AS A FOLLOW-UP to what Carol said here last week, the national media has made so much out of the Iowa caucus, and the New Hampshire primary, it would almost make you think that these early voter actions have more or less decided the presidential nominations.

Now, let's examine the facts. FACT: Iowa has only eight electoral votes. New Hampshire has four. By contrast, when several state primaries are held on "Super Tuesday," there are well over 100 electoral votes involved. Texas has 29 and Florida 23.

In Iowa, these were local (precinct) caucuses. The candidates who won approval on that level now have their delegates set for county conventions, and later state conventions.

At the final state convention, the decisions are made as to how to divide up the state's votes (and remember, compared to other states, Iowa doesn't pack much of a punch).

It was argued that Iowa is "Middle America," and should prove fairly representative of the nation as a whole.

FACT: Regional candidates Bob Dole (senator from Kansas) and Richard Gephardt (representative from Missouri) had the best support from their neighbors in Iowa.

These candidates now must move into other areas of the country and prove themselves. We expect that in the other states, other regional support may develop in other directions.

We feel that it is too bad that so much is made by the media of these early primaries, which usually causes some candidates to lose their support in other states, before they even have a chance to voice their wishes.

The good thing is that most voters no longer let the national media tell them what's good for them, and do their own thing at the polls.

## Post Office Cuts Down On Hours

The Friona Post Office will adjust its window hours beginning Saturday, February 13, according to Postmaster Larry Rogers.

The post office will begin closing its window service at 4 p.m., operating from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., and will not open for window service on Saturdays.

Operating hours are being reduced to help meet the Postal Services' reduction in operating expenses as required by Congress' Deficit Reduction Act. This act requires the Postal Service to trim \$1.245 billion from its operating budget.

"Nationwide, post offices have been ordered to reduce retail hours by 10 to 12 per cent. Rather than closing one afternoon a week as many areas are doing, we have chosen this daily reduction as the least disruptive to service," Rogers said.

The post office will continue to meet the needs of its patrons, Rogers said.

## Area Gets Snow, Cold

The Friona area received about an inch of snow Wednesday night, accompanied by a cold Arctic blast that caused the snow to drift as it fell.

The moisture content of the snow was estimated at .12 inches. The latest blast caused temperatures to fall into the single digits on Thursday morning, although it warmed up to 48 degrees later that afternoon.

Last Friday, February 6, another inch of snow fell during the early morning. This snow fell with very little wind, and quit by mid-morning.

Friona was on the northern edge of this unusual storm, which left heavier accumulations to the south and southwest, particularly in the Roswell, N.M. area, where over 15 inches were received.

The weather this week has varied between cold and mild, with a nice warmup being expected for the weekend.

## Four Receive Two-Year Pact Extensions

(New two-year contracts were extended to four administrators and to Friona High School athletic director Tommy Moss at the regular meeting of the Friona school board Monday night.

The board voted to offer new two-year contracts to administrative assistant James Warren, principals Tom Johnson, Jerry Shelton and Tony Igo, in addition to Moss.

Moss' two-year extension would run his contract to the end of the 1990-91 school term, and would give him the longest tenure of any head coach in FHS history. Moss became head coach at Friona High School in 1981.

In other contract matters, the board voted to extend for one year the contracts of counselors Jackie

Morgan, Sheryl Salyer and Charles Turner.

A report was heard from a committee working on the AIDS, sex education and drug abuse education for the Friona school district. More on this subject will be announced by the school in the near future. A state health specialist is being scheduled to speak to the entire student body, and a community session is also being planned.

The board announced that the school's annual trustee election, to be held jointly with the City of Friona, will be held on Saturday, May 1.

A resolution was passed to continue taxing vehicles for the 1988 tax year.

Board member Kathryn Goddard was appointed as the district's representative on the Texas Association of School Board's legislative network.

Routine reports were given. It was noted that tax collections for the district were running close to prior years. Routine budget amendments were made, with some money being shuffled from one fund to another.

