**IF YOU THOUGHT** that we had had a lot of rain in Parmer County during the month of May and early in June, you just need to drive a little distance to find out that the rain we've received in this area really has been fairly light, in comparison to other areas.

We went to a family reunion at Bowie last weekend, and everywhere we drove had much more rain than we have had, and virtually everyone we visited with had had more rain in their areas.

When we drove through Briscoe and Hall counties on Highway 86, we saw fields which were still holding water, a week after their last rain. Most of the cotton in Hall County has been washed away, and it has been too wet for farmers to replant. As we have passed the mid-point of June, the chances of making cotton at this late date get poorer with each passing day.

The small percentage of cotton that survived in that area is just a few inches high.

We had heard on the news about a nine-inch rain in the Paducah vicinity in late May, and we saw evidence of this flood around the Estelline community. Fields have been washed out, and turnrows have been turned to gulleys after too much rain in too short a time.

At Estelline, the Highway Department had a crew using a front-end loader to scrape the mud off the highway. The mud was several inches thick at one spot, and there was evidence that the water had been across the highway in several places in that area.

Our relatives who live in Western Oklahoma have had trouble getting their wheat cut. It has been ready to cut since around the first of June, but fields have been too wet. They have had so much rain in places that the wheat was beginning to sprout in the head, someone reported.

Creeks and rivers from the Wichita Falls area on down were running. It is unusual to see water running in some of those streams, but it has been lately.

Billy Whitecotton was telling us of a picture of Red River being in the Nocona newspaper in recent weeks. The accompanying article reported that Red River was a mile wide in the Montague County area.

Experts were saying that the river was at a 100-year high, meaning that it only reaches that particular level once every hundred years. But Whitecotton remarked that it also reached this stage about three years ago, so it will either have to skip a century, or they will have to re-figure the odds.

Everything down in the North Texas area is pretty and green. In fact, the pastures between here and Childress are green. So maybe this moisture will be beneficial in the long run.

At least those of us in the northern part of the state have been spared the flooding that has hit South Texas. The damage in that part of the state has been measured in the millions of dollars.

People living in the flood area have lost not only their crops, but in some cases their homes and possessions.

So, I suppose we've had it pretty good here in Parmer County. For the most part, the rains we've had have been beneficial and spaced out fairly well. And as soon as our wheat harvest is over, there will probably be a need for more moisture.

## First Wheat Is Delivered Here

Hollis Horton marketed the first load of wheat in Friona this season. The truckload was harvested Monday, June 15 on the Lillard place north of town.

The wheat was harvested from a 330-acre dryland field by Roddy Berend. It was sowed last October 1 by Roger Nelson, and was Tam 105 variety.

Horton said that the moisture content on the first load was 12 per cent, and the test weight was 60.6 pounds per bushel.

Ron Smiley, manager of Friona Wheat Growers, said that early indications are that the yields will be average to above average. The test weight is averaging 59 pounds to the bushel, Smiley said, which is a pound off the average, classifying the wheat as number two.

It was too early to determine what the protein content will run on the 1987 crop.

The price of wheat locally had bounced between \$2.30 and \$2.45

As of Friday evening, the price in Friona was \$2.40.

Smiley said that the moisture content really dropped in a hurry. One field was sampled early in the week, and tested 20.4 per cent moisture. The next day it had dropped to 12 per cent.

"In our area, I would say that we'll have a near normal crop. The acreage may be down slightly, since some wheat was grazed out and some was baled. Also, some was plowed up for CRP purposes. However, most farmers stayed in the government program.

Virtually all of the wheat harvested this past week was considered dryland, although Smiley said that very little of the usual irrigated wheat had received a lot of water.

For one thing, the area received good moisture in the form of snow during the winter. Some of the wheat suffered before the rains began in May, but all in all the area has had above-average moisture during the wheat's growing season.

Resignations from Myrna Cain, eighth grade math teacher, and Leslie Eggemeyer, elementary art teacher, were received from the board.

