# Patrolmen Involved in Car-1 ruck

Two Friona police patrolmen escaped serious injury but their patrol car was totally wrecked in a car-truck accident early November 25 just west of the city.

The patrolmen were checking the businesses just west of town at about 1:30 a.m. and were attempting to come back onto Highway 60 from the south. Their vehicle was struck by a truck driven by Jim H. Kenney, 43, of Terrero, N.M.

The truck hit the vehicle just behind the driver's door, and skidded down the highway for several feet before turning over. There were 16 head of cattle on the truck, and at least a couple of

the cattle were killed in the accident. The driver of the patrol car was Bailey Roberts, who sustained only minor scratches. Patrolman Jimmie Davis, a passenger in the car, had

to have stitches taken in his forehead. The patrolmen had to crawl out of the car on the passenger side. They were able to call into police headquarters and report the wreck.


The accident occurred at a point where a dirt road intersects with Highway 60, where the highway dips, causing a visibility problem.

# Hal Ratcliff Tabbed As Superintendent

Hal Ratcliff, who is currently in his eighth year as principal of Friona High School, was named this week by the Friona Board of Trustees to be the Superintendent of Schools upon the retirement of Tom Jarboe.//

Ratcliff came to Friona in the fall of 1980 as principal of Friona High School. He previously had served as principal at Hartley High School from 1977-80.

The Ratcliffs lived in Levelland from 1971-77. He was an assistant principal in junior high for two years, then served as principal at

an elementary school two years, plus another two years as principal of Levelland Junior High School.

staff at Texas Christian University, 1967-70 as an assistant basketball coach, and spent a year as head basketball coach at Lubbock Coronado High School.

He is a 1960 graduate of Dimmitt High School and received his B.E. degree in 1964 from TCU, obtaining his master of arts degree Club work, and served as a there in 1970. He also did postgraduate work at Texas Tech.

Ratcliff established the Friona High School scholarship program in 1985, which has provided 60 \$25,000 in scholarship money in attending the past three years.

He also inaugurated the Gifted and Talented program at F.H.S.







# Parmer Co. To Mail **Voter Cards**

Due to the change in the voting year, voter registration certificates which are normally mailed out in January of even numbered years are currently being mailed to registered voters. The new white certificates will be valid from March 1, 1988 through December 31, 1989. However, you will need to keep your current yellow certificate since they are valid through February 28, 1988, says Hugh Moseley, voter registrar.

If you have moved or if you have changed your mailing address from a box to a street address or vice versa, and have not notified the voter registrar of your change, you will not receive a new certificate. These certificates are not forwardable and will be returned to the voter registrar.

You will need to contact the voter registrar at the Parmer County Tax Office in Farwell and fill out a change card and receive your new certificate. If you do not receive your new certificate and you are still a resident of Parmer County and wish to remain a registered voter, you must make this change.

All certificates that are returned to the voter registrar will be removed from the current voter registration list. It is very important that you report any changes in your voting status.


