





Friona, it was explained that when companies call the TEDC for information as to possible sites for expansion within the state of Texas, that organization will be well versed on what Friona has to offer.

The TEDC will be expected to review all of the qualifications of TEXCEL members, and recommend one or more that might fit the criteria of the business in question.

Friona is one of only a few cities under 5,000 which took part in the program, and made it through to **TEXCEL** certification.

Also, it was important that the Austin-based TEDC was made aware of the Panhandle area, Ms. Beard said. "I think they have been surprised at what is available in this part of the state," she stated.

Ms. Beard and City Manager Beelee Goodwin have been the key officials who have participatd in the training sessions.