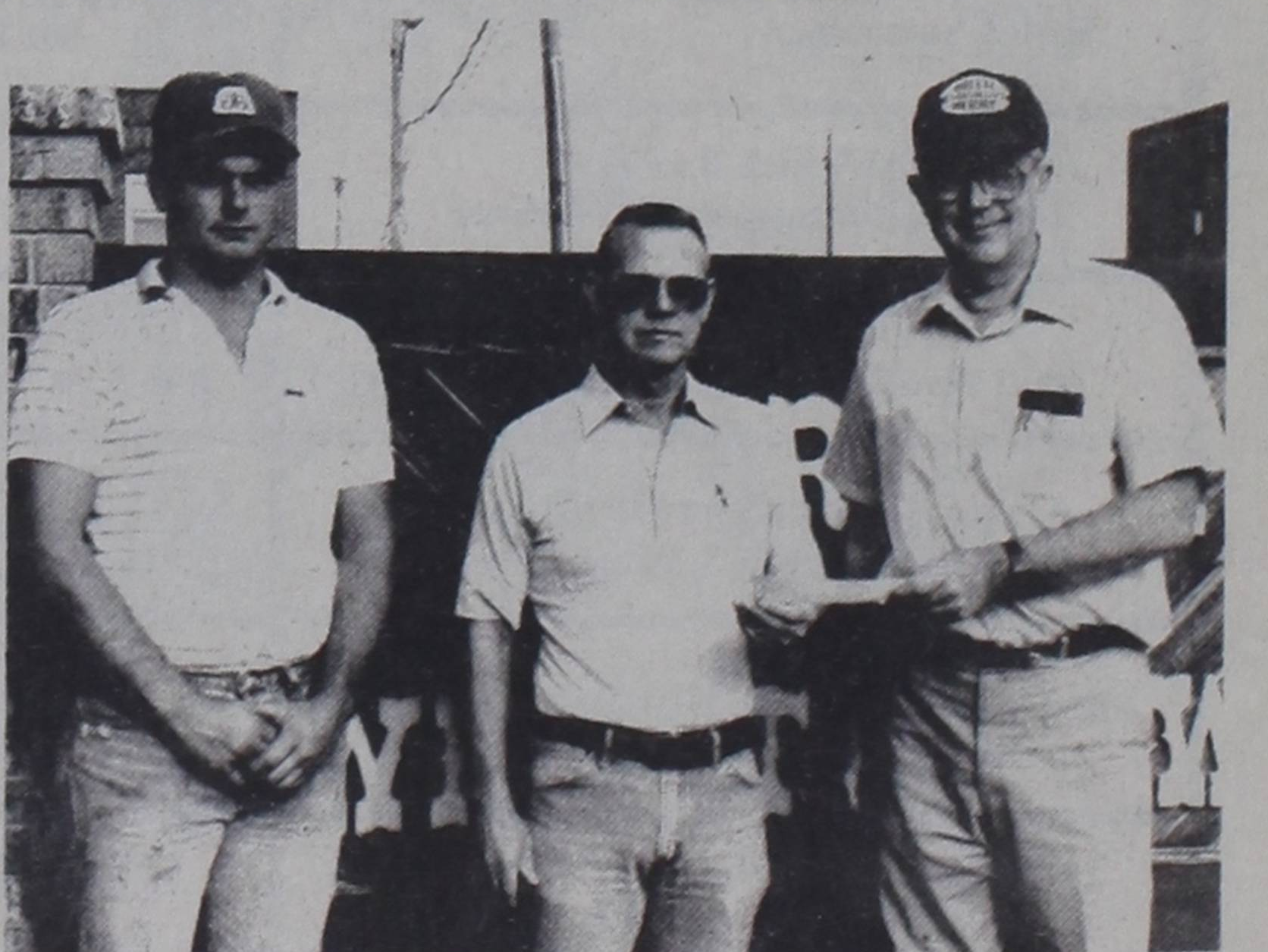
## Classes Slated For English Deficient

Summer classes for limited English proficient students who will be in kindergarten or the first grade in 1987-88 will begin on Monday, June 27. This program is to assist LEP students in being more prepared for school in the fall by improving their communication skills. Oral language development receives primary emphasis in this program.

Christina Quintana, a newly employed bilingual teacher, will be in charge of this program. The hours for the summer school program will be from 9 a.m. until 12 noon. The program will operate for eight weeks, from June 22-August 14. Classes will be conducted Monday through Friday for these eight weeks.

Enrollment for this program will be conducted at 9 a.m. on Monday, June 22. Parents should report with their children to the north wing of the Primary School Building. Children who have been identified to be limited English proficient and will be in kindergarten or in first grade when school opens are eligible. If a parent is not sure whether or not their child is eligible they may report and that determination will be made on June 22.