## Classroom Contract Is Awarded

The Friona School board, at a special meeting this Monday, February 8, awarded a contract for four new classrooms for the elementary school. The classrooms were deemed necessary due to the 1-22 rule, part of HB 72.

Twelve bids were received for the project, and the low bidder accepted was Tech Builders of Amarillo, with a bid of \$174,369. Second low bid was \$174,500.

The classrooms will be attached to the north side of the second grade wing of the elementary building, and will be expansions for the third and fourth grades.

Completion is expected by July 1 of this year.

The late President John F. Kennedy started the pilot program for Presidential Classroom, which was observing its 20th anniversary.

Seminar speakers included Richard Armitage, Assistant Secretary of Defense, Paul Bremer III, a specialist on U.S. counter-terrorism, His Excellency Carlos Tunnerman, ambassador of Nicaragua, and the Honorable Richard Lyng, Secretary of Agriculture.

Also appearing was Adolfo Calero Protocarrero, leader of the Nicaraguan Democratic Resistance (Contras).

The group of 370 students was divided into sections of 30-40 each.

The students participated in a "crossfire," small group discussions over important political and social issues. At a graduation banquet, certificates and pens were presented to each student.

During her stay in Washington, Miss Willard, who is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dee Willard of

Route 1, Friona, visited the Smithsonian Museums of American and Natural History, and National Air and Space. They also saw the Lincoln Memorial, Washington Monument, Jefferson Memorial, Vietnam Memorial, Marine Memorial, and visited Arlington National Cemetery for the changing of the guard at the tomb of the unknown soldier.

They also visited Ford's Theatre, the National Archives, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, the Department of State, the National Cathedral, the Department of Agriculture and Crystal City Underground Mall.

On Capitol Hill, Deena and her group visited the Supreme Court, the Library of Congress, the Madison Building, the National Botanical Gardens and the Capitol Building.

Deena had the privilege of meeting Congressman Larry Combest, and also visited Senator Phil Gramm and Senator Loyd Bentsen's offices.

"The week was so wonderful, that I can't name one specific highlight. Patriotism sparked within everyone there, and we all left Washington 'proud to be

