"In most of the cases where items were taken from vehicles, the vehicle was left unlocked," Niece said. The Chief of Police said that residents should be more careful of their vehicles at night, or when leaving them parked downtown.

"I think that if the vehicles were locked, the would-be burglars would think twice before breaking into a vehicle. Also, drivers might consider removing items of value and putting them into their trunks when leaving their cars parked. Trunks are usually harder to break into, even if the burglar knows something of value might be there," Niece said.