Parents must provide transportation to and from the summer school program. There will be no charge for the program. Parents of eligible children are encouraged to have their child participate in this special program

# Student, Teacher Attend Symposium

Outstanding area high school science students and teachers learned of the latest developments in the energy field June 8-11 at the Texas Energy Science Symposium in Austin.

The group, representing schools throughout the Panhandle and South Plains of Texas, was sponsored by Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS).

Among the approximately 400 participants from across the state were Bena Bronniman, 17, daughter of Oscar and Lavelle Bronniman of Friona, and Marilyn Crittenden, a chemistry and physics teacher at Friona High School.

The symposium is an annual event sponsored by the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation (TAERF). The foundation is composed of ten electric utilities in Texas, including SPS.

Although the company does not own or operate any nuclear power plants, SPS's membership in TAERF is a mark of its on-going commitment to energy research. An important part of this research is the fusion research program in place at the University of Texas.

While today's nuclear power plants generate electricity using fission, a process that splits atoms, fusion would produce energy by joining atoms together.

TAERF efforts to develop the fusion process include looking at

ways to contain the fusion reaction, which lasts for only a fraction of a second. At the University of Texas, researchers are using a machine called a tokamak, which uses magnetic fields, to attempt to contain this reaction.

In addition to fusion research, Science Symposium students will participate in programs and demonstrations on such topics as energy needs and the environment, industrial uses of electricity, coal, and computers.

## D. Reed Receives Special Recognition

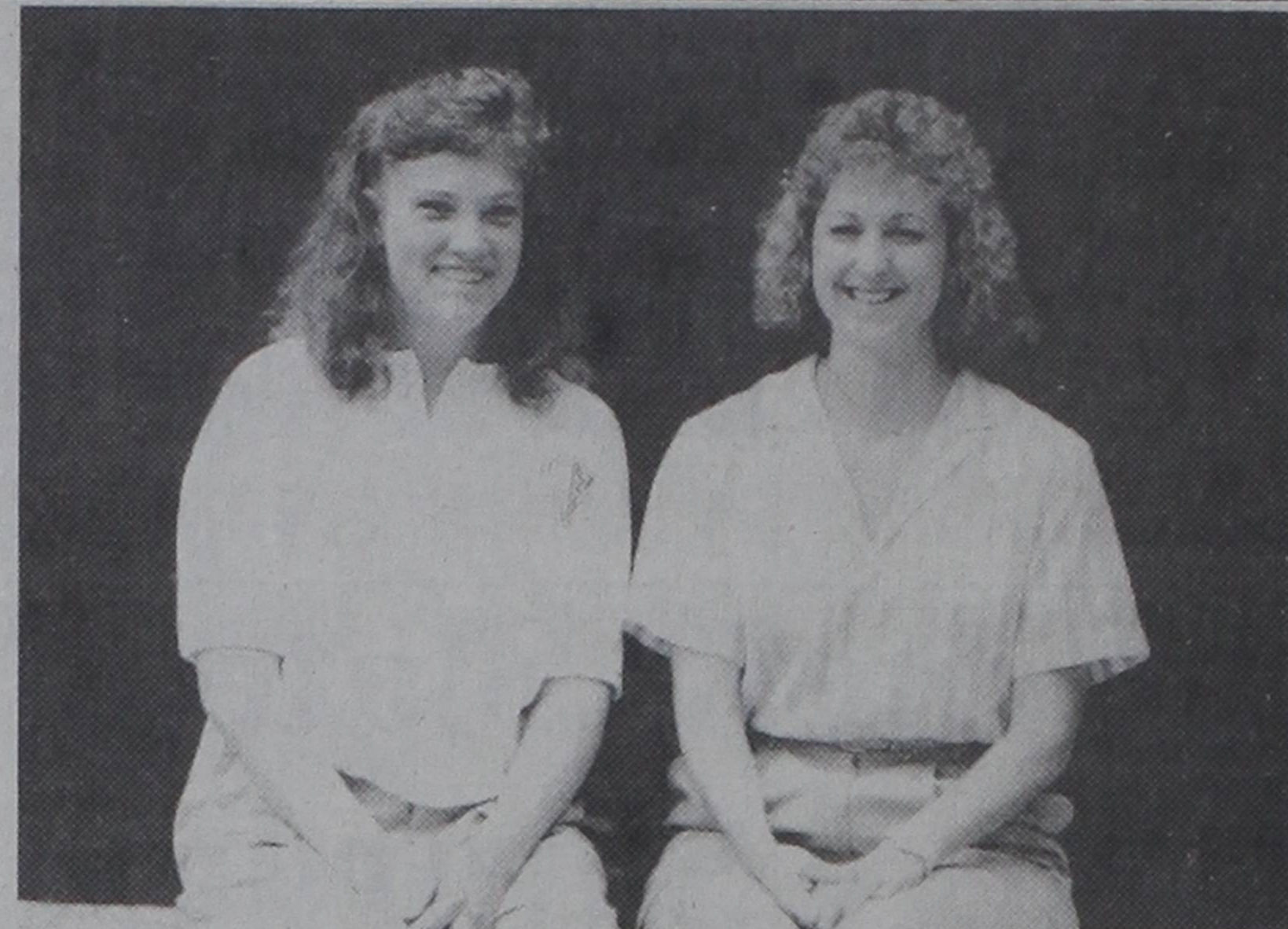
The United States Achievement Academy announced this week that David Reed has been named a United States National Award winner in art.

