pro-

gram to inform area residents about their ground water resources and the need to conserve water.

conserve water. After retiring as manager of the High Plains Water District, McFarland moved to Austin where he served as underground water advisor to Governor Preston Smith. He later worked at the Texas Water Quality Board and the Texas Department of Water Resources, from which he retired in June 1980. Survivors include his wife, a son, a daughter and two step-grandsons.