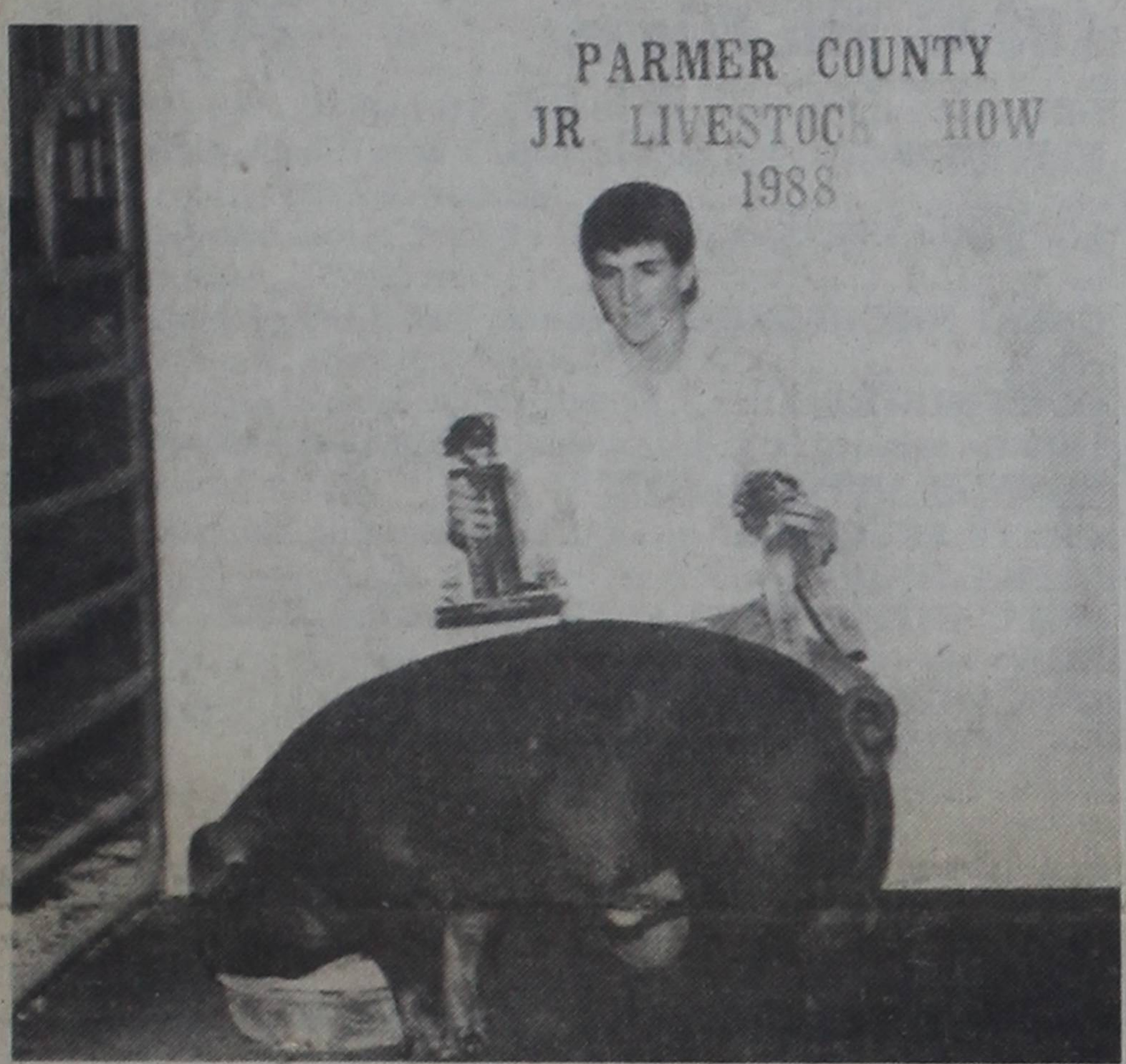

She married W.G. (Bill) Goddard July 29, 1933 in Chesterhill, Ohio.