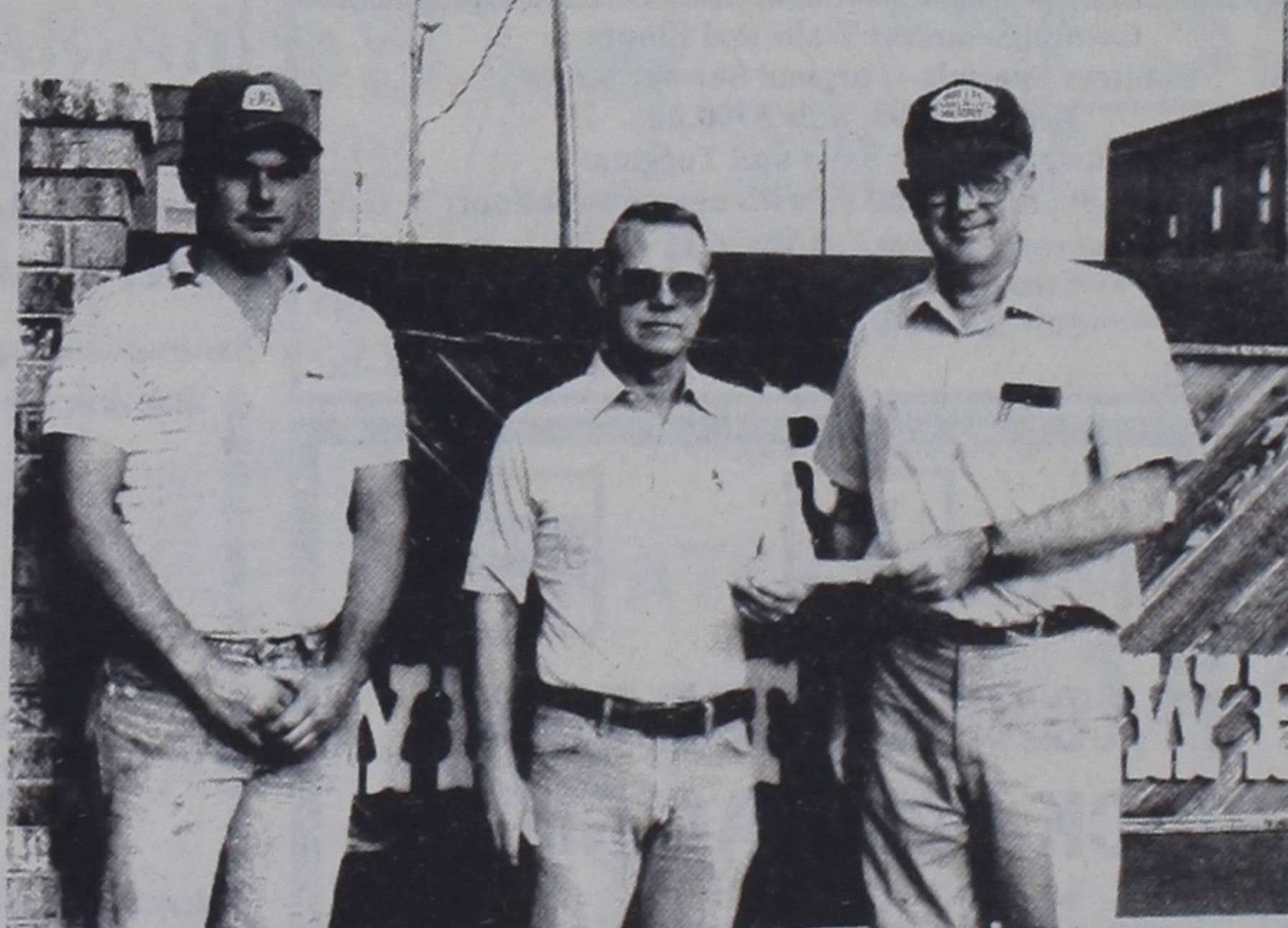

Mr. Millard gets lots of fan mail. He enjoys saving his greeting cards. This year he received over 40 Christmas cards and birthday cards.

