SUPER TUESDAY is now behind us, and except for the runoffs on the county, district and state level, those of us in Texas can put burner for a few months.

time may not be so much "who first-ever won" in last Tuesday's election, primary. but the "Super Tuesday" concept itself.

The national television media, and some of the candidates seemed to be opposed to the multi-state primary date, due to the extra demands it made on their time. However, by and large, the voters seemed to be better served, and after all, every so often this segment of the population should be served.

Parmer County had a record turnout for primary voting, with 2,007 votes cast. And the state of Texas likewise set a record of 2.77 million primary voters. There were 1.75 million voters in the Democratic primary and just over a million in the Republican

primary. So apparently, the "Super Tuesday" concept was extremely popular with the voters. Getting to have our county, district and state primaries tied in with the presidential vote, and actually giving the voters their choice in the hopefuls. presidential primary in Texas, increased by 35 per cent over the previous presidential primary year, statewide. 1984. We haven't seen the figures on the state level, but assume they gained at least as much.

The national media, and some of the candidates make the point that for "Super Tuesday" they didn't have time to visit each and every state and meet the voters as they would have liked.

We would point out that if they had it their way, there would be a state primary in each of the 50 states, one per week, and conveniently scheduled to go right down the line. Right quick, you can see that this would use up a

The presidential hopefuls have been campaigning and debating on national television ever since they announced for office. It isn't as though the voters in Texas had only known about them in the two weeks since the New Hampshire primary.

Believe it or not, fellows, Texans keep up with what's going on in the outside world, particularly in national politics.

I'm sure a lot of Republican voters even heard George Bush tell the folks in New Hampshire that he would oppose an oil import fee, to keep oil prices as low as possible.

forgave or forgot this when it came time to vote on Tuesday.

Texas voters have seen and read about Jessie Jackson for the last followed televangelist foot-in-mouth Robertson's performances from the earlier campaigns. (Although in the case of Parmer County voters, they again forgave--or forgot, as Robertson received 36.1 per cent of the county vote, winning one voting box and running Bush a close second.)

Maybe "Super Tuesday" didn't accomplish what the Democrats had hoped, but this was mainly because they failed to come up with the candidate in advance that captured the imagination of the voters--particularly the conservative ones--so he could

have received a rousing early sendoff.