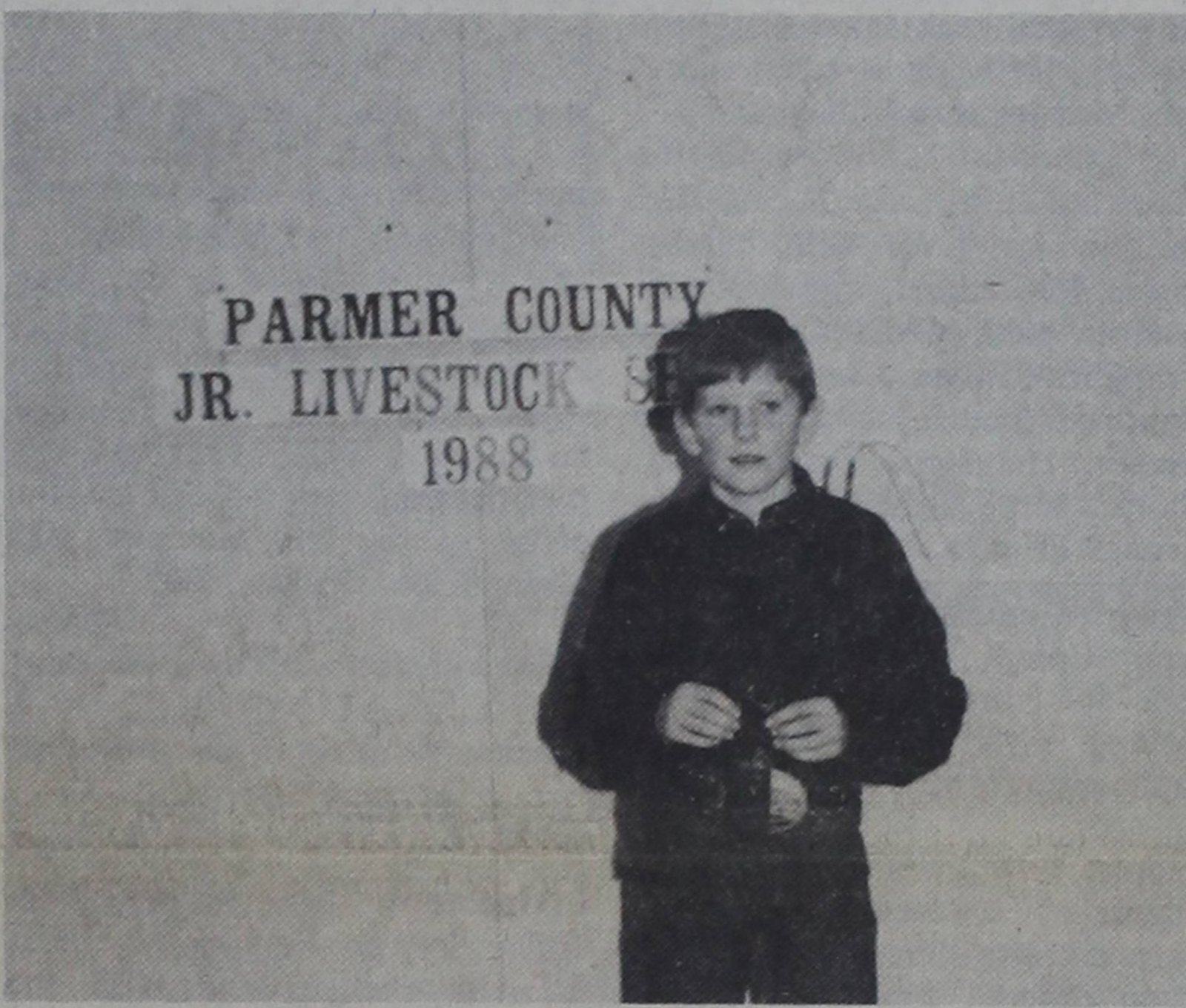

# Teams Drop Games To Floydada Tues.

Friona High School teams lost a pair of games against visiting Floydada here Tuesday night. The Squaws lost, 53-50 after leading until the last 1:36 of playing time.

The Chieftains lost their game, 69-51.

The loss was especially bitter for the Squaws, who were still entertaining a glimmer of hope for a post-season playoff spot.

And the Squaws looked for three and one-half quarters like they had this district game locked up. But it managed to get away from them, like three other district home games have done.

Floydada had an early 5-0 lead, but the Squaws rode the shooting of Tiffany Osborn (eight points in the opening quarter) to take the lead. Miss Osborn's follow shot at the 4:00 mark put Friona on top, 6-5. She scored a free throw and two more jump shots for a 12-7 edge.

Floydada trimmed the lead to

14-12, but Sindy Preston's pair of free throws gave Friona a 16-12 lead as the quarter ended.

Trudy Reeve hit a pair of jump shots to start the second quarter for a 20-16 Friona lead. Floydada kept putting the pressure on, trailing 22-19 and 27-23, but Bena Bronniman scored two baskets in the last minute before halftime to send the Squaws to the dressing room on top, 31-23.

Miss Bronniman started right where she left off, with another pair of baskets, and Friona had its longest lead, 37-27, after three minutes of play in the third quarter.

Floydada scored, but Lori Fulk made it 39-29 with a layup shot with 4:13 left in the third quarter.

Fouls began to hurt the Squaws, with Sindy Preston picking up quick whistles and going to the bench early in the third quarter. Floydada scored seven unanswered points to trim Friona's lead to 39-34.

Miss Osborn's follow shot helped Friona take a 42-36 lead at the end of the third quarter.

The Squaws didn't score for almost three minutes to begin the third quarter, and Floydada pulled to within a basket at 42-40. Miss Preston's pair of free throws broke the ice for a 44-40 lead at 5:18.

Floydada caught up at 46-44, and Sherri Dickson gave Friona a lead at 48-46.