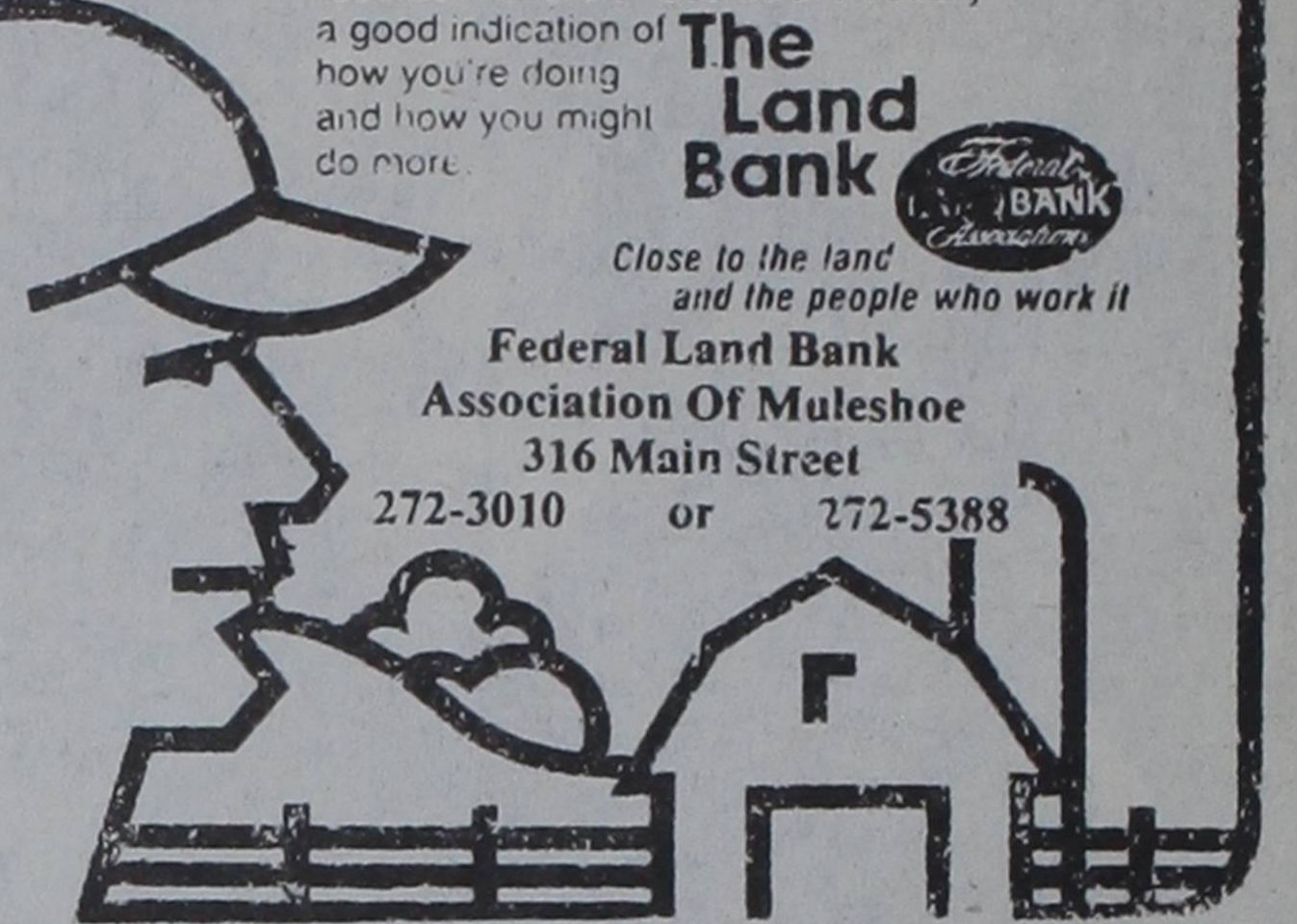
Mr. Millard's favorite food is ham, but he quotes, "I can't chew with dentures so I have it pureed." And laughs.

