Another Bear Caught A few days ago while at work

Ramey with a couple of Mexicans, soon brought the rambling of the bear to a sudden stop, and he was soon hog tied, however, not until he had left plenty of signs on the body of each of his captors, for each one had been pretty well bitten and scratched up.

The bear was about a year old and was making his way from the Paisano mountains to the Davis mountains, following the railroad right of way to within sight of Marfa.