Then came the play that broke Friona's back. Floydada went to the foul line, making the front end of a 1-1, for a 48-47 score. The second shot was missed, and Friona appeared to have the rebound when two Squaws knocked each other to the floor. The Whirlwinds scored an easy layup on the rebound to take the lead for the first time in the second half, 49-48.

Miss Preston sank a pair of pressure free throws to give Friona its last lead at 50-49 with 1:15 on the clock. But fouls continued to badly hurt the Squaws. The visitors turned a pair of fouls into four free throws to take the 53-50 lead.

Friona had the ball out with seven seconds left, and had to try a three-point basket for the tie, and the shot missed.

There was fairly good scoring balance. Trudy Reeve had 14 points, Tiffany Osborn 11 and Bena Bronniman ten. Karen Wied, playing her last home game as a

senior, was held scoreless.

The Chieftains came up with their best shooting night of the season from the field, but even that wasn't enough against the potent Whirlwinds.

Floydada took a 17-8 lead at the end of the first quarter. Daniel Echols and Glen Trimmell sparked Friona to 17 second-quarter points, but the 'Winds went to halftime nursing a 39-25 lead.

The Chieftains kept up their good shooting in the third quarter, outscoring the visitors 16-10 and trimmed Floydada's lead to eight points, 49-41, at the end of the quarter.

But the Whirlwinds rallied to keep the lead in the final quarter.

Echols scored 14 points and Trimmell 12 to pace the Chieftains.

## First nautical archaeologist receives prestigious award

**COLLEGE STATION**—Dr. George Bass, a Texas A&M University researcher who in 1960 was the first archaeologist to dive in order to excavate an ancient shipwreck, was recently rewarded with archaeology's highest honor.

Bass presented the Gold Medal for Distinguished Archaeological Achievement during the annual meeting of the Archaeological Institute of America (AIA), a group that encompasses both land and nautical archaeologists.



The Rheas are Mrs. Graham's parents and the Dements are former Friona residents. He was a Southwestern Public Service employee here about twenty years ago.

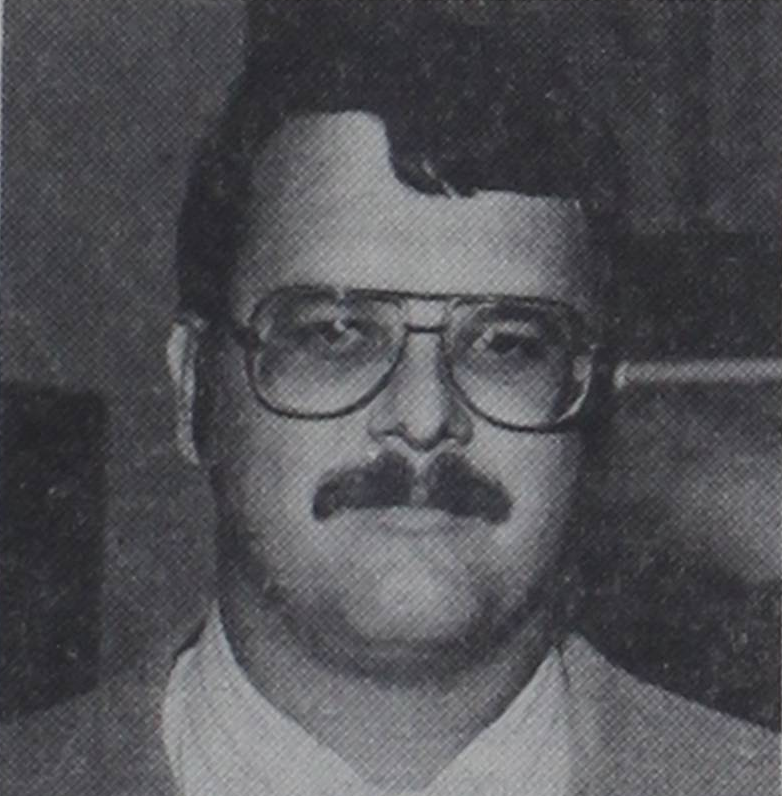