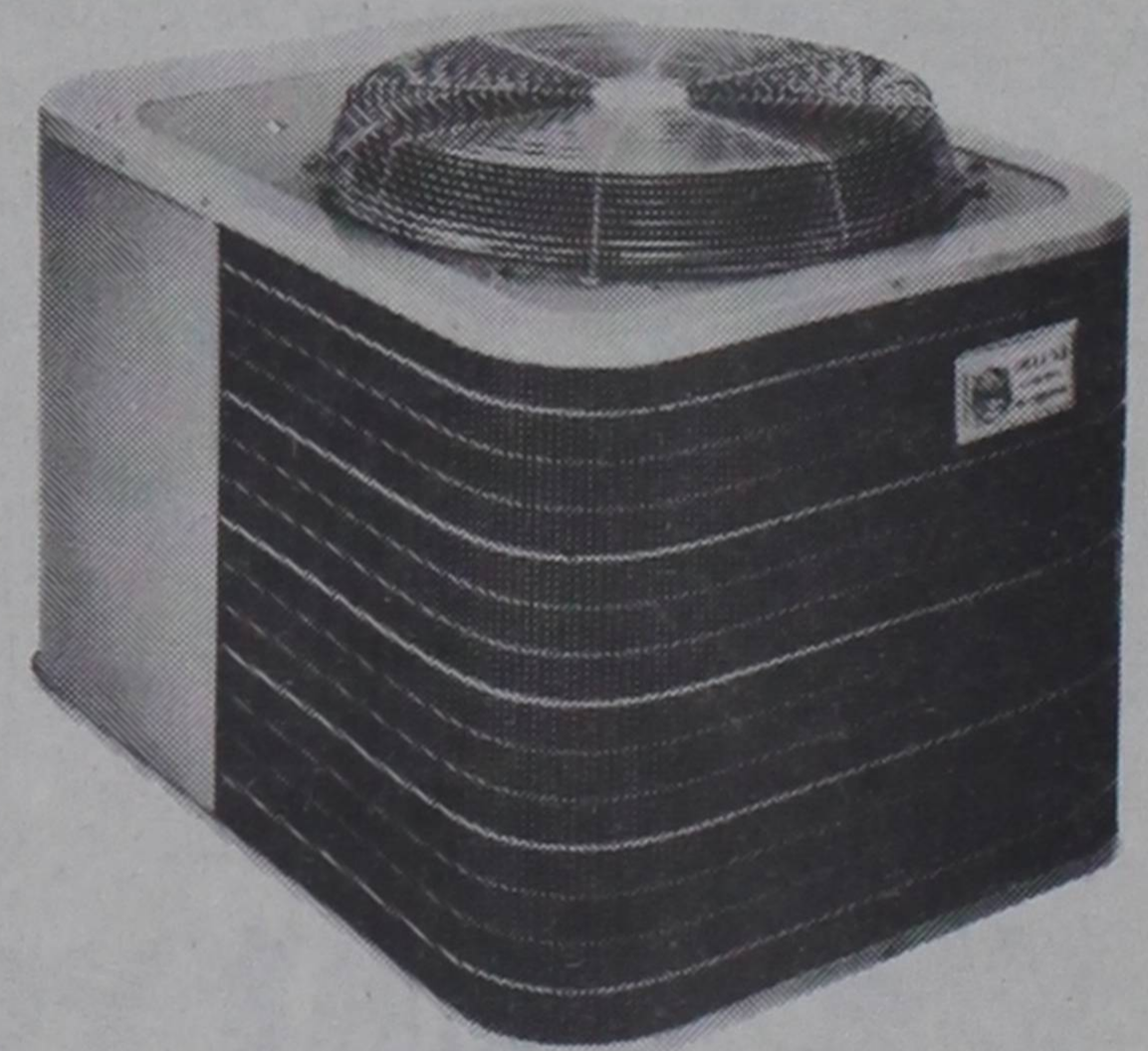
