# DALLAS COURTS

Governor Neff's Signature Affixed to Measures Giving Dallas County Two Extra District Courts.

GAS TAX BILL IN CONFERENCE

Senate And House About to Get Together On Bill Placing One Cent a Gallon Tax On Gasoline.

AUSTIN, Mar. 8 .- Governor Neff last night filed the Senate Bill creating the permanent 95th District Court of Dallas County and also the special district court of Dallas County to operate until July 1, 1924.

The bill becomes effective after final adjournment of the regular session of the legislature.

#### Tax Bill Killed.

For the second time this session, the Sonate today killed the Patman House intangible assets tax bill, postponing it indefinitely upon motion of Senator Davis by a vote of 14 to 12.

The Wift Anti-Technicality bill failed of final passage in the House today by a vote of 59 to 70.

#### To Tax Gas.

The House today concurred in the senate amendment to the Cowen gasoline tax bill and the measure goes to the governor.

TREES SHOULD BE WATERED The bill levies a tax of one cent per gallon on gasoline. The House refused to concur in the Senate amendment to reduce the tax on sulphur from three to one per cent and adding asphalt. The bill now goes to a conference on adjustments.




