Sweetenet Not Linked To Seizures

## No link was found between the

 consumption of high doses of the low calorie sweetener aspartame by Drs. Phillip C. Jobe and John W. Dailey at the University of Illinois College of Medicine aPeoria. Jobe and Dailey, noted authorities in epilepsy research, conducted studies to determine whether rats particularly sensitive to seizures were affected by oral
consumption of aspartame. Rats were given doses of aspartame equivalent to the amount an average-sized man would consume if he could drink 750 twelve-ounce cans of diet soda at one time. None had seizures. sound to induce seizures in the rats, and found that the severity of the seizures was not greater in
those that had consumed aspartame. Asparta Aspartame, commonly sold
under the brand name NutraSweet, is used in diet drinks and other foods as a low calorie sweetener. The scientists worked with a group of epiliepsy-prone rats that
were very susceptible to seizures. "The rats are an excellent model for certain human forms of epilepsy and almost perfect for what we wanted to test. Their
epilepsy is due primarily to a decrease in chemical transmitters in the brain that aspartame allegedly affects," Jobe said. Jobe and Dailey will present
their findings at a meeting of the American Society for Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics in Honolulu, Hawaii next week.
